



HE SESSION have pleasure in presenting to the Congregation their report for the year 1895, on account of the many blessings received and the progress which has been made. We desire at the outset to attribute unto God, who is the giver of every good and perfect gift, the praise for all blessings received and all work

accomplished by the Congregation.

Early in the year the Congregation were asked to elect a number of Elders to fill the places of those who had retired. To this invitation there was a hearty response manifested in the large number of members voting for the addition to the Session. Many of the Elders have felt that in their districts they have more families than they can well care for and that the present number of Elders is insufficient. In consequence the Session have requested the Congregation to add to their number by electing seven additional Elders.

During the year a number of certificates were given to members, who, with others from neighboring Churches, were organized into a Congregation, worshipping at present on Cowan Avenue. As the new Congregation is in the immediate neighborhood, and as its permanent location has not been determined, we deem it proper to state the conditions on which it was organized. In doing so we quote from the Minutes of Toronto Presbytery. It was agreed by the Presbytery: "I. That Dr. Parsons, J. A. Turnbull and C. Blackett Robinson be a Committee to meet with the petitioners in Cowan Avenue Church, at such time as they may deem convenient, and to organize said petitioners into a Congregation of the Presbyterian Church. II That liberty be granted to the petitioners meanwhile to worship in Cowan Avenue Church for a period not exceeding two years. III. That while the permanent location of the new organization must be other than in Cowan Ave. Methodist Church, the question as to where such permanent location shall be, beleft in abeyance for a period not exceeding one and a half years."

We are glad to state that notwithstanding the organization of a new Congregation the membership has considerably The attendance at the Sabbath services has also been greater than ever, and there has been, we believe, an increased spirituality in the Congregation. Of this we have evidence in the large increase in the number joining the Church by profession of faith.

Although we had stirring addresses from a number of Missior aries, among whom was Rev. Dr. MacKay, of Formosa, there was a decrease during the year in the amount contributed to Missions. This was probably due to the feeling that with another Church in the district there should be a substantial reduction of the Church debt. While we are glad to learn from the Managers that the debt has been greatly decreased, we hope the Congregation will remember

in the future the cause of Missions.

We have been delighted during the year with the progress of the Sabbath School. The number in attendance has been large and the contributions very liberal. To our gratification there was during the whole year a very marked improvement in the order and discipline of the School, thus enabling the teachers the better to perform their work. We hope that soon the Congregation will be able to provide better Sabbath School accommodation.

We are pleased to hear of the good work of the other organizations of the Church, which will be made manifest in

their reports.

We desire to urge upon the young the benefits to be derived from the Christian Endeavor Society and the opportunity it affords of bringing others into the Church.

We have lost by death some of the old and some of the young members. While we mourn for them and regret their loss we bow before the will of Almighty God. "The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

It has again become the pleasant duty of your Board of Managers to congratulate the Congregation upon their continued prosperity under the manifold blessings of the Almighty, and the faithful gurdance of our beloved Pastor, whose wise administrations, zeal, and presentations of the Word of God, are so greatly appreciated and receive. I with such delight, that, although another congregation has been formed from the overflow of this Church, the members again attending Divine worship here are now in greater excess than ever before, the seating capacity of the Church being taxed to its utmost extent, and even more, as we have to resort to putting chairs in the aisles and uncomfortable crowding to make room for those desiring to worship with us.

The financial-affairs of the Congregation showing receipts of \$9,321.78 from all sources have been very satisfactory, notwithstanding the continued depression in the business of the country and the changes that have taken place within the year in the Congregation, which would lead us to expect a temporary deficit, but on the contrary we have been enabled to pay off \$1,000 of the mortgage indebtedness and the \$550 note assumed by this body for Ruth Street Church, as well as clearing off some minor accounts and the debit balance from last year, and happily leaving us without one cent of floating debt.

There will require to be ten Managers elected this year to replace those retiring, viz., Messrs. J. A. Young, H. E. Jackson, K. Grant, W. C. Hewish, Dr. Sloan, and R. Forbes, also Messrs. James Crichton, who has resigned owing to his having removed to a distance from the Congregation, and J. M. Campbell, who has left the limits, and Major Carlaw and Mr. Sutherland, who have been elected to the Eldership and consequently retire from the Board of Managers.

The Board would respectfully urge upon the Congregation the desirability of making use of the envelopes for their weekly offerings, and in addition to the heads of families contributing in this way as the Lord hath prospered them, that the children be taught to give at each service, no matter how small the amount, thus inculcating a feeling of reverence and help in all the works of a Christian follower. It is a semblance of ingratitude to see the offertory plate PASS BY ANY ONE without their putting into it some thank offering to the God who hath bestowed upon them so many marks of his goodness.

Your Board would also recommend an early discharge of the present \$20,000 mortgage bearing 5½ per cent. interest, and to secure the required amount bearing not more than 4½ per cent., which can be done by paying a bonus of three months' interest on the existing mortgage, which has about

five and a half years yet to run.

A detailed Statement of Receipts and Expenditures is herewith presented for the information of the Congregation. All of which is respectfully submitted.

PEW SECRETARY'S REPORT.

HE sittings made vacant during the year by the withdrawal of those members who have formed the new congregation in Cowan Avenue Church have nearly all been taken up, and there are a number of applicants seeking accommodation. The most of the sittings still available are at the extreme end of the Church, and are therefore not so desirable. At the present time there are 215 families occupying 747 sittings on the ground floor, and 97 families occupying 179 sittings in the gallery.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORTS.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

A year has passed by since I, with much hesitation, undertook the duties of Superintendent of your School, and it now becomes my duty to report to you on behalf of its teachers and officers. In doing so it is pleasing to be able to testify to the loyal, earnest, generous, Christian support they have so freely given me at all times.

The results of our year's work are manifested not only by the members who have been led to give their hearts to Christ and connect themselves with the Church, but by the deep interest that is being taken in Scripture study by both teachers and scholars. We may mention, too, in this connection, that we have had gratifying financial prosperity. You have been accustomed, from year to year, to hear of the increasing needs of the School and of the great necessity which has existed for more and better accommodation. Being strongly impressed with the view that funds must be raised before the better accommodation could be realized, the officers of the School have been diligent in their efforts to increase the Sabbath School Extension Fund. Not only has the School met all its own expenses but it has contributed \$50 to Missions, and we have now in this Fund nearly Encouraged by our success we are led to hope for a large addition to this Fund during the year upon which we now enter, and we earnestly urge all friends of the School to contribute something to this Fund during the current year. Small contributions are better than none, and small or large all contributions will be thankfully received, whether given through the special monthly collections for the Fund or otherwise. All persons connected with the Congregation, whether as members or adherents, should assist in this work, and all are urged to prayerfully consider the great importance of an efficient Sabbath School to the children and to the future of our Church, and having done this we feel assured they will give all needful help. A small monthly contribution from each child and parent would very soon place the School in a position to do vastly better work in assisting in the upbuilding of the Kingdom of Christ.
