


ECLIPSES OF THE SUN AND MOON, IN 1854.

There will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon this year.

1st. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, on the 12th of May, at 10 o'clock 40 minutes in the forenoon; invisible in New-Brunswick, as the Moon is at that time below the horizon. Visible in Asia and Africa.

2. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, on the 26th of May, visible in all North America; of different magnitude and duration:—

Beginning of the Eclipse,	at 4 o'clock 43 minutes in the afternoon.
Middle,	at 5 o'clock 18 minutes in the afternoon.
End,	at 6 o'clock 59 minutes " "
Duration,	2 hours 16 minutes. " "

There will be about ten digits eclipsed on the north part of the Sun; but as the Moon's magnitude is less than that of the Sun at that time, the Sun's outer ring will be only about one-third part darkened, and nearly two-thirds of the same ring will be left shining, so that the light of the Sun will not be diminished as much as though the Moon's magnitude were larger.

[NOTE.—As a solar Eclipse of the magnitude of this rarely occurs, it may be interesting to give it a particular notice. During this Eclipse the apparent diameter of the Moon will be a little less than that of the Sun, and therefore the Sun cannot in any place be entirely or totally eclipsed. This circumstance also will cause a bright ring of light to be formed around the darkened parts of the Sun. This ring will be only about one-third of a digit wide, and will be visible only in the vicinity where the line of central eclipse passes. The eclipse is central in longitude $73^{\circ} 59'$ west of Greenwich, latitude $44^{\circ} 14'$ north; and in longitude $64^{\circ} 35'$ west, latitude $41^{\circ} 10'$ north. By finding these positions upon a map, and drawing a line from one to the other, the towns and countries through which the central eclipse passes will be readily discovered. The path of the annular eclipse will be about one hundred miles wide, and extend about fifty miles each side of the line we have described.

The annular Eclipse will move about 100 miles per minute, and will pass through the eastern part of Upper Canada, through the counties of St Lawrence, Franklin, Clinton, and Essex, and through the northern part of Jefferson, Lewis, Herkimer, Hamilton, Wayne, and Washington in New York. It will be seen in nearly all of Vermont and New Hampshire; in the north-east corner of Massachusetts, and south-western part of Maine. It will be annular at Kingston, U. C., at Whitehall, Plattsburgh, Portland, and within ten or twelve miles north-east of Boston.

The line of centre and annual eclipse begins at sunrise in the Pacific Ocean near the Caroline Islands, long. $162^{\circ} 51'$ east, lat. $6^{\circ} 43'$ north, and passes north-easterly near the Sandwich Islands, then enters the United States a little north of Astoria in Oregon, and then travelling nearly easterly, passes through Lake Superior; now turning south-easterly, passes south of Bytown in Canada, and thence through the counties we have named, to the Atlantic Ocean in York county, Me., 15 miles north of Portsmouth, N. H. It ends at sunset, in long. $51^{\circ} 53'$ west, lat. $36^{\circ} 18'$ north. The partial eclipse first touches the earth at sunrise in long. $176^{\circ} 35'$ west, lat. $1^{\circ} 22'$ south; and ends at sunset north-east of the Bahama Islands, in long. $73^{\circ} 41'$ west, lat. $28^{\circ} 29'$ north.

The first time this eclipse ever occurred was in 1313, July 2d; since then it has returned 31 times, including its return this year. It occurred in April 1800, in May 1818, and in May 1836. It will return again in June, 1872. Its last return will be in the year 2593, August 17th. The next solar eclipse that will attract much attention in this country, will be in 1858, March 15th.]—*Am. Family Christian Almanac.*

3. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, on the 4th of November, at 4 o'clock 16 minutes in the afternoon, then invisible in this Province, the Moon being at that time below the horizon; the eclipse may be seen, however, for a few minutes after the Moon rises, at 4h. 43in.—Greatest magnitude, 0.64 of a digit.

4. A total Eclipse of the Sun, on 20th of November, at 5 o'clock 14 minutes in the morning, invisible here. Visible in South America and on the South Atlantic Ocean.

