

CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

I.

The Society shall be called the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick.

IL

No alteration shall be made in the Constitution of this Society, nor shall any Bye-Law, Rule or Regulation of the Society be repealed, annulled or altered, except at a Meeting of the General Committee, by the vote of at least two-thirds of the members present, nor until it shall have received the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, which sanction must be given in writing, and delivered to the Secretary within six months of the said Meeting.

III.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution, nor any repeal, cancellation, alteration or amendment of any Bye-Law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, shall be proposed or made at any Meeting, unless notice shall have been given in writing at the next previous Anniversary Meeting of such proposed repeal or cancellation, nor unless the terms of such proposed alteration or amendment shall have been stated in writing at such previous Meeting; from which, without the unanimous consent of the members present, no deviation, except of a mere formal nature, shall be permitted.

IV.

No repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment, shall be proposed, except by a member qualified to vote at the Anniversary Meeting, whose name shall be entered on the Minutes by the Secretary, together with the said proposition.

v.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same, a Member of the Society. Provided that no Member shall be qualified to vote at any General Meeting of the Society, unless of the full age of twenty-one years, nor unless he be a Life Member, or shall have subscribed and paid at least five shillings during the year preceding such Meeting.

VI. Officers.

1. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, two or more Viceresidents, a Treasurer, one or more Secretaries, and two Auditors of Accounts.

2. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the ociety, and the Archdeacon the Senior Vice-President; and any Life fember may, at any Anniversary Meeting, be elected a Vice-President of the Society.

8. The Treasurer, Secretary, or Secretaries, and the Auditors, shall be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting; and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the Province, of any such Officer, the vacancy shall be filled up by the Executive Committee, at its next or any subsequent Meeting within the year; and the Lord Bishop shall, if he see fit, call a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee, for the purpose of filling any such vacancy.

VII.

(Executive Committee.)

1. There shall be also an Executive Committee, to be composed of the following Members, viz.:

The Officers of the Society as provided for in the next preceding

Article.

All Clergymen resident in the Diocese, duly licensed by the Lord

Bishop, and Subscribers to the Society.

And twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members, or Annual Subscribers of at least One Pound; to be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting, provided that no annual Subscriber shall be qualified to be elected, unless he shall, during the year preceding each Meeting, have paid his subscription of at least One Pound.

2. Five Members of the Executive Committee, three of whom to be

Laymen, shall form a quorum.

3. The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day next following the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

VIII.

(Objects.)

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz.:

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance, where necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.

8. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Cathecists.

4. The supply of such Books and Tracts as are on the Catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.
7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the at ipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.

8. The creation of a fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy.

9. Aid to the Endowment Fund in particular Parishes.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholars to his Lordship's approbation.

It shall be competent to any Member of the Society to limit his sub-acription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

XI.

(Local Committee.)

2. The Members of the Society in each Parish, or in each Mission, consisting of two or more Parishes, shall, at the discretion of the Missionary of such Mission, constitute a Local Committee; and so also the Members residing in any District of a Parish set off under the authority of the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Rector and Church Corporation of such Parish, (there being in such District a Church duly consecrated, and a resident Clergyman licensed thereto by the Lord Bishop,) may, at the desire of such Clergyman, and with the approval of the Bishop and the Rector of the Parish, form a separate Local Committee; and in that case the District shall, for the purpose of the Society, be considered as a separate Parish.

2. Each Local Committee shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendations to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

3. Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

4. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XII.

1. The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately, on the first Thursday in July in each year.

2. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence, by any two or more of the Vice-Presidents, four weeks notice being first given thereof by advertisement in one or more newspapers, published in Fredericton and Saint John respectively.

XIII.

(The General Committee.)

1. The General Committee of the Society shall be composed of the following Members, viz.: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be the Chairman; but in the absence of the Lord Bishop, the Committee may elect a Chairman, the Secretary or Secretaries who shall also serve in that capacity at the Meeting of the General Committee, the Treasurer and the Auditors, the Rector or Missionary of each Parish, or of a Mission comprising two or more Parishes, and the Clergyman of any separate District of a Parish (provided that in the absence or sickness of the Rector of any Parish, the duly licensed Curate or Assistant Minister shall be considered pro hac vice a Member of the General Committee,) and the Lay Deputies elected by the Local Committees as before provided; all such persons being Subscribers to the Society.

Proof of the election of such Deputies by each Local Committee, to be the Certificate of the Chairman or Secretary thereof.

2. The General Committee shall meet on the two days next previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the Annual appropriation of the funds of the Society; and a Report of the proceedings of such Meeting shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

3. The Order of Business in General Committee shall be as follows:

Firstly. Production of Certificate of Lay Deputies.

