—OF THE—
INCORPORATED SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF HURON.

THIRTY-FIFTH SESSION.

(Being the Eighteenth under the Synod Act of Incorporation of 1874.)

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened at London, on Tuesday, June 21st, 1892.

Divine Service was held in St. Paul's Cathedral at 10 o'clock a.m.

The Sermon was preached by the Very Rev. G. M. Innes, M. A., Dean of Huron, from Gal vi., 14.

The Holy Communion was administered to the Clergy and Lay Representatives by the Lord Bishop assisted by the Dean of Huron, and Revs. Canon A. C. Hill, Canon Evans Davis, Canon J. B. Richardson and Canon W. A. Young.

The Synod assembled at 2.30 p.m., in the Chapter House, for business.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The appointed prayers were said by Rev. Canon Davis.

The rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were then called by their respective Secretaries, when 77 Clergymen and 66 Lay Representatives answered to their names.

The ballot papers were, in accordance with the Canon, distributed to the members of the Synod as their names were called.

Election of Honorary Secretaries.

Report of Committee on Certificates and Assessments.

2. That a provision of section 3 of the Constitution, which requires that Lay Representatives "shall be elected annually *during Easter week*," which fell this year on the 17th to 23rd April (inclusive), has not been complied with by the following congregations, which held their meetings on dates stated opposite their names :

THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

His Lordship then delivered his annual address to the Synod,

REVEREND BRETHERN AND BRETHERN OF THE LAITY :—

With a grateful remembrance of God's goodness throughout the past year, and with thankful acknowledgements of His many mercies in the present, we again meet in the interests of the Diocese, and for the advancement of the truth at large.

Ascribing the praise to Him who is the giver of every good gift, I am happy in being able to state that though the past year has been one of widespread commercial depression, yet, through the blessing of God, our receipts have been larger than in any previous year during the whole course of my Episcopate. The totals as presented on the first page of our Synod Accounts are made up of two main items : First, the legitimate income of the Diocese, consisting of moneys which the Synod can handle and dispose of, and secondly, sums raised within our territorial limits by various Bishops and Missionaries from abroad, which have never been received by our Secretary, and over which we have no control, but the record of them has been supplied, and the information is most valuable as shewing the actual amount of money raised within the Diocese during the year. Bearing these facts in mind, I would have you observe that the total receipts since 1884, the first year of my Episcopate, have been as follows :

I may say that at the Synod Service of 1887, which was the year of the Queen's Jubilee, a special offertory was made in the Cathedral to remove the then existing debt on the Diocese. This collection, which included the May offertory, amounted to \$1810.22. As this sum was raised after the closing of the books in 1887, it was of course inserted in the accounts of 1888.

Being an increase over last year of \$3,013.26, and over the

year ending April 30th, 1885, of \$6,973.09, or about 33 per cent.

The total contributions for Diocesan Work in 1891 were \$8752.83, as against \$9261.49, being an increase of \$508.66 over last year. The Ascensiontide Appeal for 1890 was \$903.88, as against \$1445.53 in 1891, being an increase of \$541.65. The Epiphanytide Offertory this year was \$1147.32, as against \$1178.94 last year, being a decrease of \$31.62. The Good Friday Collection for the Jews was this year \$707.39, as against \$603.27 last year. The Woman's Auxiliary exhibits a large increase, being \$2576.39, as against \$1845.53, an advance of \$730.86. The Sunday School Offerings have also increased, last year being only \$174.44, as against \$308.18 this year. The Synod Assessments have also risen, being upwards of \$170.00 in excess of those of last year.

Passing on now to other matters which betoken growth and development, I will call your attention,

Firstly.—To the increase of the Number of Clergymen in Actual Service.

In 1880 the number of Clergymen in actual service was 103; in 1888, 124; in 1892, 139. An examination of the books reveals the fact that since 1883 upwards of 45 Clergymen have either died or left the Diocese. As a general rule the number of deaths and removals in a year amount to about 5 men, so that we require six deacons before we can add one man to the numerical strength of the Diocese.

Secondly—Church Accommodation.

The number of Churches in the Diocese has increased from 204 in 1880 to 246 in 1891. Their quality also is improving; for as in 1888 there were 122 in wood, in 1891 there were only 113; whereas the brick structures had risen from 110 in 1888 to 122 in 1891. The total value of the church edifices has risen from \$656,784.00 in 1880, to \$821,465.00 in 1891. Apparently the debt has increased, for in 1880 it is quoted at \$100,708.00, while in 1891 it is stated to be \$102,998.00. The seating accommodation has risen from 49,101 in 1880 to 55,470 in 1891.

Thirdly—Parsonages.

As parsonages are sometimes a matter of interest to Clergymen, you will be pleased to learn that the number of our parsonages has increased from 62 to 77, and their values from \$130,650 in 1880 to \$174,934 in 1891.

Fourthly—Communicants.

The number of our communicants has risen in the same period

from 8,910 to 13,605. Between, however, the winter of 1883 and the Synod of 1891 I have confirmed over 10,000 candidates, Thus in 8 years this large number was added to the professing church, while in eleven years, viz : from 1880 to 1891, the whole increase in the number of Communicants has only been 4,695. Of course, it is only fair to remember how many we lose by death and removal; but after making due allowance for a natural depletion, I cannot believe that our numbers in the roll of communicants are as satisfactory as the above data would lead us to expect.

Fifthly—Church Population.

In entering upon this troubled subject I cannot do better than shew you the results of the census as to the increase or decrease of the population in the thirteen counties which comprise this Diocese. I find that the following six counties have all lost in population during the last ten years, viz : Middlesex, Norfolk, Oxford, Perth, Huron and Bruce. Of these Huron has lost most heavily, being 9,051 less than she was in 1881. Norfolk has lost 2,772; Perth, 1,835; Bruce, 867; and Oxford 616. The seven other counties, viz : Elgin, Brant, Waterloo, Lambton, Kent, Essex and Grey have all increased their populations. The greatest growth is observable in Essex, which has added 8,583 to her population; Waterloo comes next with 7,733; Lambton with 5,103; Brant, 2,225; Kent, 2,240, and Grey, 1,867. The total decrease in the six counties has been 16,602. The total increase in the seven counties has been 29,212; making a gain throughout the Diocese of 12,610.

The census further reveals the fact, that the total population of the thirteen counties which comprise this Diocese is 735,839 souls. The total number of Church of England members in the above aggregate is 110,919.

Keeping this important number in mind, let us now contrast it with our own Diocesan statistics. In the summary given for year ending, 1891, we find the following under the heading, "Church Population" :—"Total number of souls, 59,419." Thus our report gives the sum of our Church Population as nearly one-half that given by the Government returns. To reconcile so great a discrepancy is a task wholly beyond my powers. I am aware that many who attach themselves to no communion whatever, are in the habit of telling the census officers that they are members of the Church, whereas if a Clergyman went to them they would ignore all connection with us whatever. Still, this method of explanation will not account for so vast a difference as that which at present exists, and therefore, I think that the whole matter should be very patiently

investigated, in order to see which statement is nearer the truth, and thus become properly informed on a matter of such moment to us all. While speaking on this subject and acknowledging that according to our own statistics we have made some progress, yet I cannot but think that a few reflections on the general subject of the growth of our Church in this part of the Province may not be out of place.

