Died While Serving In Imperial Forces

Canadian Associated Press Cable. LONDON, July 10.—Several names in today's list of casualties of the imperial forces have a Canadian interest. Lieut. Hugh Irving Adams, Hampshire, killed, was the only son of George Adams of the India civil service. He served himself in the India army, and came from Canada at the beginning of the war. He leaves a widow at Burford, Ont.

GIVEN UP FOR DEAD.

Galt Soldier Missing One Year Probably Killed in Action. Special to The Toronto World. GALT, July 10.—Reported missing a year Pte. George C. Barker, a Galt soldier, has now been given up for dead. In June, 1915, his mother had a letter returned marked "Killed in action, next of kin notified," but it was not until July 22 when she was notified that her son had been wounded and missing between April 23 and 26, 1915. Since then everything possible has been done to get traces of him, but without success, and his name now appears on the honor roll of dead.

FRENCH TAKE TRENCH IN CHAMPAGNE ATTACK

Also Capture Line of German Positions on Somme Front. PARIS, July 10.—A new attack was launched in the Champagne by the French last night. The war office today announced the capture of trenches on a front of 500 metres. On the Somme front the French took a line of German positions in the neighbourhood of Barleux. In this section 350 Germans were captured yesterday and last night. RAID WAS FRUITLESS. German Attack on English Coast Ends in Failure.

IRISH SETTLEMENT FAIR, SAYS ASQUITH

Free Will and Assent of Excluded Area is Essential Feature. WILL GIVE FAIR TEST Arrangement to Continue for at Least Twelve Months After War.

LONDON, July 10.—(4.37 p.m.)—Premier Asquith, in explaining the Irish agreement in the house of commons today, said that it was proposed that the bill should remain in force during the war, and twelve months thereafter, and if parliament had not made further provision by that time for a government of Ireland, the period could be extended. Representatives of the imperial executive, the prime minister said, would have control of the defence of the Realm Act. Mr. Asquith said the new bill would contain general provisions reserving for the exclusive authority of the imperial parliament and government not only the navy and the army, but all matters arising out of the war.

TRENCHES BROKEN BY TWO DAYS' FIRE

Complicated German Trenches in Loop of River Disorganized. ENEMY PUT TO ROUT Drive Speedily Dislodged From Positions and Village.

PARIS, July 10.—The new French drive south of the Somme River yesterday had been prepared for by artillery bombardments more than two days ago and the complicated system of German defences in the loop to the northward made by the river, had been disorganized. The task of artillery preparation had been carried thru rapidly, and the infantry attack probably would have been made sooner had it not been for the bad weather. Sunday morning the rain at last stopped and the signal for the assault was given. The French troops began to move along a two and a half mile front. The left wing rested on the bridge over the Somme, one mile east of Bormont farm, while the right wing lay a little north of Belleoy.

TO DRAW WESTERNERS

Ottawa Has Failed to Recruit Full Battalions. By a Staff Reporter. OTTAWA, Ont., July 10.—Apparently Ottawa has fallen down in its efforts to raise its most recent regiment, the 207th Battalion. The regiment started recruiting four or five months ago, and to date has about 640 men. It is proposed now to transfer 400 men from one of the western battalions which is over strength. There are several battalions at Camp Hughes which have three or four hundred more men than are required.

CAPTURE OF PERONNE IS HOURLY EXPECTED

French Forces Are Within Mile of Important Strategic Point. SWEPT OVER PLATEAU Victors Cleared Out Enemy and Established Themselves in Trenches. PARIS, July 10.—The French advanced their line south of the Somme, Sunday, a mile and a half, capturing the German third positions along a length of three and one-half miles, and are now within a mile of Peronne. French critics believe that the capture of Peronne now is a question almost of hours.