Secondly. Secretary's Report to be read, and also a Report of the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year.

Thirdly. Report of the Auditors to be read and laid before the General

Fourthly. Such appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society as a majority of those present may determine.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

RESOLUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

That all future Grants, by this Society, for any purpose, may be re-appropriated as the Society shall think fit, if not claimed within three years from the date of the respective grants. (5th Report, page 8.)

RESOLUTIONS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

That the title to all Churches, towards the erection or completion of which any grant is made from the funds of this Society, be vested either in the Church Corporation of the Parish in which such Church is situated, or in some party or parties in trust to convey the site, as soon as practicable, of such Church to the Church Corporation as soon as the same may be legally constituted. (14th Report, page 24.)

That no grants from this Committee, subject to conditions, be paid until an order is issued from the Executive Committee, who will previously ascertain that the conditions of the grants have been fulfilled. (17th Report, page 21.)

That in future no application for grants shall be considered which are not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, or previously. (18th Report, page 24.)

That each Missionary receiving a salary from this Society, he requested to make an annual return to the Secretary, to be handed in by him at the first meeting of the General Committee, as follows, viz.:

The number of Churches under his charge.

The number of weekly or other stated services held in such Churches or stations.

The number of Communicants.

The average number of attendants.

The amount contributed in each Parish towards the support of such Missionary. (19th Report, page 24.)

That when a Missionary is absent from his Mission on account of ill health, with leave from the Lord Bishop, his Lordship be authorized, in his discretion, to pay to him the whole, or any part of the sum granted for such Mission. (23rd Report, page 33.)

That if any alterations shall be found necessary in the Schedule of Missionary Salaries, granted by this Committee, by reason of the death, absence, or removal of any Missionary named therein, the same shall be made by the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee.

That all grants by this Committee for Missionary salaries, and all sums placed at the disposal of the Lord Bishop, shall be for the service of the fiscal year in which the grants are made, and shall expire with it. (25th Report, page 30.)

That all vouchers for the payment of any sums of money whatever, must bear on the face of them, the authority under which they are paid, and the period for which they are claimed, together with the services performed. That the Treasurer be directed not to pay any monies after the 1st day of May in each year, until authorized to do so by the General Committee at their meeting in July.

That the following be the form of draft for a Missionary's salary, to come into effect on the 1st October, 1861, and that no draft be paid by the Treasurer, unless presented in person, or endorsed by the person to whom it is made payable, the Treasurer to take a receipt from the party to whom the payment is made on the same.

REPORT.

There has nothing occurred of a marked character in relation to the Society, during the year that has passed. It is well known to have been a period of great commercial depression, and of unusual scarcity of money. This could not fail to affect the interests of an institution solely dependant upon free will offerings. For a long term of years, the income of the Society had gone on gradually increasing. The contributions, however, for the past year fell short to a considerable amount. At the meeting of the General Committee in July 1861, it was found absolutely necessary to increase the appropriation for Missionary purposes. The Committee was reluctantly obliged to refuse compliance with many applications for aid to other objects only of secondary importance.

By reference to the accounts of the Treasurer, made up to the 1st May, it will be observed that all grants made by the Committee have been paid at the time required, and that at the close of the fiscal year, no outstanding claims upon the Society remained. It will also be noticed that the cash balance was nearly as large as in the preceding year. Persons thoroughly versed in the past working of the Society, consider that its accounts were not hitherto

exhibited in a more satisfactory condition.

The Society will regret that several Missions on its list are vacant from want of clergymen. These places are, as far as possible, partially supplied, until they can be regularly filled. This will account for the deficiency in some of the returns and reports, an abstract of which is hereby submitted.

Andover, Grand Falls, &c .- Rev. W. H. Street writes that the subscriptions from this Mission are not yet completed. He does not anticipate any

falling off from the amount forwarded during the past year.

Mr. Street renews his application for aid towards the completion of the church at the Grand Falls, hoping with the assistance of the Society and the co-operation of the parishioners to be enabled to complete the building so far that he may use it during the coming winter. He thanks the Society for the grant of books, which he trusts will be made again this year.

