

Before passing judgment, however, it is well to remember that the most vague and meagre information is available as to the rights of ownership in this vast Northern territory. The peninsula is divided politically between the Governments of Newfoundland and Canada and the Province of Quebec. The people of Labrador themselves do not know where Newfoundland ends and Canada begins, nor does anyone else seem to have exact information on that point. Even official handbooks, pretending to lay down the limits of Newfoundland in Labrador, end lamely at 52 degrees north, with the admission, "remainder of boundary undetermined." Other authorities affirm that Newfoundland's share of Labrador is only tles affirm that Newfoundland's share of Labrador is only a strip of the Atlantic coast line running from the Straits of Belle Isle to Cape Chidley and ranging in width from ten to twenty miles. 