EXPLANATION OF CHRONOLOGICAL CYCLES.

Dominical Letter—the Sunday Letter. *Golden Number*—a number which increases annually by 1, till it comes to 19, when it begins again at 1. Its use is to find nearly the day when the Moon changes, &c. *Epact*—the Moon's age, or nearly that, at the beginning of the year. *Solar Cycle*—a period of 28 years, which increases annually by 1 to 28. *Roman Indiction*—a revolution of 15 years, observed by the ancient Romans. *Number of Direction*—this never exceeds 35, and is of use in finding Easter Sunday. *Julian Period*—a cycle of 7980 years, successively following one another.

LIGHT HOUSES IN THE BAY OF FUNDY.

Board of Commissioners for the several Light Houses in the Bay of Fundy.
—Robert W. Crookshank, John Ward, I. Woodward, John Wilson, Esquires; Admiral the Hon. W. F. W. Owen, Lieutenant Charles Hare, R. N., and John James Robinson, Esquire, R. N.

Isaac Woodward, Esquire, Surveyor of those Light Houses in the Bay of Fundy belonging to New-Brunswick, and also of those belonging to Nova-Scotia, which are partly supported by this Province.

Gannet Rock Light.—This Light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. It is a flash light—WHITE—twenty seconds dark, and forty light in each minute. The Light House is painted in stripes, vertical, black and white.

Bearings and Distance by Compass from the Gannet Rock Light House :

This Light bears from the Light House on Brier Island N.N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 22 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Old Proprietor, E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. distance 7 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Black Rock off White Head Island, N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 7 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the South-west Head of Grand Manan, N.N.W. $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Northernmost of the Murr Ledges, N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

To the Southernmost of ditto, called St. Mary's Ledge, W.S.W. 2 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to Machias Seal Island, W. and by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Between the Northernmost and Southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and which extend Westward from the Light House about four miles : from this range, farther Westward, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S.W. end of Grand Manan open.

From Brier Island Light to the Old Proprietor, N. and by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. $18\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The Blonde Rock from the Southernmost point of Cape Sable Seal Islands, S. and by W. $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles distant.

Machias Seal Island Lights.—There are two fixed WHITE lights upon the Machias Seal Islands, elevated about 45 feet above high water, and bearing from each other E.S.E. and W.N.W. distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or American. Both the buildings are painted White. The following are the bearings, by compass, from them, viz :—

To the Southernmost Murr Ledge (St. Mary's) E.S.E. easterly.

“ Gannet Rock Light, E. by S $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 13 miles.

“ Northern Head of Grand Manan, E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.

“ North-East Rock, distant 2 miles, N.E. by N.

“ Little River Head, N. by W.

“ Libbey Island Light House (American,) N. W. by W.

Vessels standing to the Northward, between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be then not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the E. of the Lights.

[It is recommended that the Ships' Compasses should be well compared and adjusted (particularly in new ships) before they leave Partridge Island, as serious errors have frequently occurred from want of attention on this point; and as the variation in the Bay of Fundy is seventeen degrees Westward (or $1\frac{1}{2}$ points,) it will be found by the latest published Admiralty Charts, that the course from Partridge

Island down the Bay, South Channel, between the Old Proprietor and N.W. Ledge, is S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., but the courses to be steered must depend on the direction of the wind on leaving Partridge Island.]

Head Harbour Light.—Next in order, after passing Grand Manan, and the plain White Light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbour Light. This is placed on the North-East extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moosa Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also, at all times, to enter Head Harbour. It is a fixed White Light. The building is painted White, with a red cross on it.

Point Le Preau Lights.—Upon this projecting head-land two lights are placed, one above the other in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both Lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful—both are fixed and White. The Light House is painted red and white, in stripes five feet broad each, horizontally.

Partridge Island Light.—This Light at the entrance of the River and Harbour of Saint John, having been established above fifty years, requires no particular notice, further than that it is a fixed White Light, and the Light House is painted red and white in vertical stripes. The Light was enlarged in November, 1846.