BATHURST.—Rev. C. F. Street has enclosed an interesting report of his Mission, which unfortunately reached the Secretary too late for the proceedings of the General Committee, of which the following are extracts:-"The

Lord Bishop made his triennial visit to this place last August; his Lordship for the first time visited the Parishes of Shippegan and Carraquet, holding a confirmation in the former place, when twenty-two persons received the apostolic rite. These Parishes were never before visited by a Bishop of the Church of England, consequently the members of the Church and other inhabitants in the Parish (including) the Islands Shippegan and Miscoe), showed their appreciation of the privilege conferred upon them; some by hospitably entertaining the Bishop, some by coming in their salling boats 25 miles to attend Divine Service at 11 a. m., and others on land, travelling distances equally great. In Carraquet also there was every expression of joy and respect shown to his Lordship by the well known and influential establishment of Messrs. J. Robin & Co... There are only two Churches in the Mission, which require to be replaced by new and more spacious buildings. With the consent of the Bishop, Restigouche has been separated from this Missions—still it is entirely too extensive for one Clergyman, and it requires the Missionary to travel over such cold and exposed places, and to undertake such long journeys, and to encounter such labors, that the strongest constitution will gradually give way, if the duty is properly attended to." The Missionary concludes with the request that the grant towards house rent will be continued, and applies for ald for a Catechist... Contributions to object 1st, "aid to poor and new missions," amount to \$48 or \$52 (the amount is not quite made up).

BLACKVILLE AND NELSON.—Rev. W. Cruden regrets that, though willing to do all in his power for the Society, owing to the depression in the lumber trade, and the present lamentable war in the States, he is afraid to say what amount he is likely to realize. He has received only \$6.00 n the 28th July the Lord Bishop confirmed 20 candidates in the Mission. Some of them travelled 15 miles to be present at that ordinance; during last summer there were about 45 children and young people attending the different Sunday schools; at present the number is not so large, but he is in hopes that it will shortly reach about the same figure.

BUCTOUCHE.—Rev. A. H. Weeks has inclosed a report of the work done in his Mission during the past year, which will appear in the tabular statement. From the Report for Shediac, it will be seen that the sum of \$6 was collected by Mr. Weeks for the Society.

CAMBRIDGE.—Rev. A. Wood reports contributions from his Mission to Object 5 (aid to the building and enlarging of churches, &c.), \$8 79.

CAMPOBELLO.—Rev. J. S. Williams reports that at a meeting of this Committee, regret was expressed that the contributions would probably, owing to the great depression in the fishing trade, be less than those of last year.

The Committee respectfully request the renewal of the grants to this Mission, including £10 to the Church School, which has been in operation since April 1861.

The amount as yet contributed is \$62 62.

CANTERBURY.—Rev. T. Hartin reports contributions to the amount of \$26 25.

CARLETON.—Rev. F. Coster reports that the contributions, not yet completed, will amount to about \$30.

CHATHAM.—Rev. S. Baccu reports that at a meeting of this Local Committee held on Ascension Day, the following resolutions were passed:—

1. That this Committee continue to entertain the same favorable opinion they have ever felt and expressed of the inestimable benefits the Diocesan Church Society (under the Divine blessing) promises to bestow on the Colonial Church—especially as connected with the contemplated Endowment Fund, and their firm conviction that it demands the fervent prayers, the strenuous exertions, and the liberal contributions of every pious Christian who desires the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom.

That this Committee, whilst returning thanks for the liberal grants towards the augmentation of the Chatham Sunday school Library, hope they will not be overlooked when making their respective appropriations for the present year.

Contributions amount to \$117 85.

DOUGLAS.—Rev. T. E. Dowling writes that at the consecration of a new Church in this Parish, on the 26th of March last, the Bishop admitted five children into the Church. The offertory on that occasion amounted to £7 10s.; as debt still rests upon the building, with regard to which, the Parishioners who have taken the most lively interest in the work, trust for aid from

this Society.

"Although," Mr. Dowling writes, "the back settlement roads have been unusually blocked up with snow the last winter, I have been enabled, through walking on snow shoes, and travelling on different roads, to keep every appointment at Tay Creek, where Church work is steadily progressing. The settlers have had three regular Services in the month, and the children are publicly catechised after the Sunday afternoon second lesson. A series of week day lectures on popular subjects are being delivered by different Churchmen, and the Missionary meeting on Whit Sunday, in the evening as well as other Sunday evening gatherings, have been productive of good. More books are sadly wanted for the Church library. There is no debt on the Church, and improvements are from time to time being made. I can safely say that regular Church Services have raised the tone and conferred a lasting benefit on the Settlement."

One of the monthly Services held in a School room, has been discontinued, owing to the residence of the Missionary being for the present at a distance of

over 20 miles.

The Lectures during Lent was well attended, and the Sunday afternoon catechising has supplied the want of religious instruction to the young.

A Bell has lately most kindly been presented by the Bishop to the Stone

Church, and £23 provided towards a stone turret.

The Missionary's salary is now contributed at the offertory, the subscription list system having worked badly. There is reason to believe a larger amount will be raised by the present plan, which was unanimously agreed to by the parishioners at the Easter Monday meeting.

