WM. OGILVIE RETURNS FROM SURVEYING THE YUKON ENTRY.

The Photographic System Again Proves Eminent Satisfaction—The United States Alarms Entirely at Sea.

On Thursday William Ogilvie, explorer and surveyor, got back to Victoria from an expedition trip from Alaska inlet to the head of Mealy Lake. Mr. Ogilvie and his party disembarked at Juneau in December last and at once started west by men for the head of Mealy Lake, a distance of about 30 miles.
