OSIS.

Osma is the professional or technical name given  
to an advanced stage of pulmonary consumption,  
which has been named by the French, because it  
has been shown to be the result of the  
inflammation of the membrane lining of the  
nose to the cartilage of the bone. Any case of  
this nature is common, but it is most frequently  
seen in those who are naturally scrofulous. The  
disease is characterized by a yellowish or greenish  
yellow color, frequently mixed with blood,  
and almost always attended by an offensive smell.  
In the language of Dr. Wood of Philadelphia, "the  
disease is one of the most obstinate and disagree-  
able which the physician has to encounter, and  
which the patient becomes so revolting as to  
cause him to isolate himself from society, and to  
render him an object of derision to his friends."  
In some instances pieces of bone become separated  
through the roof of the mouth, and are extremely  
difficult to heal.

After Osma has continued some time the sense  
of smell usually becomes impaired, and the head  
aches, some of its most common consequences,  
and results from its extension through the osseous  
structure to the interior of the skull.

Pain in the head and over the frontal sinuses,  
impairment of vision, and other symptoms, fre-  
quently spring from its extension to the brain.

The greatest danger, however, because the most  
common, is that it will extend downward and  
affect the lungs. In two cases of pulmonary con-  
sumption, the patient died of this disease, and  
the lungs were found to be completely destroyed.

The treatment of this disease requires much care  
and perseverance, and it is a successful