FREDERICTON.—Rev. C. Lee is happy to report the total amount of contributions from the parish (including the collections in the Cathedral, as well as those at the Parish Church), to be, as far as at present known, about \$770, an excess of about \$120 above those of last year. It is proper, however, to remark that this encouraging increase is due to a special donation for the present year from the Lieutenant Governor of £50.

GAGETOWN.—Rev. J. Neales exceedingly regrets having to report "a diminuted subscription from my mission. We must try to do better another year, and if possible, make up our deficiency."

Contributions are \$68.

GLENELO, NEWCASTLE, &c.—Rev. James Hudson reports that at the meeting of the Glenelg Committee, which took place on the 31st of May last, a resolution was unanimously passed expressive of the people's conviction that for the future, aid in some means should be granted by the Diocesan Church Society towards the perpetual Endowment of Parishes or Missions in the Diocese.

The Missionary fears that there will be some diminution of the amount of support usually sent from this district, owing to the peculiar financial circumstances of the times and the many local claims pressing upon the handful of Churchmen in these parts, but he hopes that the diminution, if any, will be

temporary only.

He now forwards a check for £11 6s. 3d. for the Society's general purposes,

and trusts that those who have not as yet been able to give any thing for such excellent objects, will generously respond when another call is made upon them.

GRAND MANAN.—Rev. G. T. Carey incloses a list of contributors to the Society, amounting to £3 10s., and regrets that it is smaller than usual. The war in the United States has greatly injured the fishermen, by closing a great portion of their accustomed markets.

Through an inadvertence on the part of the Secretary, he regrets that the subscription list from this Parish for the year 1861, was omitted in the Report.

GREENWICH AND WICKHAM.—Rev. D. W. Pickett writes as follows:—"Of the real progress of our Church in this Mission, I can say but little, as I have been in charge only a few months. In Greenwich, the number of Church families is small, but there is evidently an increasing interest in our Services. The Parish Church has been opened every Sunday, with but one or two exceptions, and week day services have been held every month at the station in Menzie's Settlement and at Tilley's. At the former the people are much attached to the Church, and the attendance is large and regular. Both these stations are in Petersville, but until the appointment of a Clergyman to that Parish, it seemed desirable that I should keep them open.

The Parsonage is still unpaid for, and the people earnestly hope for some assistance from the Society. The contributions, notwithstanding the unusual scarcity of money, show a small increase—they are for Greenwich, \$46 12.

In the long neglected Parish of Wickham there is much cause for encouragement. The attendance at the Church, which is opened every Sunday is large. Even those who call themselves churchmen, are few in number, and the Diocesan Church Society is comparatively unknown, but, I trust the amount now contributed, \$15 63, will be largely increased in another year.

The monthly services at the London Settlement have of late been reluctantly discontinued, owing to the want of a suitable building; at the Shannon Settlement, however, eight miles from the Wickham Church, the School house is well filled every other Saturday, and much interest is felt by the people in the Services of the Church hitherto entirely unknown among them. The older members of the community were nearly all brought up in the Church of England, but since their removal to this country, more than thirty years ago, they have never had a clergyman to virit them, or been able to attend the services of their Church. In many of them the love of the Church has not grown cold, while others are, I fear, entirely lost to us. They are anxious to build a church, for which the ground has been given, and the timber is on the spot; aid from the Society is solicited.

HAMPTON.—Rev. W. Walker writes, "our collections in aid of the Society amount to about £27, and may yet be increased, which, though less than I hoped, exceed the amount contributed last year. Our Lay Delegates will solicit aid for a church recently erected in this Parish, which stands on land held in fee simple. The exterior walls of which are completed, and which consist of a well designed nave and chancel, with tower and steeple, south porch and vestry."

HARVEY, HOPEWELL, &c.—Rev. H. B. Nichols has inclosed a list of subscribers amounting to \$18 60. "The Parishioners of Hopewell," Mr. Nichols writes, "are endeavouring to raise or secure \$200 of the amount I advanced towards their Church."

"I resigned the charge of the Albert County Mission, six months ago, into the hands of the Bishop, the resignation to take effect on the 10th of July. I have offered myself to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, as a missionary to the heathen. The impression which I received in early life as to the duty of preaching the gospel of Jesus to those who have never heard it, have increased with my growth, and I find I cannot resist the impulse within me to go forth and fulfil my early resolutions. In doing so, I at the same time feel great regret in leaving my friends in this Diocese, and I hope I shall have the sympathies and the prayers of all the members of the Church."

Black very much regrets that the amount of contributions is much less than it was last year. Several of the subscribers having reduced their contributions, and some having withheld them altogether, in consequence of the scarcity of money; they are in all \$40 87.

