The various departments of our congregational work have been conducted on the usual lines with a reasonable measure of encouragement and success. Notwithstanding the still inactive state of the Streetsville Woolen Mills, and a steady drift of population to larger centres of business, &c., it will be seen by a reference to the statistical report that we have more than held our own in members. This is gratifying indeed.

We have much pleasure in commending the faithfulness of the members and adherents in their large and well sustained attendance ,upon all the religious services. We give unfeigned thanks to God for the helpful service which many of our young people are rendering in the name of Christ, both in the Sabbath School, Missionary, and Christain Endeavor organizations.

The Elders prayerfully desire that in larger measure will the congregation be interested in the general work of our Church at large. Let our growth in grace be manifested by increased liberality to the schemes of the church. We believe the time has fully come when we, as a congregation, should universally adopt systematic giving. The general financial basis of the congregation being sound, our energies might profitably and properly be occupied in increasing our gifts to the Lord.

The Congregation enjoyed three Communion seasons during the year, with the following large attendance of members: 225, 233, 261. The pastor's visitingbook shows a record of 415 pastoral visits, of which 78 were to sick and afflicted. Many family circles have been broken during the year, and the lesson is "Be ye also ready." May the year on which we are about to enter be one of increased diligence and faithfulness in the service of love. May the Divine Husbandman

#### SIXTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

The Managers herewith present an abstract statement of Revenue and Expenditure for the past year. The statement shows that the financial prosperity of the Congregation has been fully maintained. Owing to the removal of a number of families early in the year, on account of the continued inactivity of the Barberton factory, it was naturally expected that contributions to the Ordinary Fund would show a decrease. A reference to the Treasurer's statement shows that the liberality of the Congregation has provided against such deficit, and it is especially satisfactory to note that the amount of both envelope and open collections has increased about \$200. Such a favorable showing must be accepted as encouraging in the highest degree.

The Managers take this opportunity of publicly thanking the Ladies of the Congregation for their assistance in the matter of fencing a portion of the Church property. The voluntary offering in October enabled the Board to pay the interest due on the floating debt, and to effect a slight reduction in the principal. The total debt against the property of the Congregation now stands at \$1744, while the estimated value of land

and buildings is placed at \$15,000.00.