Beacon Light.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. Upon this Tower a Light is established, which is eminently useful to the coasting trade of St. John, and to all other vessels having pilots on board; as it enables them to enter the Harbour at all hours of the night. A fixed White Light. The house is painted white and black in stripes vertically.

Quaco Light.—A revolving White Light is placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The Light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. The Light House is painted white and red in horizontal stripes.

Cape Enrage Light, on the point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N.S. The house is about 120 feet above the tide mark, and is painted white. A plain White Light.

LIGHT HOUSES IN THE BAY OF FUNDY BELONGING TO NOVA-SCOTIA.

Cape Sable Seal Island Light.—The first Light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the South Point of Seal Island. This a plain White Light, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen on approaching the Island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called BLONDE ROCK, lies $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. by W. by compass from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

Yarmouth Light.—On the W. side of Yarmouth Harbour—A plain revolving Light.

Brier Island Light.—The Light House on Brier Island is situated about half a mile N.E. from the N. W. point thereof. A plain White Light.

Peter's Island Light, at the South entrance of Westport, on the east side of the Bay of Fundy, shows Two WHITE LIGHTS, horizontally placed, (to distinguish it from Brier Island Light) at an elevation of 40 feet above high water mark. This Beacon is intended to lead vessels to Westport, or through Grand Passage, and will be seen on the approach from Seaward and St. Mary's Bay, until shut in by S. W. point of Brier Island, bearing from it S 54 deg. W., and Dartmouth Point on Long Island side, S. 25 deg. E., and on the North side, (coming out of the Bay,) between N. $11\frac{1}{2}$ deg. E. and N. 25 deg. E. When in the Passage, or fair

way through, the Light will be seen all round, and can be passed on either side; but the Eastern Passage is the deepest and widest, and is recommended to strangers. The best anchorage is on the Brier Island or Western side of the Harbour.

Digby Gut Light—is placed on the West side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island North-Eastward. The coast is very bold, and not indented; the Light is, therefore, chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. A White Light.

Black Rock Light, on the South Shore of the Bay of Fundy. Fixed Light.

Horton Bluff Light, in the Basin of Mines, 95 feet above sea level, high water—rise and fall, 40 to 45 feet. The Building is square, painted White; stands 60 feet from the Bluff, and shows a White Light, which may be seen in clear weather over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Capo Blomidon,) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the Southward of it.

Apple River Light, on the North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto or Cumberland Bay. Two fixed Lights horizontal.

The Buoy is in 7½ fathoms at low water springs—Bell, nineteen feet above water.

DIRECTIONS FOR ENTERING THE HARBOUR OF SAINT JOHN.

Vessels entering the Harbour two hours before low water, or two hours flood, or at low water, in passing on the East side of Partridge Island, should give the Spar Buoy (moored near the rocks off the East end of the Island,) a small berth on the larboard hand; then haul up N.W. by N. until they pass the Red Iron Buoy on the starboard hand, moored on the South-west end of the Foul ground, half-way between the Beacon and the Island lights; then steer for the Beacon light, and give it a small berth on the larboard hand, and N½ W. will take them into the Harbour.

Vessels should not attempt to pass on the west side of the Island, at low water, with any sea running, but in all cases keep the Island close on board.

NOTE.—It would be advisable for small vessels, in going up, if met by reverse wind or tide, and not more than half way from the Beacon light to Sand Point, to drop below the Beacon light and anchor inside of the range of it and the East end of the Island, to avoid a strong current, and to be out of the way of large vessels and Steamboats, passing up and down the Harbour.—They should be careful, also, *always* to anchor near the shore, and *not* in the middle of the channel, to avoid large ships.

SIGNALS

Made at Partridge Island, on the approach of Vessels to the Harbour of Saint John.