Kingston.—Rev. W. E. Scovil reports contributions to the amount of \$120 for the general purposes of the Society.

LANCASTER.—Rev. W. S. Covert has forwarded the returns from this Mission, and reports contributions to the amount of \$113 22.

MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.—Rev. H. Pollard has kindly forwarded a very interesting report of the work in his extensive Mission, of which the following

""Services are regularly held in the three churches: in Maugerville every Sunday; in St. John's, Oromecto, three Sundays in the month, and in St. Paul's, Lower Burton, during the winter once, and during the summer twice every month. In the spring and autumn I have been prevented crossing the river several times, and on Easter Sunday especially I was sorry to be obliged to remain at home, it being impossible to cross. Our congregations, especially in Maugerville, are small at these times from the state of the roads, which are often almost impassable for weeks, at the opening or closing of the river, or during the continuance of the freshet.

"At present I have but one Settlement at which I hold Service every month, but I am convinced that several other stations might be profitably occupied if the obstacles in my way of attending could be set aside. I refer to the diffi-

culty of taking my horse and waggon across the river on each occasion, which is both costly and troublesome. I also hold Service once a month at a Temperance Hall in Maugerville, which has been very well attended.

"I am the only Church clergyman in the County of Sunbury, and I fear that the greater part of the inhabitants are ignorant of the faith in which their fathers were instructed. While my attention is necessarily confined to the three churches, and the people frequenting them, it seems scarcely practicable to enlarge very much the sphere of operations, especially as the river separates me from the most thickly populated part of my mission, which extends backward some distance from the opposite branch of the St. John.

"I am happy to say, that on taking charge of the Mission, some 18 months ago, I found the sittings in all the Churches entirely free; while the offertory is collected at every service. Two of the Churches are nearly new, but the third, at Oromocto, is sadly out of repair, but I trust that ere long, we shall be enabled by God's blessing, to erect a building more worthy of His holy

"The number of baptisms; during the past year has been few and so with the burials. During the year ending April 1st, I travelled 2,147 miles. Sun-day schools are held at the Oromocto Church and at Maugerville, the former pretty well attended, but the latter, from various causes, scarcely repaid the additional exertion required from the Clergyman

"The collections which are not completed, will, I think, rather exceed those of last year."

Mencron.—Rev. W. N. Boyer, reports contributions to the amount of £7

5s., which he considers a large sum, especially for this year.

"The Church," Mr. Boyer is happy to state, "maintains her ground, the congregations average a very good attendance, our communicants are very regular and devout at the Holy Communica, which is administered on all the Festivals and on the first Sunday in each month."

NORTON.—Rev. E. A. Warneford reports \$87 38 as the contributions from this parish.

NEW MARYLAND.—Rev. Charles S. Medley writes as follows :-- "I am sorry to say that owing to ill health, and an increase of duty in Fredericton during the Bishop's absence, I have not been able to work as diligently among my

people in this Mission as I could have wished. I am thankful, however, to say that with the kind assistance of the Rev. C. G. Coster and Mr. Edward Medley (a licensed lay Reader), the Services have been kept up since November last, with eight-omissions, ave of which were caused by the impassable state of the roads.

"There seems an increased readiness among the people in this Mission to

support the Diocean Church Society, which I trust may be taken as a sign of their appreciation of the grant which has been continued by the Society.

"The Church at the Rusigornia, though in its infancy, is decidedly taking root; and would grow very rapidly, I think, if Sunday Services could be established there. As it is, some of the Settlers gladly leave their farms and drive 7 or 8 miles to attend Divine Service at a private house, and seem thoroughly to enjoy the privilege. I have lately introduced some of the books or the Society at this Station, and they are highly prized, and I hope they soon will be added to by the liberality of the Society."

Contributions amount to \$89 28.

PRINCE-WILLIAM AND DUMPRIES.—The Society has sustained a great loss in the removal of the Rev. P. W. Loosemore from this Diocese to that of Ontario, C. W. On his departure, Mr. Loosemore expressed a hope that the contributions to the Society would be forwarded by the Church Wardens, unless the Mission were immediately filled.

PORTLAND.—Rev. W. Harrison reports contributions to the amount of \$122 81) for the general purposes of the Society.

QUEENSAURY.—Rev. H. W. Tippet writes that there is nothing special to report from the Mission. "I have been able," he says, "to take the regular duty without much hindrance, except for a few services during the winter, owing to the unusual amount of snow drifts; throughout the whole of last year, I was able to increase the Sunday Services by the addition of one more per month at one of my stations; this gave me three services on that Sunday with a journey of nearly 20 miles, but my health has not been equal to this addition since January.