If the question be asked: What are the causes which retard the progress of our Church in the area assigned to this Diocese? I would answer that the following facts seem to constitute a sufficient reply:

First.—We have lost in the past, and are still losing in the present heavily by emigration.

This circumstance, though it does not account for all, at least ought to be weighed well in any calculation we may make. The loss which six of our counties have suffered of 16,602 souls in ten years, is an item which cannot be ignored. The statements concerning our loss are conflicting, for while the Government census affirms that in ten years we have lost heavily, our own reports testify that our Clergy are ministering to 4,755 more than in 1880. Thus, though some counties have been seriously depleted, others have manifestly advanced, and therefore in estimating the forces which retard our growth, we can only regard emigration as an uncertain and variable element.

Secondly.—We must regard as another source of serious weakness, the patent fact that the Diocese is not sufficiently manned.

Go where we may we will find that there are five or six men of other Christian bodies to one of ours. Outnumbered in so many places, it is almost impossible to hold our own; the question therefore arises, how is this present state of affairs to last? I do not hesitate as to the answer—not a day, nor even an hour, after the moment when this great Diocese, in the power of Divine Grace, casts off its sloth and supineness and awakes like a giant to run his course. What might not this Diocese effect if we were all to pray as we might pray, work as we might work, and give as we might give, for the advancement of God's glory and the promotion of His cause among us. If instead of having processions of parishes from the rich meads of this western peninsula coming to the Executive Committee and asking for reduced assessments and increased help, we were to have processions of parishes coming to announce their independence and their fixed determination wholly to support their own ministers, we would at once have reached a new era. The Executive Committee would be free to open up new fields of labour; and we could soon increase our ministerial strength. The remedy

I propose therefore is self-sacrifice. If the circumstance of our being outnumbered is deeply deplored, the abundant remedy is at hand. The Church of England has all the means, all the wealth, all the men it needs for duplicating, if not tripling, its ministerial strength in this Diocese. All that is needed is spiritual fire.

Thirdly.—We need—forgive me, dear friends, for what I am about to say, for I speak without reflecting in the least on any of the laborers we have at present in the field—a new class of young unmarried men who, for the love they bear to Christ, and for the glory of His great name, will be willing to go out as Deacons—at least for a few years, without any stipulated salary and depending only on that great God who knoweth our wants and remembereth that we are dust, for their daily sustenance and support.

The era of self sacrifice even to martyrdom has not, I am thankful to say, died out as yet. Martyrs like Patteson and Hannington; quenchless heroes like Livingstone, Mackay, Gordon and Mackenzie are only specimens of a great but unseen host in which the Church of the living God is rich. Thank God, there are amid all the worldliness and venality of our times, still men who through faith can subdue kingdoms, work righteousness and obtain the promises—men who count not their own lives dear unto them that they may finish their course with joy and the ministry entrusted to their care. And surely in such a day as this, when we see that the “perilous times” of which the Apostles wrote, have actually come upon us; when all the serried ranks of infidelity, scepticism, worldliness and superstition are mustering squadron and car to assault the citadel of the truth—surely at such a time as this the Church needs men of singular consecration and of fiery zeal—men specially raised up and fitted for the serious times in which we live. Increased activity on the part of the enemies of the truth should be met by more intense consecration and by more tireless service for Christ on the part of its friends. Greater is he who is for us than all who are against us.

Fourthly and lastly.—More clearly and emphatically ought we all to uplift and glorify the Saviour in both the pulpit and the life.

If at the Reformation the Church of England reaffirmed and vindicated the doctrines of primitive Christianity, it was that she might have liberty and power to preach and to magnify the Saviour; if she separated the Bible from verbal tradition, it was that her people might read it; if she uplifted the Redeemer, it was that they might believe on Him; if she taught that one only fountain had been opened for sin and uncleanness, it was that in it they might wash and be clean. Let us not be afraid for the future of the Church of England. She has witnessed a good confession; she has set forth the living Christ in all the articles and formularies of her faith. In Him she lives, and in Him alone can she perform the ministry of her Lord. I am persuaded, too, she has all the power to demon-

strate herself, even in this country, the Church of the masses. Her scriptural and responsive liturgy; her chaste and ancient forms of prayer; her creeds and articles on which she is built give her a potent claim on all who love and obey the truth. But let us all remember, we can only advance—we can only exist as we are faithful and loyal to our Lord. Let us all, through the abounding grace of God, address ourselves afresh to this work, and in Him the weakest shall be strong, and the Church move grandly to occupy new fields, and to witness with new power to her ascended and returning Lord.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

You will be pleased to hear that Sunday School work is making rapid and most satisfactory progress under the able committee who are now seeking to promote its interest in this Diocese. While the number of schools has advanced from 166 in 1880 to 211 in 1891; the teachers and officers have increased in the same time from 1335 to 2170, and the pupils from 13,055 to 17,906. Great praise is due to the Rev. John Downie, the Chairman, and all other members of this indefatigable committee.

OBITUARY NOTICES.

Since our last meeting in Synod, the Lord has been pleased to call to his rest one of the most prominent men of the church in Canada. I refer to the late Right Rev. James William Williams, D.D., Lord Bishop of Quebec. Born in Overton, Hants, England, in the year 1825, he graduated with honors at Pembroke College, Oxford, and was admitted to Deacon's orders by the Lord Bishop of that Diocese. In 1852 he was ordained Priest by the Bishop of Bath and Wells. Before coming to Canada he filled successively the curacies of High Wycombe in Bucks, and St. Peter's Church, Huish Champflower, in Somerset. Coming to Canada, he was from 1858-63 the rector of the Grammar School, Lennoxville, and from 1862-63 Classical Professor of the College. On the death of the Right Rev. G. T. Mountain, D.D., Dr. Williams was elected to fill the vacancy, and on the 21st day of June, 1863, was consecrated Bishop of Quebec by the Most Rev. the Metropolitan (Dr. Fulford) assisted by the Bishop of Toronto, (Dr. Strachan), the Bishop of Ontario, the Bishop of Vermont, (The Rt. Rev. John Henry Hopkins) and the Bishop of Huron, the first Bishop of this See, the Rt. Rev. Dr. Cronyn. The late honored Bishop throughout his entire episcopate has shown the most untiring zeal and self-sacrificing devotion to the cause of the blessed Master. I wish especially to mention his apostolic labors in connection with the Episcopal supervision of the stormy and inhospitable coast of Labrador. The danger and fatigue incident to the work were very great, but the Bishop faced the one

and endured the other without either hesitation or complaint. A profound scholar, a diligent overseer, a devout servant of the Lord, his call to leave us will not only be mourned by his late Diocese, but by the wide-circle of the Church at large. I trust this Synod will convey to his bereaved widow and family an expression of their sympathy and love, and will couple with it an earnest prayer that the God of all wisdom will now guide the Synod of Quebec to a right judgment in the selection of some suitable man for the high and responsible position of chief pastor of the flock.

