SENATOR KING CONFESSES THAT

SENATE KILLED HIGHWAYS BILL

TO SAVE LIBERALS FROM DEFEAT

Gagetown, June 13.—An unguarded admission, publicly made by Senator King at the nomination proceedings here today, enables the people of New Brunwick to clearly understand why the Liberals in the Senate deprived this Province of the proposed Federal grant of \$50,000 for improving the highways. They voted against the bill not because they thought it was bad legislation, but because they were afraid that it might influence the electors against the Liberal party in the forthcoming Provincial elections.

This amazing admission was wrung from Mr. King during the address of H. W. Woods, one of the Government candidates in Queens, Mr. Woods was referring to the action of Senator King, who seconded the amendment which killed the bill, and of the other Liberals in the Senate in depriving the Province of the benefit of the Federal grant of \$50,000, when the Senator from Chipman interrupted to explain his position.

In the course of his defence, Senator King admitted that all the Liberal Senators of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia supported the amendment in the belief that the vision of the bill was too broad. They believed, he said, that the money would be used to influence the forthcoming elections in Quebec and Saskatchewan, and also in the New Brunswick general election.

Mr. Woods was quick to drive home the point of the Senator's argument. "The true reason why Senator "King and his Liberal friends in the Senate deprived "the roads of this benefit," he replied, "is now apparment.
