Twentieth Annual Report for the Year ending 30th June, 1898.

In presenting their Annual Report with its accompanying statements of accounts, the Governors have the satisfaction of recording a continued appreciation of the Library by the public; the attendance which has increased by over 6,700 this year has now reached a point that must necessitate the consideration of additional accommodation in the near future.

Those of the public who have followed the working of the Institute closely, will regret to learn of the resignation of Mr. Angus from his position as President; the opinion of the Board has been recorded in its minutes in the following resolution :--

Resolved—That in view of Mr. Angus' long and active services in the interests of the Institute, the Board cannot urge upon him a further continuance in the position of President, and in accepting his resignation as President and as Governor, it is with the warmest appreciation of the personal sacrifice of time and attention as well as the character of the service he has so unremittingly contributed to the success of the Institute, the present condition of which is in a large measure due to his direction.

Additions to the Library during the last six years have been made by the Governors from the capital of a bequest by the Revd. Fredk. Frothingham; this has now been supplemented and a permanent provision made for a regular yearly addition in the handsome fund of \$30,000 bequeathed by the late John H. R. Molson, so long a Governor and a most liberal contributor to the support of this Institute. This fund is to be invested and the revenues applied only to the purchase of books. During the past year the Library has been increased by donations amounting to 244 volumes and the purchase of 911 volumes, of which 421 are French and 490 English. This large addition to the French section has been carefully selected and is fully warranted by the increasing interest of readers.

The work of cataloguing has gone forward steadily, and although not on the latest lines, is of practical benefit; when a sufficient increase in the general funds is reached, this work will be taken up on a system more in accordance with the wishes of the Governors and the requirements of the public.

The Governors will be glad to receive any donations of files of old newspapers or of separate issues, if of special interest, as the Library now possesses the beginning of a collection of English, French, Canadian and American newspapers extending from 1791 to 1876, which every year is becoming more and more valuable.

The revenues during the past year have not reached the moderate sum required for the maintenance of the Institute, and its usefulness is much hampered by this lack. This deficit has been partly met by handsome donations by some of the Governors, but will necessitate close and, in the interests of the reading public, undesirable economy during the coming year.

The loss of revenue has occurred through the decrease of the demand for and the consequent shrinkage in rental of business offices from the Fraser Buildings and the termination of the lease of the "Hospital" property. Improvements have now been made and a better return is hoped for in the coming year.