- One Ball, close, for one square-rigged vessel.
- One Ball, half-hoisted, for two square-rigged vessels.
- Two Balls, close, for three square-rigged vessels.
- Two Balls, separate, for four square-rigged vessels.
- A Pendant of any colour, for five square-rigged vessels.
- A Pendant under a Ball, for six square-rigged vessels.
- A Pendant over a Ball half-hoisted, for seven square-rigged vessels.
- A Pendant under two Balls, close, for eight square-rigged vessels.
- A Pendant between two Balls, separate for nine square-rigged vessels.
- A Flag of any colour for ten or more vessels.

[The above are hoisted at the East or West Yard-arm, according to the quarter the vessels first appear in ; and when their rig can be made out, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head :]

- A Union Jack for a Flag Ship, with or without a squadron.
- “ with a Red Pendant over, for a two-decker.
- “ with a Blue Pendant over, for a Frigate.
- “ with a White ditto, for a small armed vessel.
- A Blue Pendant for a Merchant-ship or Barque.
- A Red ditto. for a Merchant Brig or Brigantine.
- A White and Blue ditto, for a foreign square-rigged vessel.
- A White ditto, without a Ball, for a topsail Schooner or a Sloop.
- A Flag, blue and white horizontally, a neutral fleet.
- A Pendant, white and blue, a neutral Man-of-War.
- A Blue Flag, a neutral Merchant-ship.
- A Red, White and Blue Flag, an enemy's fleet.
- A Red, White, and Blue Pendant, an enemy's Man-of-War.
- A Union Jack, over neutral or enemy's signals, the vessel is detained or a prize.
- A White Flag over any signal, the vessel bears a flag of truce.
- A Red Flag, with a white square, for a Steamboat.
- A Ball at the masthead, the vessel is on shore, or in distress ; should immediate aid be necessary, guns to be fired.

In thick weather a gun will be fired at Partridge Island in answer to each gun heard at sea. There is a Fog-bell on the Island which is rung in foggy weather to warn vessels of their approach to the shore.

When the vessel requires a Pilot, her descriptive Pendant will be shown at the Yard-arm instead of a Ball.

### TIME FOR GOING THROUGH THE FALLS,

NEAR THE CITY OF SAINT JOHN.

The Falls are level, or it is still water, at about three and a half hours on the flood and about two and a half on the ebb, so that they are passable four times in twenty-four hours, about ten or fifteen minutes at each time. No other rule can be given, as much depends on the floods in the river St. John, and the time of high water or full sea, which is often hastened by high Southerly winds. For a few days in the Spring of the year, the height of water in the River St. John renders the passage of the Falls extremely difficult.

*Crane's-bill.*—An excellent remedy for diarrhœa, hemorrhage and fluor albus.  
*Cinque-foil*, or five-leaved grass.—Root, excellent in relax, flux, &c. ; leaves good in typhus fever.

*Fumitory.*—Excellent in scabbed head, scurvy, ringworm, and all impurities of the blood.

*Wedge Hyssop.*—May be employed in the absence of senna, or mountain flax, and used like these with ginger, cinnamon or cloves for opening the bowels and purging off foul humors, &c. It is also good in intermittent fever and ague.

*Daisy Roots and Flowers.*—Good in coughs, asthma and dropsy.

*Figwort.*—Good to purify the blood ; the roots are most excellent made into an ointment for the piles.

*Rosemary.*—Most excellent in all nervous diseases, headache and trembling of the limbs ; may be used with advantage in slow or nervous fever in the form of tea.

*Lupine*.—The common garden kind is good for a wash for scabbed head ; may be used to clear the kidneys, and relieve the water after fevers, inflammations, &c. &c.

*May Weed, or Wild Chamomile*.—Good in fevers, inflammations and colds.

*Marjoram* (sweet).—Good to keep out the measles, chicken pox, small pox, &c.

*Marjoram* (wild).—Good to promote perspiration ; used in fevers, inflammations and colds.

*Knot Grass*.—Excellent in the periodic discharge of females, whites, fluxes, and all relaxes of the stomach and bowels of children and adults.

*Mullein Leaves*.—Used with advantage in flux, bleeding at the gums, piles, relax, &c.