"I had special services during Lent, as in former years, and I am happy to

say that the attendance was more encouraging than formerly.

"The claims of the Diocesan Church Society are, I think, pretty generally felt, and I believe that the subscriptions would be much larger if the means of my people admitted of it; I find no reluctance to subscribe, but a generally expressed regret that the amounts are so small; the unproductive state of the lumber market is very keenly felt here, and has been the chief cause, I am sure, of our parochial contributions not reaching to a higher amount.

RIGHHUUTO.—Rev. N. A. Coster writes that he has at present been obliged to relinquish the task of collecting for the Society, because there is no money in the place. "The people assure me," Mr. Coster writes, "of their good will to the object, and all that I have seen promise to pay their contributions in July.

"I think I can expect about the same amount as usual."

SACKVILLE AND DORCHESTER.—Rev. G. G. Roberts writes that he expects to send to the Treasurer in a few days, at least as much as last year, and he hopes a little more. He has already collected \$100, and expects about \$40 more. Though no longer required to furnish a report of his ministrations, he is happy to inform the Society that the state of his parish in general is satisfactory, the congregations large and attentive, the number of communicants slowly increasing, and Church feeling and principle on the advance. The number of baptisms during the year was 30, six of which were adults. There were 86 candidates for confirmation at the Bishop's last visit.

St. Andrews.—George D. Street, Esquire, Secretary to this Local Committee, reports that the contributions amount to \$158 45. Rev. Ranald E. Smith, who receives an allowance from the Society as

Assistant Minister in this Parish, writes as follows: - "During the past year I have assisted in 130 Sunday Services and 52 in the week; I have preached once each Sunday, and delivered a locture every alternate Friday. Judging from the numbers and devout attention of the congregations, I humbly believe that the blessing of God attends the ministrations of the Church in this Parish. Owing to depression in business and other causes, many during the past year have been obliged to leave the place, still there is no perceptible diminution in the congregations; indeed, at Chamcook of late, the Church has been crowded and scarcely a seat unoccupied. By my assistance the Chamcook people have the benefit of a morning service on Christmas day, and on those Sundays when the Holy Communion is administered there, and a regular afternoon service on every other Sunday in the year, without interfering with the services in the town, and this they seem duly to appreciate."

St. George, Pennsield, &c.-Rev. J. McGivern reports that at a meeting of this Committee a resolution was passed in which it was considered a high privilege to be permitted to co-operate by prayers and aims in the support of a cause, the main object of which is the glory of God and the spiritual and

eternal good of our countrymen.

It is with great joy this Committee learns from the Secretary's last report of the Society's operations in the Diocese, that it has now on its list no less than 23 Missions, deriving aid in whole or in part from its funds, and supplied by the voluntary offerings of the Church Members, thereby, we think, manifestly proving, by the blessing of Almighty God upon its labors, that our people are waking up to a proper sense of their duties and high responsibilities, by supplying to our poor brethren the means of grace in the ordinances of our

holy Church.

Although not one of its Missionaries, I conceive," Mr. McGivern writes, "that the Society will be glad to hear somewhat of our local affairs. At a late meeting of the Vestry it was proposed to enlarge the Church to a considerable extent, and a member of the Vestry, who made the motion, having generously contributed £50, it was resolved to appoint a Committee to carry out the work, which it is found will cost £160. For the first time the Local Committee of St. George apply for a small grant towards the object which the Vestry have undertaken.

"The Committee express thanks for the grant of Books, and request an

appropriation this year to the amount of £5.

"The contributions which are nearly £6 in advance of last year, are as follows:—St. George, £25 7s. 8\frac{1}{2}d.; Pennfield and Popo Logan, £5; Rourke Settlement, £1 18s. 9d., total £32 6s. 5\frac{1}{2}d. or \$129 29."

St. Jakes—St. John.—Rev. W. Armstrong writes to correct a mistake in the Report of last year. The contributions, which, it was hoped, would amount to the sum of \$400, were to include the collections made in the Church. Through the badness of the times, and owing to several parties who formerly subscribed having left the parish, the amount actually collected did not come up to what was anticipated. The subscriptions for this year are not yet complete. They will, Mr. Armstrong thinks, be about \$245, besides \$29 50 collected in church.

St. MARKS-St. John.-Mr. C. H. Fairweather, Secretary of this Local Committee, reports contributions amounting to \$426 84.