We are called also to mourn the loss of one of the oldest and most faithful men in this Diocese, the late Rev. Canon Patterson. Born in Perth, Ontario, in 1826, he there received his early education. On reaching man's estate, he studied theology under the Ven. Archdeacon Bethune at Cobourg, and was subsequently ordained by the Bishop of Toronto, (Dr. Strachan) in the City of Kingston in the year 1849. His first charge was that of curate of Cobourg, from which he removed to Wolfe Island, and in 1851 he came to Stratford at which place with laudable fidelity he remained to the day of his death. Here it was he sowed the good seed of the Kingdom; here it was he laboured; here it was he built up the church; here it was when he had run his course he fell asleep in Jesus. His best monument will be his work, and the tears and grateful remembrances of his late congregation attest his zeal, the faithfulness and devotion with which he laboured among them. Forty-one long years of service in one place cannot easily be forgotten. The memory of the just is blessed. They themselves do rest from their labours and their works follow them.

The Diocese will hear with regret of the death of the late Rev. Thomas Scales Ellerby, one of our superannuated Clergy who has for some years past resided in Toronto. Before taking orders in our Church Mr. Ellerby was a minister of the Congregationalist Body, and was for fourteen years pastor of the English-speaking protestants at St. Petersburg, and for ten years in charge of Zion Church, Toronto. In 1866 he was ordained Deacon, and in 1867 Priest by the Bishop of Huron. He was for some years Rector of St. George's Church, Sarnia. Of late years he has been known as the able and devoted Secretary of the "London Society for promoting Christianity among the Jews." By the elder Clergy who knew his worth his name will be honoured and esteemed.

LAY WORKERS' ASSOCIATION.

This Society, under the vigorous leadership of its Chairman, Mr. A. H. Dymond, carried out its first public Congress in October last in the City of St. Thomas. Owing to sickness, I was unable to

be present, but many who attended its sessions were both pleased and edified. The Sunday School Committee combined its efforts with the Lay Workers to add to the general interest of the Congress.

THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

This noble branch of Christian activity is growing mightily year by year, and advancing in every good work of love and usefulness. The total receipts this year are \$3,056.74, being \$700 in excess of last year. The Synod will be delighted to hear that the Auxiliary has most kindly assumed the support of the Lion's Head Mission, and will itself pay the \$400 to our missionary, which up to this time has been paid by the Executive Committee.

THE CONFEDERATION OF THE CHURCH OF BRITISH NORTH AMERICA.

A plan for the unity of the whole Church of British North America will be laid before you and will demand your earnest attention and prayers. So grand and majestic a scheme as the unification of the whole Church of British North America cannot, of course, be effected without much labor and anxious care. We must expect difficulties and trials, but, if we can accomplish the doing of so great a work, the end is worthy of our present toil.

Two ordinations have been held since last we met. The first was on the 20th day of December last in St. George's Church London, when the following gentlemen were admitted to the Diaconate:

CONFIRMATIONS.

I have held seventy-one confirmations since last we met, and have confirmed 1,536 candidates.

CHURCHES CONSECRATED.

I have consecrated two Churches, Christ Church, Forest, and Christ Church, Haysville.

I have laid the foundation of a church at Ilderton to be called Christ Church. There is also in progress a church at Elsinore.

And now commending you to the Word of God and the testimony of His grace, I trust that all the deliberations of this august and important Synod may be conducted to the glory of God and edification of His Church.

Appointment of Committee.

The Bishop appointed Rev. Wm. Craig and Mr. Charles Jenkins a Committee to frame a resolution of condolence from this Synod to the widow and family of the late Lord Bishop of Quebec, in view of their recent bereavement.

Receiving Report of the Executive Committee.

The annual report of the Executive Committee was then submitted, and being distributed in printed form, the reading of it was dispensed with. The printed audited accounts had been previously placed in the hands of the members of the Synod.

The Executive Committee beg to present herewith their annual report:—

The Committee are glad to be able to report as the result of the year's work, a large increase in the total income from the Diocese. The increase over that of last year amounts to \$3013.26, of which \$1417.60 is in the collections for our own Diocesan purposes.

collections amount to \$2465.03 as compared with \$2323.43 for the previous year an increase of \$141.60, the collections made at the annual missionary meetings amount to \$1174.81 as against \$788.92 for the previous year, making a total increase in the collections for this fund of \$527.49. The Parochial Association collections amount to \$5495.11, \$49.09 more than in 1891. It should be noticed however that the annual subscriptions of the clergy payable under the Widows' and Orphans' Fund Canon as amended at the last Synod are now payable and credited to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund direct instead of being included among the parochial subscriptions as heretofore. Had these been included among the Parochial Association Subscriptions during the past year, the difference would have been \$514.09 which represents the true increase over 1891. By virtue also of the same amendment, the sum of \$690 only was transferred to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, instead of double that amount which would have been payable under the old canon, leaving a balance of \$3053.51 which has been transferred to the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund. The sum of \$17708.95 was paid during the year. There were 77 clergymen on the fund. The sum of \$400 was paid in outfits, being a decrease of \$800.

The interest received from the Commutation Fund, including arrears of interest, up to the 30th April, 1891 under the act consolidating the Trust Funds amounted to \$11759.78 from the Sustentation Fund \$3807.97, and from the Mission Fund Investments \$369.79, reducing the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund overdraft from \$4015.44 on the 30th April, 1891 to \$137.10 at the end of the year just closed.

DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The interest in these branches of the Church's work continues to be well sustained.

The Ascensiontide collection for Domestic Missions shows an increase of \$526.05. The October collection for Algoma is about the same as last year.

The Good Friday collection for the Jews is \$104.12 more than last year.

The Epiphanytide collection for Foreign Missions is \$31.62 less than in 1891.

There was an increase of \$730.86 in the receipts of the W.A.M.A. and of \$133.74 in the Sunday School Lenten offerings for Domestic and Foreign Missions.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

There are now twenty-five annuitants upon this fund. One widow, Mrs. Grace Wilson, widow of the late Rev. R. J. Wilson having died, and two orphans, Miss Alice Salter, daughter of the late Rev. Canon Salter and W. A. Bartlett, son of the late Rev. Henry Bartlett, having attained the age of 18 years. One widow, Mrs. Patterson has been added to the list.

The two half yearly collections for the year amounted to \$1257.32 which, with the balance from last year, the annual fees of the Clergy, the interest on the Invested Funds and the sum of \$690 transferred from the General Purpose Fund, have left sufficient balance after payment of annuities amounting to \$5030.00 to carry the sum of \$2500 to the Capital Account.

SUPERANNUATION.

One Clergyman was superannuated during the year, the Rev. R. Fletcher. Pensions amounting to \$6390.00 were paid.

THE SEE HOUSE INDEBTEDNESS.

Your Committee have considered the offer made by his Lordship the Bishop, to accept as income no more than that which is derived from the interest bearing capital of the Episcopal Fund. The Committee while appreciating the generosity of his Lordship's offer could not entertain the proposition since the provision of a residence is an obligation resting upon the Diocese, which should be met by the Diocese.

The amount of the See House indebtedness has been directed to be charged against the General Purpose Fund Investments account, instead of the Episcopal and Archdeacons' fund.

The Rev. Canon Young, having agreed to undertake the duty, has been appointed the agent of the Synod to canvass the Diocese, for the purpose of discharging the cost of the See House.

REVISION OF CANONS.

