

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

—OF THE—

Dominion of Canada Rifle Association,

For 1870.

In presenting the Third Annual Report of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, the Council beg to submit the following observations:

1st. That the number of Affiliated Associations for the year have decreased from thirty-two in 1869 to twelve in 1870.

2nd. In 1870, by means of the liberality of the Government, acting through the Minister of Militia and Defence, the large sum of \$10,000 was divided amongst the Dominion and Provincial Associations, viz. :

To the Dominion Association.....	\$4,000
The Ontario Provincial.....	1,800
The Quebec “.....	1,700
The Nova Scotia “.....	1,500
The New Brunswick “.....	1,000

in addition to which the sum of \$5,680 was paid in June, through the Militia Department, to Local and Affiliated Associations in the Four Provinces, for the year ending 30th June.

3rd. No official notification has been received of the amount to be distributed this year.

4th. The Third Annual Prize Meeting of the Association, held at Fredericton, N. B., commenced on Wednesday 31st August, and extended to the 6th September. The number of entries for the several competitions are shewn in the Secretary's Report, and it will be observed that a considerable falling off in the number of competitors for the several prizes has taken place; the total number of entries for 1869 being 1231 against 896 this year—one of the causes for this falling off may be in

the fact, that the Meeting at Toronto in 1869 was more accessible to the Active Militia of the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec—another cause may be, that the expense and time required for attending the Meeting at Fredericton, deterred many men of the Western Provinces from going.

5th. The amount distributed in Prizes was \$3,640, in addition to The MACDOUGALL Challenge Cup, which was contested for, for the third time. His Excellency the GOVERNOR GENERAL liberally presented his annual gift of a Silver Cup, and Ten Sovereigns; and Mr. GZOWSKI, the President of the Association, Five Snider Enfield Rifles with 1500 rounds of ammunition and Two Guineas.

6th. The Time Match, which was instituted in 1869, again formed a feature in the Prize List for this year. The scores will be seen on reference to the Appendix. Eighty competitors entered for this Match this year, against 195 in 1869. This Match was a novelty to the New Brunswick competitors, and did not appear to find so much favour as at Toronto in 1869.

7th. The Council feel much gratification in stating that this, the Third Annual Prize Meeting of the Association, was, like its predecessors, unattended with any accident.

8th. The Council beg to refer to the Treasurer's Statement, for a detailed account of the Finances of the Association, which, with the Report of the Auditors and of the Secretary, are appended to this Report.

9th. The Council regret to observe that the local subscriptions in New Brunswick, which are duly shewn in the Treasurer's Report, were extremely small in amount, much less than the Council had been led to believe would be subscribed, and far below the subscriptions at Montreal and Toronto for the preceding Annual Meetings.

10th. Seventeen Ranges were prepared and made available at Fredericton; there were twenty at Toronto. The cost of the Meeting at Fredericton was \$2,155 20; that at Toronto \$2,818 95.

11th. The Scores of the successful competitors, which will

be found in the Appendix, shew the continued proficiency of the Active Militia of Canada as Marksmen.

12th. The Council hope that the next Annual Prize Meeting may be held in Nova Scotia, and they have reason to expect that sufficient inducements will be held out in that Province to ensure the Meeting taking place at Halifax.

13th. The Council refer gratefully on this as on former occasions, to the continued liberal support accorded to the Association, by the Government of the Dominion, through the **HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF MILITIA AND DEFENCE**, and they respectfully request a renewal of that assistance which has so far materially contributed to the marked efficiency in shooting of the Canadian Active Militia.

14th. The Council beg also in similar terms to acknowledge the support received during the past year from His Excellency the **GOVERNOR GENERAL** and the President of the Association.

15th. The Meeting at Fredericton was opened by His Honor the Lieut.-Governor of New Brunswick, who, together with several ladies and gentlemen, repeatedly honoured the Meeting with their presence.

