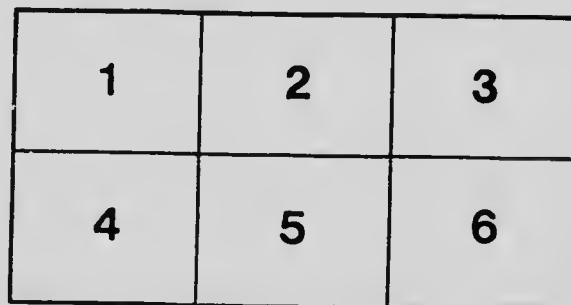
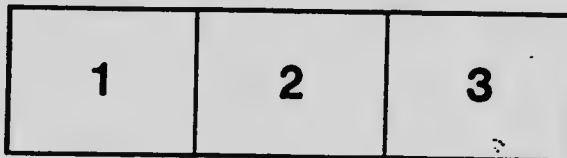

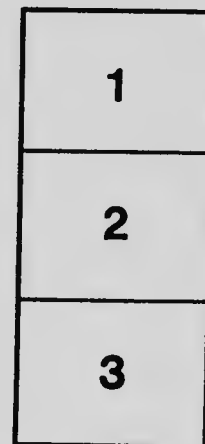

# BRITISH COLUMBIA

## FIELD-CROP AND SEED COMPETITIONS.

### I. 1916 FIELD-CROP COMPETITIONS.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All Farmers' Institutes desiring to conduct competitions must notify the Soil and Crop Instructor, Department of Agriculture, Victoria, B.C., on or before May 1st, 1916, stating the kind or kinds of crops for which competitions are to be provided.

2. Competitions may be organized and conducted with one or two (but not more than two) of the crops and areas mentioned in the prize-list under section II.

3. The fields or plots entered for competition *must be clearly defined and marked with stakes by the competitor in advance of the visit of the judge.* This rule has not been rigidly enforced in the past, but this year competitors will *not* be allowed to choose the location of fields or plots at the time of the judge's visit. In cases where the plot has not been staked out previous to his visit, the judge will be instructed to include all the crop of the kind entered in the competition that is in the field where the plot is said to be located.

Competitors must record *location* of plot and name of *variety* with the Secretary at the time entry is made. Forms will be sent to the Secretary for this purpose. These will be filled out by the Secretary and returned to the Soil and Crop Instructor for the guidance of judges.

Directions for the judge as to the location of plot on the farm must be left at the residence on the farm. In the case of absence or non-residence, instructions must be left with the Secretary. Judges will not search for the owner.

4. There must be at least five *bona-fide* entries for each kind of crop from any one institute, and no competitor may compete for prizes offered by more than one institute. Only one entry in each competition will be allowed from one farm. (To constitute a *bona-fide* entry, the competitor must plant the acreage required for the competition and must remain in the competition until the plots are scored by the judge; i.e., there must be at least five plots in the competition at the time of the judge's visit.)

NOTE.—Should any plot be put out of the competition due to unavoidable accident or uncontrollable agency, the judge will be empowered to award such prizes as he may consider merited by the remaining competitors.

5. There shall be at least \$45 offered in cash prizes for each kind of crop, as follows: First, \$20; second, \$15; third, \$10. Of this amount, the Farmers' Institute conducting the competition will be entitled to a grant of \$25 when a competition is arranged for one kind of crop only, or to a grant of \$50 when competitions with two kinds of crops are organized. The above grants will be paid to the institute by the Provincial Department of Agriculture. The remainder of the prize-money offered shall be made up out of the funds of the Farmers' Institute conducting the competition.

6. An entry fee of not less than 50 cents and not more than \$1, the exact amount to be at the discretion of the institute, shall be paid by each competitor for each kind of crop into the funds of the institute, which money shall be applied to the amount to be contributed by the institute to the prize-money for each crop in competition. A

competitor may not enter more than one exhibit of any one kind of crop, but he may enter one exhibit of each kind when two crop competitions are provided. All fields entered for competition must be within the area defined by the institute holding the competition.

7. All individual entries for each competition must be forwarded by the Secretary of the institute to the Soil and Crop Instructor, Victoria, B.C., *not later than June 1st, 1916.*

8. Institute Secretaries are requested to state at the time of submitting individual entries the distance it will be necessary for the judge to travel in inspecting all the crops in the competition, the nature of conveyance available, and the approximate time required to visit all plots. This information will enable us to supply judges at the season most satisfactory to competitors.

NOTE.—The acreage in some classes is smaller than would seem, at first sight, to be advisable. But when one considers that the Field-crop Competitions are held with the sole object in view of encouraging the farmer to improve upon his system of farming, and to produce under the local conditions the best that can possibly be produced, either in fodder or in seed, then the above acreages will be readily recognized as sufficiently large to demonstrate the value of soil-fertility, soil-cultivation, and seed-selection.