The amendments to the Canons and Constitution as recommended to us by the Committee appointed to revise same will be found in the Convening Circular.

SYNOD ASSESSMENTS.

In accordance with the resolution passed, at last meeting of the Synod the assessments of the various Congregations in the Diocese have been revised and equalized, and in some cases where arrears had been allowed to accumulate satisfactory settlements have been made.

Committee in connection with the Depository. It is satisfactory to know that the Depository is making substantial progress both financially and otherwise. The sales for the past sixteen months amounted to \$2,018.86.

TRUST FUNDS.

The total funds vested in the Synod in trust for the various funds: Rectories and churches in the Diocese including lands valued for the purposes of consolidation now amount to \$716,570.10, of this \$681,997.44 makes up the consolidated investment account, the remainder \$34,572.66 consisting chiefly of Diocesan advances and matters of a temporary character being carried to what has been styled the Capital Suspense account. The consolidation of the investments has now been in effect for one year and your Committee know of no reason for regret in the step so taken. Your Committee have cause to rejoice that the year just closed has been a fairly prosperous one. Interest has as a rule been promptly paid, and the amount earned has been sufficient to pay a dividend of 6.0697% on the capital account. Four quarterly dividends at the rate of 22½% have been paid, and the balance is payable with the next quarterly cheque on the 1st of August according to the terms of the Act.

SECRETARY-TREASURER.

In consequence of the highly satisfactory manner in which the Secretary-Treasurer has performed his duties your Committee recommend that his salary be increased by the sum of \$200 per annum from the first of July next.

ACCOUNTS.

The printed audited accounts show the standing of the various funds.

Receiving Reports of Other Committees.

1. The report of the Committee on the Consolidation of the Anglican Church in British North America was submitted.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSOLIDATION.

1. The Committee appointed last Synod to more fully consider the scheme of Consolidation as formulated by the Winnipeg Conference, begs to report:
2. That this Committee recommends the scheme adopted by the Winnipeg Conference for adoption by this Synod.
3. That this Synod be represented at the proposed General Synod Meeting in September, 1893, and that its delegates be instructed to endeavor to secure the passage of the following amendments:
4. To strike out the last sentence of Clause 1, and substitute therefor: Those having 100 to 150 Clergymen and 5 Delegates of each Order, and those having 150 Clergymen and over, 6 Delegates of each Order. And a further addition to Clause 1, "A vote by Dioceses may be called for."

NOTE.—Proportional representation instead of equal numerical representation from each Synod in the lower house is thus admitted. But the privilege of voting by Dioceses when called for, and the absolute equality of all the Dioceses in the Upper House, gives all reasonable security against hasty or inconsiderate Action.

5. That Clause 6 be amended by striking out the words, "including the necessary travelling expenses of the members," and adding, "Those Dioceses having less than 25 Clergy may be represented by non-residents of their respective Orders, provided that such representatives shall not be the representatives of any other Diocese."
6. That the proposed General Synod meet not less frequently than once in three years.
7. That Provincial Synods shall not meet at regularly stated intervals, but only at the call of their respective metropolitans.

Report of Diocesan Sunday School Committee.

2. The report of the Sunday School Committee was presented :

The S. S. Committee of the Diocese begs to submit the following report :—

The Depository Sales have been very satisfactory and show a steady increase, which there is reason to hope will continue, as every effort is made to keep on hand such books, tracts, etc., as meet the needs of the Diocese.

The Committee desires to express its sense of the zeal and efficiency with which the Depository has been managed by the Secretary, Mr. McWhinney, and his assistant, Mr. Manigault, to which in great measure is owing the success which has attended it.

At the request of the Committee His Lordship, the Bishop, appointed the 18th October last as a day of intercession for Sunday Schools. The Committee hope that a similar day will be observed this year.

The S. S. Committee united with that of the Lay Helpers' Association in holding a Diocesan Convention in St. Thomas, on the 28th and 29th October last, which was largely attended and most successful.

At the request of the S. S. Institute of London, England, the S. S. Com. has sent them statistics and other information concerning the S. Schools of the Diocese, which with similar facts collected from Anglican Dioceses throughout the world, will be tabulated and published.

Successful Ruri Decanal Conventions have been held during the year in Middlesex, Perth, Lambton, Oxford, Grey and Waterloo.

The S. S. Committee recommends the formation of Ruri Decanal S. S. Associations, believing that hearty co-operation of the various Church workers would make them a most valuable aid in advancing the best interest of our S. Schools.

The Committee appends to this report suggested constitution and rules for such Associations and also for Sunday Schools.

As directed by the Synod last year the Committee has considered the question of establishing a Diocesan Book Room. It is not prepared at present to report in favor of such a movement, but would extend to the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese the privilege of ordering through the Depository any books they may require.

QUESTION 1.—“What practicable means would you suggest whereby the importance and possibilities of Sunday Schools could be impressed on all connected with them, and teachers stimulated to aim at a higher standard of efficiency.”

ANSWER.—Increased spiritual life in Clergy and Teachers. Earnest persistent teaching in the pulpit and from house to house Teachers' meetings. Teachers' Bible, and preparation classes. Teachers' examinations, Diocesan and Ruri Decanal Conventions. Public catechising by the Clergymen. S. S. Anniversary in each congregation with a special Sunday School day for the whole Diocese. Monthly childrens' services and addresses by practical S. S. workers.

However much these suggestions may commend themselves, it will be only after faithful and persistent work in *each* Sunday School that the desired result will be seen on the whole. Only when every man builds the wall in front of his own house will the city be strong for attack and defence.

QUESTION 2.—“How could the missionary spirit be most effectually cultivated in our Sunday Schools?”

The answer to this might be almost summed in two words, “*supply information.*” We cannot feel interested in any cause of which we are ignorant, and interest without knowledge leads to, and causes a waste of power. It must be supplied by the circulation of missionary literature—missionary addresses—especially when possible from those who are or have been in the Mission field; special quarterly Missionary S. S. lessons; support of special objects by each School or by groups of Schools, and results made known to the scholars; reading letters from Missionaries; juvenile Missionary Associations, fostering the spirit of self denial, and teaching that the Sunday School is a place to give as well as to receive.

QUESTION 3.—Should Congregations support their S. Schools and allow the “S. S. offertory to be entirely devoted to Missions—Home, Domestic, and “Foreign.”

The great majority of the replies say yes; some adding, “if possible.” A considerable minority hold that self-support on the part of the scholar is more desirable and likely to lead to better results. The S. S. Committee, however, recommend to the Synod the adoption of the *principle* that each Congregation should aim at supporting its own S. S., and encourage the scholar to take an interest in and help those who are not so highly favored as themselves.

QUESTION 4.—“Would you approve of the Sunday Schools of the Diocese undertaking the support of a Missionary in the foreign field, and if so, how should it be done?”

With few exceptions hearty approval has been expressed, but caution is urged, due consideration to be given to the claims of Algoma and the North-west.

The Committee recommend that the collections in all the Sunday Schools of the Diocese at Epiphany and Ascensiontide be given to the Board of D. & F. M., and that the Board be asked to send a circular letter, at least three weeks before such collections, stating if possible, the particular field of work where help is most needed. Such a course will gauge the missionary spirit of the Diocesan S. S., and be a guide as to how far definite work can be safely undertaken in the future.