16th. The Council beg to refer to the annexed Special Report of the President and Treasurer upon the expenses incurred in carrying out the Meeting at Fredericton.

17th. The Secretary's Report, together with a List of the Matches, and the Scores of the successful competitors, is also appended.

18th. The Council tender their thanks to Lt.-Col. **MACPHERSON**, for the performance of his duties as Treasurer, etc., and to the Secretary, Lieut.-Colonel **STUART**, for his services as Secretary.

Secretary's Report
OF THE
PRIZE MEETING
OF THE
DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION,
1870.

It having been agreed that the Prize Meeting for 1870 should take place in the Province of New Brunswick, a Local Committee was called upon to inspect and report upon the most desirable locality for the Meeting to take place at, when it was decided that a suitable site for the erection of butts could be obtained near Fredericton.

The Local Committee undertook the task of erecting the necessary butts and to make all the required preparations for the Meeting, which it was decided should take place at Fredericton, commencing upon the 31st August, and the Prize List was duly published and circulated throughout the Provinces.

The Government, through the Honourable the MINISTER OF MILITIA AND DEFENCE again authorised for this year a grant in aid of the funds of the Association, viz. \$4,000, and His Excellency the GOVERNOR GENERAL again presented a Silver Cup and Ten Sovereigns for competition.

The MACDOUGALL Challenge Cup, of the value of \$200, was contended for, for the third time, upon the prescribed conditions, and Private H. Miner, of the Charlotte, N.B., Militia Corps was the successful winner for the year.

Five (5) Snider Enfield Rifles, with 1,500 rounds of ammunition, were presented for competition by the President of the Association, C. S. Gzowski, Esq.

Owing to the peculiar nature of the ground, stages had to be erected at many of the firing points, to enable the competitors to obtain a full and uninterrupted aim at the several targets, and a considerable amount of labour and trouble was expended in order to make the several ranges available at the required distances.

It was a subject of much congratulation to find that the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec and Nova Scotia had so many representatives upon the ground, and they were all heartily welcomed by the competitors belonging to the Province of New Brunswick.

A camp was formed upon the ground in convenient proximity to the firing points, and was principally occupied by the competitors from Nova Scotia; those from the other Provinces taking advantage of the hotels, etc., in the Town of Fredericton.

The weather during the first few days was very propitious, but a violent storm of wind and rain interrupted the meeting, and by prolonging it over the time calculated by those coming from a distance, prevented the programme being thoroughly carried out, thus leaving one of the rifles with 500 rounds of ammunition and two guineas, presented by the President, uncontended for.

The marking in the butts was undertaken by a squad of men of the Active Militia of New Brunswick, selected by the Local Committee, who performed their duties satisfactorily.

It is with much pleasure that I have again to report that no accident occurred during the Meeting.

SPECIAL REPORT

OF THE

President and Treasurer.

The undersigned, to whom the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association, at a meeting held on the 1st of March, referred the question of claims for land damages, brought against the Association, said to have been committed during the last Rifle Match held at Fredericton, have to report that they have carefully examined all the information in the possession of the Association, on the subject of their claims, and find them to be of the following description :

1. Claim from Wm. Lewis, damage to land (erecting butts, carrying targets, &c.), damage to oat field	\$160 00
2. Claim from Robert Macklin, damages to land, without giving particulars	80 00
3. Claim from Beverly R. Jenett, damages to land, without giving particulars	30 00
4. Claims from Messrs. Miles, Evans & Co'y, without any explanation	160 00

Total amount claimed. \$430 00

Of this amount, the Local Committee paid the following accounts to the respective claimants, on Claim No. 1, to Mr. Lewis, in cash..... \$80 00

Allowance, wood in butts 9 00

..... \$89 00

Claim No. 2, to R. Macklin..... 80 00

Claim No. 3, to R. Jenett 30 00

Total amount paid on claims..... \$199 00

Leaving an unpaid amount of..... \$231 00

The undersigned beg to remark that none of these claims have been submitted for examination or approval of the Council; that some of them are made without stating in detail their nature or extent, to enable the Council to judge of their validity. The claim of Messrs. Miles, Evans & Co'y do not even state the character of damage done.