## III. PROVINCIAL COMPETITIONS.

### SEED-PRODUCTION COMPETITIONS.

Any member of a Farmers' Institute may compete without action by the institute to which he belongs, but all prospective competitors must apply for membership in the Canadian Seed-growers' Association, and must produce the crop according to the rules and regulations laid down by the Canadian Seed-growers' Association. Let it be understood in this connection, however, that we will admit to this competition any applicant who can show that he is using registered seed and adhering to the rules of the association with a view to obtaining full membership in the Canadian Seed-growers' Association in 1917.

A competitor may enter one or two (but not more than two) classes in Seed-production Competition. Application for entry must be made to the Soil and Crop Instructor on or before June 1st, 1916. The judging will be done at the discretion of the Soil and Crop Instructor. There must be at least three entries in any one class to warrant the awarding of the first prize, and at least five entries to warrant the awarding of all three prizes.

**IV. COST OF PRODUCTION SURVEY.**

One of the greatest problems before any farming community is that of determining the most profitable crops for the farmers of that district. The initial step in the solution of this problem is the determination of the exact cost of producing the various crops which are grown in that district.

With a view to determining the exact cost of producing the various crops in different parts of the Province, the Department of Agriculture has decided to repeat the offer made last year; i.e., that a bonus of \$5 will be paid to all prize-winners in the foregoing competitions who shall submit a satisfactory record of the cost of producing the crop entered in the competition before December 1st, 1916.

### V. SEED FAIRS.

Provincial Seed Fairs will be held at New Westminster and Armstrong during December, 1916, on dates to be announced later.

All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor in 1916. The Department of Agriculture reserves the right to take samples of all seed exhibited.

The Department of Agriculture will pay all transportation charges on seed shipped to the Seed Fair.

Exhibits will be returned to exhibitors upon request at their own expense.

#### LOCAL SEED FAIRS.

1. Provision has been made by the Provincial Department of Agriculture, assisted by the Dominion Seed Branch, for the holding of eight (but not more than eight) Local Seed Fairs during the season of 1916-17.

2. Farmers' Institutes desiring to hold a Seed Fair must notify the Soil and Crop Instructor, Live Stock Branch, Department of Agriculture, Victoria, not later than September 1st, 1916. Farmers' Institutes making application must guarantee at least twenty entries, but the Department reserves the right to approve or reject any application. Fairs may be held during the months of December, January, and February only.

3. Each Farmers' Institute holding a Seed Fair will be entitled to a grant of \$50 from the Department of Agriculture. The Department will also supply judges, but all other expenses, including advertising, rental, and heating of hall, etc., must be borne by the institute holding the fair.

4. The two following classes must be included in each prize-list:—

(a.) A first, second, and third prize of at least \$5, \$3, and \$2, respectively, must be offered for exhibits from the plots entered in the Provincial Boys' and Girls' Competitions. This prize is open for competition only by boys and girls resident within the boundary of the institute holding the fair.

(b.) A first, second, and third prize of at least \$5, \$3, and \$2, respectively, for the best exhibit from a plot of any one kind of crop entered in the Provincial Field-crop Competition. Open only to members of the institute holding the Seed Fair.

5. The prize-list must be submitted to the Soil and Crop Division for approval before being advertised.

## VI. RESULTS OF 1915 FIELD-CROP COMPETITIONS.

Field-crop Competitions were first organized to induce farmers to adopt more approved methods of crop production. Prize-money was offered as the inducement and was paid to those who had studied the best methods of crop production and had applied them most successfully. The prize-winner in any competition is not always the best farmer in the district. Occasionally, climatic conditions, seed used, or unavoidable accident may militate against the success of a good farmer. Accordingly no competitor should be discouraged if he does not win his first competition. The best farmers eventually overcome the worst handicaps and win the majority of the competitions in which they are entered.

In many districts we find a healthy rivalry. This is commendable so long as all bitterness is left out. The object of the Field Competitions is not to create rivalry and dissension among the farmers, but, as stated above, to induce them to attempt better and greater production. We feel sure, and indeed it has been proven in the past few years, that once a farmer has commenced to study the every-day problems relative to crop production and has enjoyed the success which inevitably attends such investigation, he will not again be satisfied to settle back into the old antiquated farm practices, but will continue to study and adopt modern methods in everything pertaining to agriculture.

Th. Field-crop Competitions have served and are serving the purpose for which they were intended. We have an annual increase in the number of competitions held and in the number of institute members taking part. Below is a table showing the increasing interest in the Field-crop Competitions:—

A few recommendations to prospective contestants in Field-crop Competitions:—

1. Don't leave the preparation of that seed-bed until too late.
2. Don't use mixed, dirty, or diseased seed.
3. Don't allow the weeds to smother that young crop.
4. Don't think that you can win a prize if the weeds are more conspicuous than the exhibition crop.
5. Don't leave the staking of that plot till the last day—the judge may arrive earlier than you expect.
6. Don't forget that the judge will be prepared to answer questions *re* crop production.
7. Don't be discouraged if you don't win a prize this year; improve your methods and try again.