In view of the needs of our own Diocese the Committee strongly recommends

that the Sunday Schools be asked to contribute to its own Home Mission fund.

The names of twelve stations are mentioned in which there are no Sunday Schools, and of six places where a Sunday School might possibly lead to the establishment of a congregation.

Nearly half the replies tell of increased numbers on the roll, and about one-third, that the day of intercession was observed. Many Clergymen did not receive the notice and illness hindered others.

The need of some form of prayer for such a service has been expressed, and the Committee would recommend that it be provided under the sanction of the Bishop.

1. The Superintendent shall be appointed by the Clergyman in charge. His duties will be to preserve order, provide substitutes for absent teachers, deal with refractory pupils, open and close the school in the absence of the Clergyman, and attend the Teachers' Meeting.
2. The Sec.-Treas. will be appointed by the Superintendent and Teachers. His duties will be to keep a record of the attendance and announce the number present at the close of the School. To collect and take charge of the offerings and render a quarterly account of the disbursements.
3. Librarian shall also be appointed by the Superintendent and Teachers. His duties will be to take charge of the library and distribute the books, papers, etc.
4. The Scholars.
 - (a) New scholars must apply to the Superintendent for admission.
 - (b) Must be punctual and go quietly to their place when entering, and not leave the class without consent of the Teacher, or the School without permission of the Superintendent.
5. The Teachers will be appointed by the Clergyman, or by the Superintendent, with his consent.
 - (a) Teachers to be in their places 5 minutes before the school opens.
 - (b) In case of absence to provide a substitute or give previous notice to the Superintendent.
 - (c) To maintain order in their class, and to give the appointed marks for attendance, lessons and conduct.
 - (d) To visit the scholars at their own homes and look up those who have been absent more than one Sunday.
 - (e) To prepare and teach the appointed lesson.
 - (f) To attend the Teachers' Meeting regularly.
 - (g) To induce the scholars to attend church regularly and join in the responses.
 - (h) So to use their personal influence that the scholars may be attached to the School and the Church, rather than to the class and teacher.
 - (i) To pray regularly for their scholars and always keep in view the object of the Sunday School, which is to teach and train up the young as members of Christ, that they may adorn the doctrine of God their Saviour, in all things, and ever walk worthy of that high vocation wherewith they have been called.

Receiving Memorials.

1. From the Bishop of Algoma.

SAULT STE MARIE, ONT., May 26, 1892.

MY DEAR BISHOP,—

May I ask your attention, and through you, that of your Synod, to the subject of the stipend of the Bishop of the Missionary Diocese of Algoma.

As you are already aware, this stipend has been provided during the last five years by assessment on the several Dioceses of this Ecclesiastical Province, as recommended by a resolution adopted by the Upper House and concurred in by the Lower House of the Provincial Synod of 1886. The action then taken will be found on pp. 52 and 53 of the Journal of that Synod. The pledges given by the Dioceses in accordance with this resolution have been honorably redeemed.

These pledges now expire, and prompt action again becomes necessary.

For the information of the Synod, I beg to append a memorandum shewing the present condition of the fund, the amount of capital, the nature of the investments and securities, and the interest paid—also the sum to the credit of the open account. There will be a further sum of £600 ready for investments on the receipt of the balance of £200 still due from the "S. P. G.," the "S. P. C. K." and the Colonial Bishops' Fund" respectively, in payment of the supplemental grants of £500 promised conditionally from each of these several sources towards the Endowment of the Diocese.

The Trustees of the fund are the Bishops of Toronto and Niagara, and the Honorary Treasurer, A. H. Campbell, Esq.

I will only add, in conclusion, the expression of my earnest hope, that if it be within bounds of possibility the several Synods may see their way to a renewal of the present *modus vivendi* for another term of years, inasmuch as the utilization of the annual interest, *quantum valeat*, must of necessity, materially retard the growth of the fund, by leaving its increase entirely dependent on the small and infrequent contributions of individuals in Canada and England.

who were appointed by the Huron College Alumni Association at its annual meeting held on Monday evening last, the Alumni request the privilege of presenting to His Lordship the Bishop and the members of the Synod a Memorial asking that the Synod will consider what means may be taken to strengthen and advance the interests of Huron Divinity College, without for one moment assuming the right to speak authoritatively in the name of the College, which right belongs only to the College Council, the Alumni who retain a very deep and abiding interest in their alma mater, feel that they may fittingly and with confidence ask the Synod's earnest sympathy and co-operation in furthering the work, by the adoption of some means which may be thought suitable and practicable on the further discussion of this Memorial if it shall be your pleasure to receive it and give it your consideration. The College, being the child of the devoted Christian enterprise and zeal of revered and beloved workers in this section of Christ's Vineyard in times past, and also having instructed no less a number than sixty-three of the active working Clergy of this present day, men who, in many fields of this extensive and largely Missionary Diocese, are by faithful, intelligent and self-denying labor, showing by their works that they are workmen of whose workmanship none need to be ashamed, to a great extent the *bone and sinew* of the missionary evangelization of this great West; the Memorialists feel that they need not use arguments to commend the cause to your earnest prayers and sympathy, and to your most cordial encouragement. It would be unnecessary to dwell upon the fact, that while the Great Head of the Church can work with any instrument He may desire, it is our part to do all we can to prepare His Teachers as fully for the work as lies in our power, feeling a responsibility before Him to endeavor that the men sent out from Huron College may be thoroughly equipped with deep theological learning, earnestness and devotion of soul, with broad general culture, and with all those endowments which quicken the vision as we look up toward the Sacrifice of Love, and also put us more in sympathy with the struggling minds and aspirations of those who are to be taught, supported, or led into the fold.

For the accomplishment of its work the College has already a substantial foundation laid in endowment and building, a Principal and Professor of whom the students and the Diocese at large are justly proud, but more requires to be provided by the Diocese than the provision already made. With meagre equipment and an insufficient number of professors, efforts are being made to give the students a good general knowledge as well as the special instruction more immediately bearing upon their future work as pastors. It is almost *absolutely necessary* that students entering without a preliminary University training shall take a general course of study as well as a theological one. In this day of wide spread inquiry and general information the Clergy *must* be educated in the current knowledge of the day. Among other branches of study, those which bring the observing student to the wondrous revelation of God in nature, and teach him to read in every stone and brook, and physical agency of Him in whom all live and move, and have their being; those branches which teach us through the avenues of matter to climb upward and upward even to the heights of the celestial world of spirit and of God, should be fully provided for in Huron College, in order that its graduates may be men up *with the times*, and commanding the respect and confidence of their parishoners as thoroughly cultured and educated Christian gentlemen.

This is what other Dioceses are doing, and the consecrated resources of this large Diocese of Huron with its over fifteen thousand families should place its Divinity College, *second to none*, in complete equipment for its work of preparing men for the work of the ministry, and then having done our part we may as a Diocese with more confidence approach the throne of the Heavenly Grace, and pray that He who is the Lord of all the harvest may send forth

more laborers, so sadly needed, into His harvest here.

