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FIELDING'S INSURANCE BILL

Was Grappled With Again Yesterday by the Banking and Commerce Committee.

PROFIT-SHARING POLICY-HOLDERS

Should Not Be Disregarded, Says Mr. Foster—A Discussion of Great Interest.

Ottawa, June 15.—Again today the Banking and Commerce Committee grappled with Fielding's bill to amend the Assurance Act without reaching a conclusion.

Members of the committee repeatedly challenged assertions of the representatives of insurance companies, who urged the passage of the bill.

Hon. George E. Foster concurred in the theory that a 3 1/2 per cent. basis was necessary for new business. It was with the people who invested in participating policies, assuming that the existing contract standard would be continued, that Mr. Foster sympathized.

Mr. Foster's suggestion of a compromise appealed to Mr. McMillen. The bill, as now stands, the latter insisted, would put the Government and the insured in a serious position.
