HERMIE HE PELLE AWAY. Herman E. Mudgett is supposed to have committed 11 murders. Born in Gilmanston, N. H., the wretched Holmes was a member of the Knickerbocker Association, and under the teaching of a Christian mother the boy's early training was a more or less one of a bright pupil, a well-behaved boy, whose parents, it was said, had a bright career. He left the academy with his highest honors. Before he was 20 he had married, and the marriage was a failure. He and his wife were together to save money enough to enable him to enter for medical study in the year 1853. He was a diligent student, and Mudgett went to his work ably and honestly, but he was ambitious, and grew restless and impatient to make his fortune as a slow process of severe toil. Despoiling a graveyard with some companions, in 1854 he secured a large sum of money, and put into his hands the idea of sweating honest men, by substituting dead bodies for the living. He organized the insured. How far all that is said about Holmes is true, or his relation to the various murders, is not clear, but there is too much reason to believe that he is at least a part of the facts in all of the reports and that the man is one of the most remarkable characters of our country. He had a strong moral restraint to the winds, and committed his crimes with a coolness and a steady hand which calculated to shock the civilized world.

STILL THE GREAT PORT. A leading New York paper states that in 1894 that city exported more than 64 million bushels of wheat, and that of all the wheat sent out of the country, 35 per cent was raised in New York.