St. David and St. Patrick.—Rev. J. S. Thomson writes as follows:—"I have at present briefly to report to you for the information of the Committee the continued prosperity of my parish, and although I have lost a number of communicants during the past year, our number is still kept up by new additions. We are all, I am sorry to say, of very moderate worldly means, but still anxious to do all we can for the funds of the Diocesan Church Society. This year is a trying one; I will, however, do all I can with my people, and now report \$50 contributions to the general funds of the Society, and will still endeavor to increase that amount. You must be aware that in my extensive Mission, this must be a work of time, and as many have only recently returned from their stream-driving operations, I have not been able to see

"I am truly sorry that I cannot be present at the meeting. I carnestly pray, however, that the proceedings may be harmonlous, and that the income of the Society may be at least equal to the usual standard.

"We must this year trust to the liberality of the rich. May God direct all hearts to the good of the church and the support and advancement of our most useful Society."

Lee Street has inclosed resolutions passed at a meeting of this Local Committee, thanking the Society for the grant of books, which is again solicited, and also the following: ... That though this Committee feel more and more deeply impressed with the necessity of promoting to the utmost of their ability the objects of the Diocesan Church Society; yet they greatly fear that the contributions from this Mission will fall short of those of preceding years, on account of the unprecedented scarcity of money.

That this Committee view with much satisfaction the prospect of an Endowment Fund being raised in this Diocese, which, in the opinion of this Committee, is the only legitimate means which can be adopted towards meeting the difficulty that must naturally arise from the withdrawal of the grants from the

Society for the Propagation of the Gospel.

The Rev. S. D. Lee Street, in inclosing the foregoing resolutions, writes as follows:—"I am sorry to say we fall somewhat short of the contributions for former years; but I would assure the Society that this arises from no failure of interest in its important objects, but solely from the actual want of means. There never was a time when the great scarcity of money was more keenly felt; in fact many have found it difficult to pay even the small amounts they have contributed, and others have been unwillingly compelled to decline altogether. It has really been a work of labour, falling principally upon the Curate and myself, to obtain as much as we have

"However, I would remark that much has been done in this Mission for parochial purposes since the last Anniversary Meeting of the Society. sum of £125 has been expended in repairs on the Glebe House, and I am

happy to say it is now more comfortable than it has ever been.

"Arrangements are now being made for such an extension of St. Luke's Church as will afford about sixty additional free seats, which are much needed. The people of Richmond are also engaged in erecting a parsonage in that Parish, and have subscribed a large amount towards this object. Taking all these things into consideration, it cannot be wondered at that the contributions

to the Diocesan Church Society are less than of late years.

"There is nothing of an interesting nature to offer to the notice of the Society. The work of the Mission is still carried on as heretofore, and the regular routine of duty performed; and I hope and trust that the Church is gradually gaining ground. But though the fruits of our labour are now scarcely perceptible, yet I cannot but hope that, by the blessing of God, the good seed sown may ultimately take root in the hearts of the hearers. It is this hope indeed which sustains the missionary in his labour of love, and encourages him to persevere, even when he may appear to be labouring in vain, and spending his strength for naught, and though he may go down to the grave with no proof that his efforts have not been fruitless; yet he is still cheered by the reflection that it is of God's ordering, that one should sow and another reap. He may, without presumption, rejoice in the thought that though the harvest time may not arrive till long after his death, yet it will be what he has sown that others shall reap, and both he that soweth and he that reapeth, shall at length rejoice together, and meet as fellow-labourers in the harvest kingdom. This it is which connects us all together, not only with those who have gone before us but with those also who shall come after us; it connects us as partners in the blessedness which can only arise from union in that labor of love, in which no laborer goes unrequited—a motive surely for pressing on, that we may not be 'weary in well doing.'"

Contributions amount to \$219 96.

It will be observed that in many of the foregoing reports the amount of the contributions is not stated at all, or only the sum which it is probable may be raised. The usual summary of the whole amount reported for the various objects of the Society, is therefore omitted in this place. It will be found on the last page of the Report-made up when all the returns are complete. Enough may be gathered from the above abstracts to warrant that the sum total

First of all, surely devont and hearty thanks are due to Him who has put it into the hearts of His people to continue their offerings for the furtherance of this blessed work. More might have been expected. There are many Churchmen who, without doubt, could and ought to have given more largely; but taking into account the present unfavorable circumstances, the reports above referred to warrant the hope of a large increase to the funds of the Society in better times.

The absence of the Lord Bishop has necessarily detracted much from the interest in the late proceedings of the Se-By his visit to England, however, at the present time, the Church in this Province may gain great benefit. Through his personal representations, the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel has consented to renew, for a further term of years, the grants made to their later Missionaries, and has made other arrangements with regard to those allowances, by which this Diocesan Church Society will be relieved from much responsibility that was anticipated. A most favorable opportunity will thus be afforded to the Church to make provision for that change which must in a short time take place, when these allowances, made by our brethren in England, are to be wholly withdrawn. Upon His Lordship's return, it is hoped, some steps will be taken with regard to the Endowment Fund, or to make special efforts to gain contributions to this Society for that object.

