Chowne. The Ceremony was performed by his Grace the Archbishop, and the Bishop of Algoma, assisted by the Rev. Canon Macnab. We desire on behalf of the

Congregation, with whom Mr. Archbold was so long associated, and among whom Mrs. Archbold has been so great a favourite, our best wishes for their prosperity and happiness.

The Rev. Canon Macnab and Mrs. Macnab have taken their journey to Excelsior Springs, Missou. i. where seven mineral springs of various quality and description, all more or less suitable for the purpose, have tempted Mrs. Macnab to seek improvement in health, which we hope she will find, as Canon Macnab has written to us with a favourable report. We hope to see them back about the middle of August.

The Sunday School Picnic and "Congregational Outing" took place at Bond Lake on Wednesday, 3rd July, and was very successful and enjoyable. The number of grown persons who joined the party was larger than on any previous occasion, showing that a pleasant trip and fine day to such a place as Bond Lake has attractions for the elders as well as the younger people. The Archbishop was present, and Canon Macnab had general charge and oversight as usual. The return trip was rather earlier than in former years—a very desirable improvement in the arrangements, where there are so many little children.

The Choir has been quite on a summer footing of late, and will be so for a short time longer, as the custom of a Choir Camp, disused in the last year or two, is to be revived and is to take place immediately. A considerable increase in members of the choir is expected, so that we anticipate a general forward movement on their part when the summer season draws to a close.
