



atont, of Herkimer's Co., New York, has proved a successful dairy farmer, and he states that on the products of-sive acres of. Western corn, he maintained fifty cows for seventy days. He plowed up green sod on the first of May and culti-vated it wall, after which he sowed with a grain drill, two and a half bushels per acre, on the lst of June. It grew to a height of from six to eight feet. On tho lst of September he cut it with a strong reaper, and then left it to lie a few days to dry, after which he field it up in sheaves and then shocked it, putting twenty five or thirty sheaves in a shock, then drew it home and fed it out as was found necessary. Some feed the green corn over the fonce, some cart it to the pasture field, and others take it to the harn, cut it with a straw cutter and mix mill-feed with it. The latter mode is considered the most economical. In connection with my factory the past season I had tolerably fair success, and therefore intond enlarging next year, the farmers in this section finding it to their interest to patronize. The patrons were well pleased, and some of them re-

The patrons were well pleased, and some of them re-marked to myself that their cows never paid so well before, and even on one oc casion butter was bought at 25 cents per pound, and the milk sent to the factory by the patron. My greatest dread in starting a factory was that 1 might, per-chance employ an inferior cheese-maker that would be likely to turn out an in-ferior article; but I spared no pains in securing a first-class cheese maker, and also visited several first-class factories to acquire a practical knowledge of it my-self. One of the chief difficulties we had to contend with was in not getting our milk to the factory at a seasonable hour in the morning. To guard again-this difficulty I purpose next season rais-ing the price of milk with a view of in-ducing the patrons to do a little more by way of rendering it more convenient for the milk-wagon, and trust that the concern will prove remunerative both to them and me.




