



London, May 20.—It is stated that the Government wishes to maintain the secret of the new safety acroplane which is the properity of the War Department. While this would give a great advantage to the British army aerial service, it is pointed out by some that it would be against the interest of humanity in the conquest of the air. The King is enthusiastic over the new machine. After witnessing a flight at Aldershot he exclaimed: "Why havent you a hundred of these in the army."

"The new aeroplane," he said, "is inherently not automatically stable, that is to say its stability depends on the shape, not on any mechanical attachment. The secret can be applied to the monoplane as well as to the biplane. The new aeroplane, which is all British and all the product of British brains, except the engine, has been put to all manner of trials. It has been flown in a gale flung at air pockets and eddies, and banked steeply, and has proved stable in all ways. A novice can quite safely control it in the air, but still the greatest problem of all remains to be solved—that of safe landing. I have flown hundreds of miles, and know that this is one thing that is checking the ad-