We would therefore respectfully request the Synod that they extend to this Institution some special Diocesan recognition of the College work and its merits, such as by the appointment of a Committee to wait upon the College Council and confer with them as to the best method of giving force to the intent of this memorial, by it may be the appointment of visitors who might report to the Synod annually, or by inviting an annual deputation from the Council or Alumni to bring before the Synod definite information on the subject; or by any other means commend the work and excellence of the College to the sympathy and support of the Diocese at large.

We desire to have your Synod's hearty co-operation in bringing the matter before the Dominion and Provincial Governments, and would suggest that the petition for the former be sent to the Minister of Justice, and that for the latter to the Lieutenant Governor.

I send herewith a marked copy of the report of the last Prison Reform Conference containing the recommendations mentioned in the memorials.

To His Excellency the Governor General of Canada in Council.

recommended that the strongest pressure be brought to bear on the Dominion Government by the Government and Legislative Assembly of the Province, as well as by all societies and individuals interested in the reformation of criminals, for the establishment of an industrial reformatory for this class, which institution shall incorporate in its methods of treatment all the best features of the Elmira system, and the systems in operation in the other establishments of a similar kind in the United States.

'29. That to this reformatory be committed all young men between the ages of seventeen and thirty, who have been convicted for a first time of a felony or serious misdemeanor, and who in the opinion of the judges imposing sentence are proper cases for reformatory treatment; all prisoners sent to this reformatory to be committed for an indeterminate period.

'31. That the sentence of those committed to the proposed reformatory for young men be in all cases indeterminate with a maximum limit, and that commissioners or others be empowered to make regulations for the management of the reformatory, to establish a system of grades and marks, or such other means of stimulating the inmates to habits of order and industry and promoting their reformation as they may deem best; to liberate on parole such of the inmates as by their attention to work, diligence in study, observance of the rules, earnest efforts to reform, and general good conduct, have proved that they will do their duty faithfully in any position in which they may be placed, and to discharge unconditionally those who having been paroled behave well for any appointed time.

That said Conference thereupon unanimously passed the following resolutions:—

On motion of E. A. Meredith, LL.D., seconded by Rev. Dr. Johnston, it was resolved,

"That this Conference is fully alive to the frightful evils necessarily resulting from the association of youthful offenders with the most depraved and hardened criminals in the Central Prison, and in the Kingston and other penitentiaries in the Dominion, and cordially concurs in the recommendation of the Prison Commissioners in regard to the necessity for the establishment of a special reformatory for young men between the ages of 16 and 30, and that this Conference recommends that the subject be brought under the notice of the Federal Government, with a view to the necessary steps being taken for the establishment of such institution; and that the Committee already appointed by this Conference be hereby authorized to submit this matter to the Hon. the Minister of Justice."

The said Conference also considered the subject of the PARDONING POWER, and passed the following resolution in respect thereof:—

16. That such changes be made in the Dominion laws as may be found necessary to confer on the Provincial Government and its officers all requisite authority to pardon, parole, apprentice, board out and generally deal with and exercise control over all children and youths sentenced or committed to or placed in the reformatory for boys, the refuge or reformatory for girls and the industrial schools of the Province, whether such boys and girls have been sentenced or committed to or placed in such institutions under the provisions of Dominion or Provincial laws.

Your Petitioners approve of the action taken by the Prison Reform Conference, and are of opinion that the recommendations of the Conference warrant the immediate consideration of your Excellency and his advisers.

Your Petitioners therefore pray: that your Excellency will be pleased to take

the matter into your most favorable consideration, and cause such action to be taken in the premises as will bring about the desired result.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.

To the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Ontario in Council.

The petition of
humbly sheweth :

First.—That whereas, the Prison Reform Commissioners in their report, presented to the Local House during the session of 1891, submitted certain practical recommendations with regard to the inauguration of better methods of dealing with vice and crime.

Second.—That whereas, these recommendations were unanimously endorsed at the Prison Reform Conference held in Toronto in November last, said Conference being composed of prison experts, delegates from all the churches as well as from thirty-two other bodies.

Third.—That whereas, one session of the Local Legislature has passed without action being taken with regard to these recommendations, which all friends of prison reform most deeply regret.

Therefore we humbly pray that you may be pleased to call the attention of your advisers to this important matter, and the necessity of dealing with the question without further delay.

While we are anxious that practical effect should be given to these recommendations with as little delay as possible, we are especially anxious that the recommendations with regard to JUVENILE CRIME should be dealt with as promptly as possible.

And as in duty bound, we will ever pray.

The said Committee to report to the Executive Committee.

2. By Rev. W. T. Hill.

That the Lord Bishop of the Diocese be respectfully requested in the way that he shall deem fit to draw up a form of commendation for the use of the Clergy in the case of those persons leaving one parish for another.

3. By Rev. W. J. Taylor.

(1) That the Synod utters its earnest protest against the new regulations for the dispatching of the Canadian mails by rail and ocean steamers upon the Lord's Day, and petitions the Dominion Government to make such arrangements for dispatching the mails to Great Britain as shall not unnecessarily disturb the rest and violate the sanctity of that day.

(2) That the Synod in company with the Christian people of the United States and of Great Britain expresses its earnest hope that the World's Exhibition to be held in Chicago in 1893, may be closed upon each Lord's Day. That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Commissioners and Directorate of said exhibition.

(3) That this Synod petition the Dominion Government to see that its Commissioner at the Columbian Exhibition take such steps as shall, at least, prevent the Canadian section from remaining open on the Lord's Day.

(4) That the Synod bring before the Christian community the expediency of the early closing of all business establishments and stores on the Saturday evening, and the duty of all professing Christians to do their shopping at as early an hour as possible on that day.

(5) That this Synod urges upon all the Clergy to give continued and increased emphasis from the pulpit to the whole subject of Lord's Day observance.

(6) That his Lordship the Bishop be respectfully requested to issue a pastoral at an early date upon the whole subject of the Lord's Day rest and worship.

4. By Mr. R. Shaw Wood,

That a Committee be appointed to investigate the various causes which hinder the growth of the Church of England in this Diocese from being as rapid as we would wish.

The Synod adjourned at 5 o'clock.

EVENING SESSION.

The Synod reassembled at 8 o'clock.

The Bishop in the chair.

Receiving Reports of Committees.

The report of the Huron Anglican Lay Workers' Association was presented and directed to be printed for circulation among members of the Synod.

