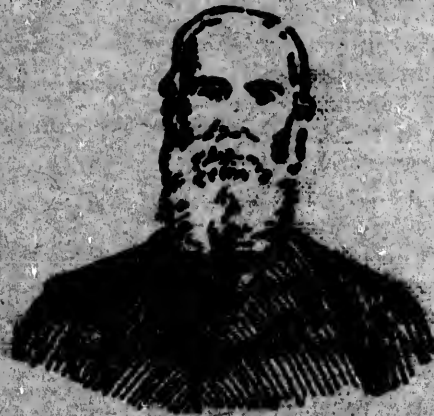

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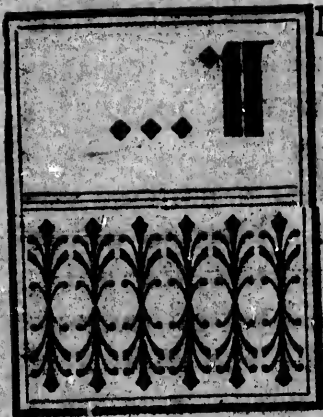


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# Diet for Rheumatic People.



**I**N rheumatic affections the diet should be light and nutritious. Stimulants should be avoided. Milk is the most suitable beverage; if not palatable it may be flavored to suit the taste; it is best, however, to dilute it with lime water or mineral waters. If the patient cannot take milk in any form, soups or broths may be administered; and all food should be given at short and stated intervals. Rice water may be given in large quantities, as there is usually great thirst, which should be satisfied. As the patient becomes convalescent a light vegetable diet may be used; meats must be used very sparingly. Be careful to avoid the use of vinegar, pickles, lemonade and all acid fruits and tart preserves.

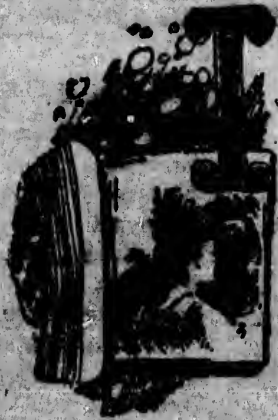

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## Information for Builders.

One thousand shingles laid four inches to the weather will cover one hundred square feet of surface, and five pounds of shingle nails will fasten them on.

One thousand laths will cover seventy yards of surface, and eleven pounds of lath nails will put them on.

Eight bushels of good lime, sixteen bushels of sand and one bushel of hair will make enough good mortar to plaster one hundred square yards.

One-fifth more siding and flooring is needed than the number of square feet of surface to be covered, because of the lap in the matching and siding.

Five courses of brick will lay one foot in height on a chimney; sixteen bricks in a course will make a flue four inches wide and twelve inches long.

Eight bricks to a course will make a flue eight inches wide and sixteen inches long.

A cord of stone, three bushels of lime and a cubic yard of sand will lay one hundred cubic feet of wall.

## THE SEVEN WONDERS OF THE EARTH.

1st.—The Pyramids of Egypt, begun 1500 B.C. and completed 1082 B.C.

6th.—The ivory and gold statue of Jupiter Olympus, made by Phidias 440 B.C.

7th.—The Pharos or out watch-tower built by Ptolemy Philadelphus, King of Egypt, 280 B.C. It was a tower built of white marble, on the top of which fires were kept constantly burning. It stood at Alexandria, and served as a beacon light to sailors entering the bay.