This Society has, from the first, been greatly favored by the kind support of successive representatives of Her Gracious Majesty, in the Government of this Province. The Hon. Mr. Manners Sutton, it is well remembered, took a warm interest in the work of the Society, and often spoke both in private and publicly, of the importance of its present and future prespects, as deeply affecting the welfare of the Church in this Diocese. The like kindness has been continued on the present occasion. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has not only given a very generous donation to the funds, but has also consented to preside at this Anniversary Meeting, and will, it is hoped, accept the

office of Patron to the Society.*

Reviewing then the year that has passed, looking also at the prospect for the present and for the future, the mem-

bers of the Society may be encouraged by the hope of the continuance of that blessing from above which has hitherto been so manifestly granted. Sustained by this, much labor can be cheerfully performed, and many difficulties easily surmounted. Should it please God, in His mercy to permit us to meet another year, we may trust that all the Missions, now vacant, may be supplied, and that other laborers are being made ready to go forth "into those fields white unto the harvest."

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY FOR THE PAST YEAR.

The Minutes of the Meeting held in Fredericton on the 5th July, 1861, will be found in the 26th Report (pages 38, 39, and 40.)

The next Meeting of this Committee was held at Saint John on the 2d October, when the following accounts were paid:

A Report was received from Mr. W. Carman, a Select Committee, with reference to an account from the Royal Gazette Office, for printing notices, &c., amounting to \$24.84; which account was ordered to be paid.

The Secretary presented a statement from the Treasurer's account, made up to the 1st October inst.; and, on motion, a Committee consisting of the Rev. F. Coster, Mr. H. Bowyer Smith, and Mr. L. H. DeVeber, was appointed to examine and report upon the same at the next meeting of this Committee.

The Treasurer was, on motion, authorized to pay the grant of £20, made in 1860, to the Church at St. Patrick, on condition that the requisite certificates were furnished to the Secretary by the Rev. J. S. Thomson.

The Committee met on the 1st of January, 1862, at Fredericton, when a statement of the Treasurer's account, made up to that date, was received, shewing a balance on hand of £580, of which the sum of £165—a deposit in the Central Bank—was not at present available.

The Committee concurred with the request of the Bishop for the transference of the salary of the Rev. C. S. Medley, late missionary at Douglas, to the Rev. T. E. Dowling, and from the Rev. J. B. Medley, late missionary at New Maryland, to the Rev. C. S. Medley.

At a meeting of the Committee held in St. John on the 5th March, 1862, a statement of the Treasurer's account, made up to the 1st March inst., was presented by the Secretary, and received.

mediate payment of the same.

An account of the Secretary for incidental expenses, postage, &c., from the 1st October to the 1st March, inst., amounting to \$13 18, was ordered to be paid; and also an account of the Sexton of Trinity Church, for attendance at the meetings of this Committee, amounting to \$2.

Rev. F. Coster, from the Committee appointed in October last, to examine the Treasurer's accounts with reference to the payments made on account of contributions reported for the past year, presented the following Report, which he read, and which, on motion, was ordered to be received and entered upon the Minutes; and the thanks of the meeting were offered to the Committee for their attention to the subject:—

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

REPORT.

The Committee, to whom the Executive Committee, at their meeting in October last, referred the statement then submitted by the Treasurer, of the sums received by him for collections and subscriptions, beg leave to report that they attended to the duty assigned them without delay. From the different modes of making remittances adopted by different clergymen, the Committee found it a very difficult matter to ascertain whether the whole sums reported, had been fully paid in or not. Some of the clergy are in the habit when they send in their list of subscribers, of remitting a sum which is exactly equal to the amount of the list; and these cases, of course, presented no difficulty. Others make several remittances during the year, and at the time of the Annual Meeting, report contributions to such an amount. The Committee having nothing before them to guide them, had to write to the Rev. Dr. Jarvis, who has adopted this method, and he immediately gave them such information as satisfied them on the point on which they were in doubt. Others remit the proceeds of collections in Churches as they are made; the consequence is, that the cash payment appears in one year's account, while the report of the collection does not appear till the next year. Where the two sums paid and reported exactly agree, no great difficulty arises; but if they do not agree, there is, of course, room for doubt. Two such cases occurred at this time, which rendered it necessary for the Committee to apply to the parties concerned. Others send in a list of subscribers, with only a portion of the amount subscribed; others, without any payment at all; while some mention a sum as that which they hope to be able to obtain. With such a variety in the method adopted, the Committee found it a matter of great difficulty to ascertain the real state of the case in every instance. They are now able,
