The Children of the Church.

GENERAL CONFERENCE PROVISIONS RESPECTING BAPTIZED CHILDREN.

The N. Y. Christian Advocate & Journal says, "The most important proceeding of the Conference, respecting the children of the Church, was its acting on the Report of the Committee on Revisals, regarding the 'regulations of baptized children to the Church.'"

The following is a summary of its contents: "The relation of the child to the economy of grace is stated as the ground of his relation to the Church. This is a dogmatic feature of the law; legal prescriptions should not usually be embarrassed with dogmatic statements...

The loss of life has been great. It is estimated as follows in the undermentioned districts:— Tartans, men, women, and children 722 Kanbar, ditto 45 Takukan, ditto 2638 Total 2806

The greater number met their death in the gardens. They died in all directions, but were overtaken and swallowed up by the fatal fire-storm. Some tried to save themselves in the trees, but were either carried away with them or killed by the scorching heat.

At Kaulong and Taring the houses were filled with people who were stopped in their flight by the lava streaming down on all sides and the streams of boiling water, who met their death under the burning ashes and the tumbling houses. Many who had reached the shore and thought themselves safe became a prey to the furious waves, and many died through sheer despair and agony.
