SMALL FRUITS FOR
THE HOME GARDEN
A aaturally well-drained loam is preferable for all small fruit, if there is sufficient subsoil drainage to prevent an excess of stagnant ground water, will give good results. On the first type of sail planting may be done without ridging, but on the latter type it is better to ridge the soil slighly
with the lowest part midway betweea the rows. The soil should be fertilized with a liberal application of stable maaure, and plowed deeply. This should be done as soon as the ground is dry enough to work in the spring oc that early planting, which is layed.
Strawberries are set in rows four feet apart and twelve inches apart in the rows. Currants and gooseberries are set in rows five are set in rows six feet apart and one and one-half feet auart in the rows.