TO THE SYNOD:

The Committee of Management of the Huron Anglican Lay Workers Association be to report:

1. The Committee desire in the first place to acknowledge the cordial assistance received from both Clergy and Laity in their efforts to promote the more general employment of the latter in the work and services of the Church.
2. They believe that among the former a stronger sense of the value and importance of Lay help is very generally felt, and that the Laity are in a larger degree than formerly awakening to a higher conception of their duty to the Church and its Divine Head in this regard.
3. The Committee may remind the Synod that, while enjoying Episcopal and Synodical recognition and support, the Association is purely voluntary in its character; that it includes all male persons engaged in any branch of Church work, either spiritual or temporal, within the limits of the Diocese; and that it is formed not intrusively to intervene or direct in any particular—but by quiet and unobtrusive methods, to bring the Workers into communication, to encourage those who still remain unemployed, and to spread such information of the progress of the Lay Help movement, both at home and elsewhere, as may stimulate all to greater usefulness and activity.
4. The expenses of the Association, provided for by a vote of the last Synod, are shown by the published accounts to have amounted in the year to \$99.90. This represents exclusively printing, stationery and postage, and includes the rather extensive correspondence incidental to organization, the outlay preliminary to the St. Thomas Convention and the liberal circulation of the first annual report of the Association and accompanying documents. The local cost of the Convention, including the hospitable entertainment of all the Delegates, was most generously defrayed by the St. Thomas churches.
5. The Committee in this connection feel it right to acknowledge the kind and ever willing aid rendered by the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod and his Assistant, and which has materially lightened the labors of the Officers of the Association.
6. The holding (already referred to) of a Convention of Church and Sunday School Workers at St. Thomas in October last, in connection with the Annual Meeting of the Association, the arrangements being under the direction of a Joint Committee of the Association and the Synod Sunday School Committee, was so successful that it is proposed to hold a second Convention during the

The Committee had originally contemplated Stratford as the first place of meeting, but, for reasons hereafter explained, although at the time not fully understood, the plans of the Committee were changed, and the invitation from St. Thomas was accepted. The suggestion that the Convention should meet at Stratford in October next was promptly and cordially acted upon by the Stratford Churches, and their welcome was voiced in a letter to the Chairman from the late Reverend Canon Patterson, which, as an act due to his memory, the Committee think it well to introduce it into this Report, and which was as follows :

STRATFORD, MAY 2, 1892.

DEAR MR. DYMOND,

Your note of the 28th inst. duly reached me. I am quite delighted to learn that it is proposed to hold the next meeting of the Huron Lay Workers and S.S. Convention in this place, and I shall do all I possibly can to make it a success. Some may have censured me for objecting to it being held here last October ; but the truth is we had just then commenced the erection of a fine Parochial Hall and Sunday School. Consequently the surroundings of the Church were in great disorder, and we thought it desirable to postpone the holding of such a meeting until the building was completed. I am now glad to be able to inform you that the building is nearly finished and we expect the Bishop (D. V.) to open it for us on Sunday, June 19th.

I feel confident you will be pleased with it. We shall have a large and well finished hall capable of accommodating 500 persons—sufficiently large I think for the meeting of the Convention—together with other rooms which may be used for the meetings of Committees. We shall also have a large Chapel in the basement for week day services. As regards myself, in consequence of failing health, I have been unable to take any Parochial work for nearly six months, and have well nigh abandoned the hope of ever being able to resume active work. However, I have some good Church Workers here who will be glad to make all the necessary preparations for the Convention. Allow me, therefore, dear Mr. Dymond, to assure you of a hearty welcome to St. James' Parish.

It has pleased God, since the above was written, to call away our vénéable and honored friend from the field in which he has so long and faithfully labored, but the warm-hearted welcome remains to be accepted, the Committee trusts, by all who are able to come together and take counsel as to how with increased ardour and efficiency the Lord's work in His Church may be carried forward. Notice of the arrangements will be given in good time.

7. The Committee have opened a correspondence with the Diocesan Lay Helpers' Associations in England, where the movement has of late years made great progress. Much valuable information has been received, a summary of which will be compiled and circulated in due course. The employment of Lay agency in evangelistic work, and the adoption of plans for the systematic training and examination of Lay Readers and Evangelists are interesting and important features of the reports which have come to hand.

8. Notice has been given by the Chairman of the Committee in the Convening Circular, of a resolution for a Committee (with the Bishop as Chairman) to consider whether Canon IX. on Lay Readers is adequate to the present needs and practice of the Church in this Diocese. A discussion of some practical matters in the direction indicated, and in the light of experience so far as it has been

acquired, will, it is believed, be useful.

Consideration of Report of Executive Committee.

The Annual Report of the Executive Committee was taken up for consideration.

On motion, it was resolved that the Report be considered clause by clause.

The several clauses, with the exception of that on Trust Funds' were adopted as read. Said clause was amended by striking out the words, "Rectories and Churches," and inserting in their stead the words, "Rectorial and Other Endowments in the Diocese."

The report thus amended was, on motion of the Chairman, put to the Synod and declared carried.

Consideration of Reports.

The report of the Committee on the Consolidation of the Anglican Church in British North America was read.

Moved by Mr. Charles Jenkins,

Seconded by Mr. A. H. Dymond,

VI. *Resolved.* That the several clauses of the report be now read a first time.

The motion was put to the vote and declared carried.

The Synod then resolved itself into Committee of the Whole.

In the Committee.

Clauses 1 and 2 were agreed to.

Clause 3 was amended by the omission of all the words after "September, 1893."

Clause 4 was amended by prefixing to the first sentence the words "That the Delegates to the Provincial Synod be instructed to endeavor to secure the passage of the following amendments," and the omission of the word "and" before "5 Delegates."

Clauses 5 and 6 were agreed to.

On motion, Clause 2 was reconsidered.

On motion, the Committee rose and reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

In the Synod.

The Synod resumed its session.

On motion, duly carried, it was resolved that the matter of the Consolidation of the Church should come up as first order of business on Wednesday morning after routine.

The Synod adjourned at 10.35.

SECOND DAY.

Wednesday, June 22nd, 1892.

The Litany was said in St. Paul's Cathedral at 9.30 o'clock.

The Synod of Huron begs to convey to the widow and family of the late Right Reverend James William Williams, D.D., Bishop of Quebec, the assurance of its heartfelt sympathy in the great affliction that has come upon them, and its prayer for them is that the Divine consolation and strength in large measure will be their portion in this their hour of trial. The memory of the loyal, brave, true and tender man, and the faithful and devoted Christian Minister and Bishop will remain as a precious heritage to his family and to the whole Church.

5. A memorial was presented from Indian congregations in Grand River Reservations on the subject of Synod assessment.

They therefore request that they may in future be assessed as other parishes in the Diocese, and thus be placed on an equal footing with their white brethren in this respect.

Report of Committee on the Consolidation of the Anglican Church in British North America as Amended.

1. The Committee appointed last Synod to more fully consider the scheme of Consolidation as formulated by the Winnipeg Conference, begs to report:—
2. That this Committee recommends the principle of the scheme adopted by the Winnipeg Conference for adoption by this Synod.
3. That this Synod be represented at the proposed General Synod Meeting in September, 1893.
4. That the delegates to the Provincial Synod be instructed to endeavour to secure the passage of the following amendments:

To strike out the last sentence of Clause 1, and substitute therefor: Those having 100 to 150 Clergymen, 5 Delegates of each Order, and those having 150 Clergymen and over, 6 Delegates of each Order. And a further addition to Clause 1, "A vote by Dioceses may be called for."

NOTE.—Proportional representation instead of equal numerical representation from each Synod in the Lower House is thus admitted. But the privilege of voting by Dioceses when called for, and the absolute equality of all the Dioceses in the Upper House, gives all reasonable security against hasty or inconsiderate action.

5. That Clause 6 be amended by striking out the words, "including the necessary travelling expenses of the members," and adding, "Those Dioceses having less than 25 Clergy may be represented by non-residents of their respective Orders, provided that such representatives shall not be the representatives of any other Diocese.
6. That the proposed General Synod meet not less frequently than once in three years.
7. That Provincial Synods shall not meet at regularly stated intervals, but only at the call of their respective metropolitans.
8. That Clause 5 be amended as follows: Strike out all after the word "operative" in the fourth line and add the words, "in any Diocese until accepted.