*Common Hops*.—A decoction is good to promote sleep, and in all nervous diseases, tremors and restlessness ; they should also be prepared in the form of a pillow, and the patient's head resting on it in the place of a pillow ; they may also be used with good effect for worms in children, and chopped up with equal parts of bread, they make a good poultice for old ulcers, bad legs, &c.

**RATES OF ANCHORAGE.**—For every decked vessel under 50 tons, 3s. 9d. ; vessels from 50 to 100 tons, inclusive, 5s. ; 100 to 150, 6s. 3d. ; 150 to 200, 7s. 6d. ; 200 to 250, 8s. 9d. ; 250 to 300, 10s. And all vessels of greater burthen in like proportion ; and for all decked vessels trading within the Bay of Fundy, there shall be paid, yearly, on the first arrival after the first of April, according to the tonnage and amounts settled by the aforesaid scale.

In cases where pilots shall be detained on board of vessels under and by virtue of the Quarantine or Health Laws of the Province, they shall be entitled to demand from the masters of such vessels 10s. per day, for every day of such detention, in addition to the allowance aforesaid. of all kinds, Iron in pigs and blooms, Copper, Lead in pigs, Grindstones, and Stones of all kinds, Earth, Coals, Lime, Ochres, Gypsum, ground and unground, Rock Salt, Wood, Timber and Lumber of all kinds, Firewood, Ashes, Fish, Fish Oil, viz: Train Oil, Spermaceil Oil, Head Matter, Blubber, Fins and Skins, the produce of fish or creatures living in the Sea.

The above articles may be Imported via the United States, if accompanied with proof of origin.

## USEFUL HINTS IN AGRICULTURE AND DOMESTIC ECONOMY.

**KINDNESS TO ANIMALS.**—We have seen horses, says the Albany Cultivator, which were used for driving a ferry boat, pass unled from the stable to the boat, step on board, walk to the machinery and “back” themselves downwards through a narrow door, on the wheel, ready for work, entirely unattended, whilst most other horses could scarcely be driven on board. An invariable feeding of oats, immediately following the act, sufficiently accounted for this remarkable movement. The animal quickly understood the connection between his position on the wheel and his breakfast.

**BALKY HORSES.**—Balky, or jibbish Horses, are not only a source of great annoyance, but too frequently endanger the property and peril the lives of their owners. An East India gentleman one day took his seat in one of the omnibuses, in London, but at the time of starting all the effects of the driver proved unavailing, owing to a balky horse attached to the vehicle. The poor animal became more and more restive in proportion to the tortures inflicted upon him by the driver, and several other whipmen who assisted on the occasion. The street became blocked up with spectators, and the interception of other carriages. Great danger was to be apprehended. The East India gentleman, above referred to, suggested to the driver and his assistants, that if they would try the East India method of fastening a cord to the horse's fore-foot, and cause a person to pull forward, the animal would start right away. The suggestion was received with contempt. However, after all other effects failed, a long cord was attached to the animal's fore-foot, and the moment the man gave a strong pull the horse started off as if nothing had been the matter. The philosophy of the case seems to be that the animal, thrown off the center of gravity by the propulsion forward, is taken by surprise and obliged to start. Try it.—*Rural New-Yorker*.

**WINTER PLOWING.**—All stiff clays which are not naturally wet, that may be intended for spring crops, should be plowed in October, to allow the frost to break down their texture: but such lands should *not* be plowed when they are in a wet condition, but when they are moderately moist.

**WEEVIL.**—These troublesome pests may be kept out of grain by using salt. Sprinkle a little fine salt on the bottom and around the sides of the bin as you fill up, and over the top when full. Wheat kept in old salt barrels will never be destroyed by the weevils.

**TO PROPAGATE RED CEDAR AND SPRUCE.**—The berries of the red cedar when gathered, must be buried in tight earth. If sown the same season they are gathered, they lie a whole year in the ground before vegetating. The spruce seed grows the first season. Dry the cones until the seed comes out; sow early in the spring in a dry border of light soil, or in boxes; shade in the middle of the day, when the plants are coming through the ground, and until they begin to make a second growth, when they will be hard enough neither to burn or damp off easily. So directs the Horticulturists.