The undersigned have to state also, that the Local Committee had no authority conferred upon them to settle any of these claims, and that the payment of \$199 00 by the Local Committee, on account of these claims, was made on their own responsibility. The undersigned would further state, that the payment of such claims, without previous examination as to their character, will establish a bad precedent, as no claims of a similar nature have been made at places where Annual Matches have been held.

That the contribution towards defraying local expenses at Fredericton fell very much short of the amount the Council had a reason to expect to be subscribed for that purpose, being only \$180 00, and places it out of the power of the Council to pay these claims. The undersigned would however recommend to the Council that the amount already paid by the Local Committee be considered as a payment in full of all claims for land damages. This recommendation is made under a belief that no serious damage was suffered by any of the claimants, and that the amount already paid is quite sufficient for any injury that may have been sustained.

The undersigned desire to add that the account rendered for transportation of camp equipment and targets between St. John and Fredericton appears to be excessive, amounting to \$150 40 and recommend that a deduction of 15 per cent. be made from the account; also that the amount for carting the same articles from and to the Railway Station, a distance estimated of say $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, at the rate of \$2 per load, is also excessive, and that it be reduced to \$1 50 per load; also that the charges for men on fatigue duty should be reduced from \$2 50 and \$2 00 per diem to \$1 50 per diem.

The undersigned beg to conclude this memorandum with a recommendation to the Council, to be by them recommended to the incoming Council, that no final decision be come to after determining on the period for holding the next match as to the particulars of prizes and matches to be advertised, till it is ascertained beyond all doubt that a sufficient amount will be raised by the Local Committee to defray all local expenses connected with the match, and that the arrangements be on a sufficient scale, especially in the number of ranges and their position, to ensure the completion of the Programme within the week; that if from local difficulties, such as position of the ground or inability of using at the same time, the necessary number of ranges, or from any other cause sufficient accommodation cannot be obtained, that the framing of the programme be in accordance; and suit the locality, in view of completing the shooting within one week.

R U L E S.

- 1.—That this Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
- 2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00 per annum shall become a Member of the Association.
- 3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Frize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association.
- 4.—Any Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$40.00 annually to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships in the proportion of one to every Dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such Memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, to be registered by him one month previous to the Match.
- 5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.
The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
- 6.—There shall be a President.
- 7.—There shall be Vice-Presidents.
- 8.—There shall be a Council of Forty-two Members, who shall be elected in the following proportions:
 - Sixteen, [16] from Ontario.
 - Twelve, [12] " Quebec.
 - Seven, [7] " New Brunswick.
 - Seven, [7] " Nova Scotia.of whom four shall form a quorum, and who shall be elected, primarily by the delegates now assembled at Ottawa, and hereafter at the Annual Meeting,—and the General Meetings of the Council shall be held at the Capital of the Dominion.
- 9.—The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.

- 10.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, selected from among the Members of the Association, and who shall be elected by the Council.
- 11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Militia Staff-Officers in charge of the several Militia Districts of the Dominion, being members thereof, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.
- 12.—There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a paid Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13.—The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting,—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14.—The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such By-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them;—no By-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held alternately in the several Provinces of the Dominion, at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.
- 16.—The Prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such Regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.
- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing the audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the Prize Meeting as may be found practicable.
- 18.—There shall be an Annual Meeting, to be held at such time as shall be selected by the Council.

B Y - L A W S .

Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Ottawa on the Third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of the Parliament of the Dominion.

Meetings of Council. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual Meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary if required by any six of the members of the Council,—notification being sent to each member of Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting,—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.

The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceeding at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.

Finance Committee. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.


Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank. The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual accounts. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditure shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.