Sometimes our delegates have been unable to attend on account of the expense, and it is hoped this step will result in the increased efficiency of the Board. I wish also to notice that a good idea has been adopted in the provision for letters commendatory, to be given members of the Church moving from parish to parish, so that they may be under a pastor's care early after their arrival. I beg also to acknowledge the peace and harmony that have attended our deliberations. While the subjects were earnestly and even warmly debated, I am thankful that at no time was the peace and harmony of the Synod disturbed, and I commend that manliness and spirit of concession that was at all times present in the debates. I believe that we have done work for the Glory of God and for the advancement of the Kingdom of His dear Son. I trust that God may guide and comfort each member of this body, and spare us all for future and better work.

The Synod rose and the proceedings closed with the singing of the Doxology.

Section 20, line 7.—To substitute the words "the proceeds" for "that."

That before taking action on the report of the Commissioner or Commissioners referred to in the preceding section, the Executive Committee shall by the Secretary-Treasurer duly notify the Clergymen and Churchwardens of any Congregation that will be affected thereby, and shall appoint a time to hear any objections that may be urged against the proposed re-arrangement, after which hearing the decision of the Executive Committee, subject to the approval of the Bishop, shall be final and conclusive.

5. That in the event of the stipend of any Clergyman being temporarily diminished by any re-arrangement made under the authority of this Canon, the Executive Committee may, on the recommendation of the Bishop, make to such Clergyman a grant or grants from the Mission Fund, sufficient in amount to secure such Clergyman against pecuniary loss; but this section shall not apply to arrears due by Congregations to Clergymen.

6. This Canon shall be known as Canon XIV.

Canon XVI.—To substitute the word "executive" for "standing" wherever it occurs.

Canon XVI., Clause 3, Sub-Section 2.—To substitute the word "or" for "nor" wherever it occurs in line 1.

Canon XIX.—To substitute the words "Church of England" for "United Church of England and Ireland" wherever they occur.

Canon XX.—To strike out "1st" in line 4 and "2nd" in line 13.

Canon XXI., Section 1.—To insert the words "at least" after the words "Clergyman of" in line 3.

Canon XXI., Section 10.—To strike out the whole section, reading as follows: "10. This Canon shall take effect from and after December 6th, 1888."

Canon XXII., Section 30.—To strike out the whole section, reading as follows: "30. The existing Canon XXII., on the discipline of the Clergy, is hereby repealed from and after the passing hereof, and this Canon is substituted therefor.

Canon XXIII.—To repeal the whole Canon.

Canon XXIV.—To be renumbered XXIII., and to be amended so as to read as follows:

XXIII.—ON COLLECTIONS.

1. No person shall be permitted to collect money for any Church purpose beyond the bounds of his own *Parish*, within this Diocese, or proceed to any other Diocese for the same purpose without the sanction of the Bishop in writing.

2. Any person before collecting in any Parish, shall obtain the sanction of the Clergyman of said Parish.

3. Such person, on returning from his collecting tour, shall forthwith submit to the Bishop the subscription list and account for moneys received.

4. When the collection is for the benefit of any Parish or congregation in this Diocese, the said Parish or congregation shall give a guarantee that all expenses connected with said collection shall be paid by them, so that all the funds obtained by appeal to others shall be applied to the object for which they were collected.

Canon XXV.—To be renumbered XXIV.

Canon XXVI.—To be renumbered XXV., and to be amended so as to read as follows:

XXV.—ON THE EPISCOPAL AND ARCHDEACONS' FUND.

The Episcopal and Archdeacons' Fund, and securities received from the Diocese of Toronto, *in relation thereto*, shall form one fund, from the income of which \$400 shall be paid to an Archdeacon, and the balance, after paying the necessary expenses, shall be paid to the Bishop.

Canon XXVII.—To strike out the first four lines and the word "that" at the beginning of the 1st, 3rd and 4th sections, and the Canon to be renumbered No. XXVI.

Canon XXVIII.—To be renumbered Canon XXVII.

Canon XXVIII., Section 5.—To strike out the words "(now March 31)" in line 2.

Canon XXVIII., Section 9.—To substitute the words "at the close of the financial year" for the words "on the 31st day of March preceding."

Canon XXVIII., Section 12.—To substitute the word "Executive" for "Standing" in line 5.

Canon XXVIII., Section 16.—To strike out this section, reading "16. That this Canon shall take effect from January 1st, 1874," and that the amendment to the Canon passed at the Synod in June 1888, be renumbered Section 16

Canon XXIX.—To be numbered XXVIII., and that clauses 12 and 13 be struck out, which read as follows:—

"12. That the Canon shall come into force on and after the first day of July, A. D. 1887, but in the case of Parishes and Missions not assessed at date, shall be operative only upon the final completion of their assessments."

"13. That Canon XXIX. be and is hereby repealed, and that this Canon be numbered XIX."

Canon XXX.—To be renumbered Canon XXIX.

That the Canon enacted at the Synod held in June, 1880, be numbered Canon XXX. This Canon reads as follows:—

CLERGYMEN ENTERING THE DIOCESE OVER FIFTY YEARS OF AGE.

No Clergyman hereafter entering the Diocese, either by ordination or by transfer from another Diocese, being at the time more than 50 years of age, shall share in the benefits of either the Superannuation or the Widows and Orphans' Fund before he has served ten years in the Diocese.

Canon XXXII.—Confirmed in 1881 to be renumbered XXXI., and amended so as to read:—

XXXI.—CANON DECLARING THE TRUE CONSTRUCTION OF THE CONSTITUTION, RULES OF ORDER, AND CANONS OF THE SYNOD, IN THE MATTER OF AMENDING CANONS.

When any proposed Canon or proposed amendment to a Canon is regularly before the Synod for discussion, in accordance with the Constitution and Rules of the Synod, any amendment thereto is in order without further notice; and this has been, and is, and shall hereafter be, the true construction of the Constitution and Rules of the Synod in that behalf.

The present Canon reads as follows:—

Canon declaring the true construction of the Constitution, Rules of Order and Canons of the Synod, in the matter of amending Canons; and also confirming and re-enacting the Constitution, Rules of Order and Canons of the Synod.

*When any proposed Canon or proposed amendment to a Canon is regularly before the Synod for discussion, in accordance with the Constitution and Rules of the Synod, any amendment thereto is in order without further notice; and this has been, and is, and shall hereafter be, the true construction of the Constitution and Rules of the Synod in that behalf.

And the Constitution, Rules of Order and the Canons of the Synod, as they appear in the printed records of the Synod, with the amendments thereto there mentioned, the Canons being numbered from 1 to 31 inclusive, as enumerated in the annexed schedule, are hereby in every particular confirmed, ratified and re-enacted.

(*) NOTE.—Sessions of 1878 and 1884. Resolved—That in future the ballot papers for the Executive Committee shall denote the members for the past year and state the number of quarterly meetings at which each was present, and the counties arranged alphabetically, showing the residence of each delegate.