**POTATO SOUP.**—Almost every farmer's house-hold is fond of soup for supper. I will now write a few “homespun” lines on making a cheap and palatable soup from the potato. I take good sound potatoes, peel and cut them in pieces small enough to be eaten with a spoon. After having been well rinsed, I boil them in enough water to leave them in a state of soup, adding salt to my taste. When they are cooked, I take about two table-spoonfuls of flour, with half as much lard, and fry it in a pan, stirring it with a spoon until changed to a brown (not black) color. I then stir it with the potatoes, after which it is ready for the table.—*Domestic Receipt Book*.

**TO KEEP POULTRY FREE FROM LICE.**—Make a wash by boiling cedar boughs, and apply it like whitewash to the poultry house.

**TO PRESERVE EGGS FOR ONE YEAR.**—One pint quick lime, one pint of salt, to three gallons water; no care is needed in putting in the eggs, as they will be right end up, and will settle just below the surface, if proportioned right. This is an old and good receipt.

**WHITEWASH.**—Remember that whitewash is one of the most wholesome articles that can be used about your dwellings. Apply it to the walls of your cellar, to your out-houses, barns, sheds, and indeed to edifices of every kind which are not painted, within and without. Fences are rendered much more durable by it, and, have, when neatly white-washed, a cleanly and tasteful appearance.

**TO PREVENT POLISHED HARDWARE AND CUTLERY FROM TAKING RUST.**—Case knives, watch chains and other small articles made of steel, may be preserved from rust, by being carefully wiped after use, and then wrapped in coarse brown paper, the virtue of which is such, that all hardware goods from Sheffield and other renowned places of manufacture are always wrapped in the same.

**HOW TO CHOOSE NUTMEGS.**—The largest, heaviest and most unctuous of nutmegs are to be chosen, such as are the shape of an olive, and of the most fragrant smell.

**TO MAKE THE HAIR CURL.**—At any time you may make your hair curl easily, by rubbing it with the beaten yolk of an egg, then wash off with clean water, and put on a little pomatum.

**PRESERVING POSTS.**—The Agent of the Copperas Companies, in Vermont, gives it as his experience, that timber which has been saturated with copperas, and exposed to all weather for forty years, is perfectly sound and hard, and has become something of the nature of stone. Timber that has been soaked in copperas water, say one pound copperas to one pail of water, will last more than twice as long as that which has not been thus prepared.

**EASY WASHING.**—Make suds as usual, then add a teaspoonful of Spirits of Turpentine to each bucket of water, stir it up, put in the clothes, and let them soak an hour and a half, and then boil them as usual. Unless very dirty, they will need no rubbing, the turpentine having the effect to loosen the dirt.

**WASHING FLANNEL.**—Enclose new flannel in a bag; put it into a boiler with cold water; heat and boil it. It will never shrink any more after this operation.

**TO TAKE FRESH PAINT OUT OF A COAT.**—Take immediately a piece of cloth and rub the wrong side of it on the paint spot. If no other cloth is at hand, part of the inside of the coat-skirt will do. This simple application will generally remove the paint when quite fresh. Otherwise, rub some ether on the spot with your finger.

*To remove Grease Spots from Merinos, Silks, &c., without Injuring their Color.*—Take the yolk of an egg, entirely free from white, mix it with a little warm water, (but be sure and not scald the egg,) and with a soft brush apply the mixture and rub it on the spot until the grease appears removed or loose. Wash off the egg with moderately warm water, and finally rinse off the warm with cold water. Should not all the grease be removed from having been on a long time—dry and repeat the operation. Coat collars and cuffs may be treated in the same manner.

**TO MEND IRON POTS.**—Mix finely sifted lime with some white of egg till a thin kind of paste is formed; then add iron filings. Apply this to the fracture, and the vessel will be found to be nearly as sound as ever.

