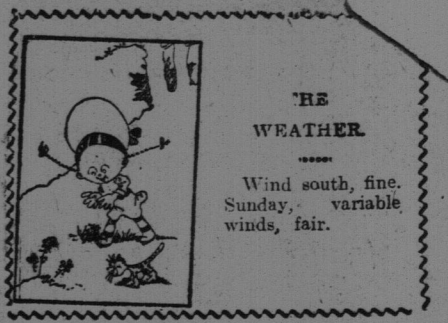

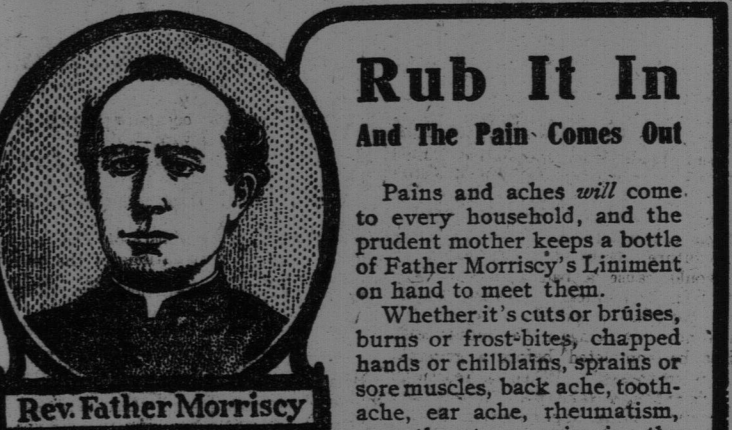

**MR. LEMIEUX SAYS EIGHT HOUR DAY NOT FEASIBLE**

Ottawa, May 7.—The common today had a discussion of the length of hours for men employed on government works. Mr. Verneville, the only labor representative in the house, brought the matter up on motion to take supply. He asked the house to declare that no man could be employed for more than eight hours a day on any public work in Canada. Mr. Verneville reviewed the history of labor to prove that there had been a steady reduction in the hours of employment without a reduction in the productive capacity. More leisure was thus given to the workmen without injury to the employer. Twenty of the American states had established the eight hour day. The strain on the worker was reduced and the liability to accidents diminished by the shorter day.

Mr. Lemieux said he would not have voted for it, as it was drafted, but the proposal was worthy of the most careful consideration. The application of the eight-hour day principle had been urged by a resolution of the trades and labor congress for private as well as for government work. 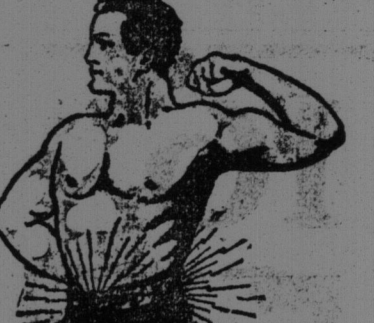
