Monday was a quiet day in the American senate on the fishery question. Mr. Frye of Maine led off with a resolution declaring that it is not in the interest of the United States to enter into any negotiations with Great Britain on the subject.

The same dispatch intimated that Senator Canger, republican, of Michigan, would continue the debate on Tuesday. It is all that the Washington despatch has to say about Frye's proceedings in the senate is this, merely: That Senator Frye's resolution regarding the president's recommendation for a fishery commission was placed before the senate, and without delay referred to the committee on foreign relations.

And still the situation may be like a stung cat, better than it looks. The sudden sending of Senator Frye's resolution to the committee, before the west had spoken, suggests a policy on the part of the hostiles that further debate just now would not be to their advantage.

A very brief Washington despatch informs us that on Tuesday the house committee on foreign affairs informally discussed that part of the president's message relating to the fisheries. The general sentiment appeared adverse to a consideration of the fisheries alone, but rather in favor of broadening the subject so as to include a careful enquiry into the existing relations between this country (the United States) and Canada.