**NEVER USE LEY** to clean tin; it will spoil it soon; make it clean with suds, and rub with whiting, and it will look well, and last longer.

**TO DESTROY BEDBUGS.**—A simple and easy method of destroying this loathsome tormentor has been discovered. It consists in spreading the liquid from the ripe cucumber on the bedstead and such other places in which they secrete themselves.

**APPLE-ADE.**—Cut two large apples in slices, and pour a quart of boiling water on them, strain well, and sweeten. To be drunk when cold, or iced.

**CURRENT WATER.**—Take a pound of currants, and squeeze into a quart of water; put in four or five ounces of pounded sugar. Mix well, strain, and ice, or allow to get cold.

**ICING FOR CAKES.**—Take the whites of three new-laid eggs, add to them one pound of sifted white sugar. Beat the eggs well to a stiff froth before adding the sugar. Flour the cake, &c., and then wipe it off; apply the icing by means of a knife, smoothly, then bake in a slow oven.

**TO PRESERVE THE NATURAL COLOUR IN PETALS OF DRIED FLOWERS.**—Nothing more is necessary than to immerse the petals for some minutes in alcohol. The colours will fade at first; but in a short time they will resume their natural tint, and remain permanent.

**TO BOIL MUSH.**—It is very common to make mush by boiling only a few minutes. This is all wrong. It should be boiled one or two hours; and if longer, it will do no harm. It will be necessary to occasionally add some hot water, to keep the mass thin, and prevent burning, and must be often stirred.

**EFFERVESCING LEMONADE.**—Boil two pounds of white sugar with a pint of lemon juice—bottle and cork. Put a table spoonful of the syrup into a tumbler about three parts full of cold water, add twenty grains of carbonate of soda, and drink quickly.

**BARLEY WATER.**—1. Pick clean and wash well a handful of common barley, then simmer gently in three pints of water, with a bit of lemon-peel. Prepared thus, it does not nauseate, like pearl barley water. 2. Take two ounces and a half of pearl barley; wash well, then add half a pint of water, and boil for a little time; throw away the liquor, pour four imperial pints of boiling water on the barley, boil down to two pints, strain, flavour with sugar, and lemon-peel, if wished.

**BARLEY WATER, COMPOUND.**—Boil two pints of barley water and a pint of water together, with two ounces and a half of sliced figs, half an ounce of liquorice root sliced and bruised, and two ounces and a half of raisins. Reduce to two pints, and strain.

**CURDS AND WHEY: Cheap Method.**—Add six grains of citric acid to a wine glassful of milk, and the result will be a pleasant acidulous whey, and a fine curd.

**CURDS AND WHEY: Italian Method.**—Take several of the rough coats that line the gizzards of turkeys and fowls, cleanse from the dirt, rub well with salt, and hang them up to dry; when required for use, break off some of the skin, pour boiling water on, digest for eight or nine hours, and use the same as runnet.

**BROWN SPRUCE BEER.**—Pour four gallons of cold water into a nine-gallon barrel, then add four gallons more, quite boiling, and six pounds of molasses, with about eight or nine table spoonful of the essence of spruce, and on its getting cooler, the same quantity of good ale yeast. Shake the barrel, then leave with bung out for three days; bottle in stone bottles, cork well, wire carefully, pack in sand, and it will be fit to drink in two weeks.

**A VALUABLE TABLE.**—The following table will be found exceedingly valuable to many persons:—A box 24 inches square, and 28 inches deep will contain a barrel, (5 bushels)—box 24 inches by 16 inches square, and 14 inches deep, will contain one barrel—box 16 inches square, and 8 inches deep, will contain one bushel—box 12 inches by 12.2 inches square, and 8 inches deep, will contain half a bushel—box 8 inches by 8.4 inches square, and 8 inches deep, will contain one peck—box 8 inches by 8 inches square, and 4.2 inches deep, will contain one gallon—box 7 inches by 8 inches square, and 2.8 inches deep, will contain half a gallon—box 4 inches by 4 inches square, and 4.2 inches deep, will contain one quart.—*American Paper.*
