BILL.

An Act to abolish the office of Solicitor General for Upper Canada.

WHEREAS it is no longer necessary that there should be a Solicitor General for Upper Canada : Therefore Her Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows : Preamble.

5 I. The office of Solicitor General for Upper Canada, is hereby abolished. Office abolished.

II. So much of any Act as recognizes or refers to the said office or officer, is hereby repealed. Acts repealed.

10 III. Any duty or thing, now by law required to be done or performed by the Solicitor General for Upper Canada, may hereafter be done or performed by the Attorney General for Upper Canada. Duty to be performed by the Attorney-General.
