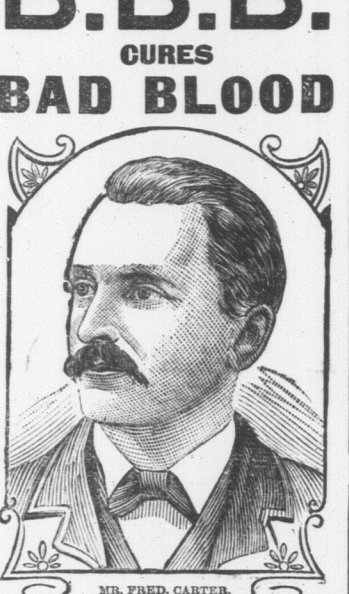

Recent despatches from Ottawa make the announcement that Mr. Mills, the member for this country, has given notice of a motion, to be moved in the House of Commons, to the effect that it is expedient to amend the Dominion franchise act, by enfranchising the officials, employees, and all persons in receipt of wages or commissions from provincial governments, which by their legislation disfranchised Dominion officials or any of them.

A law embodying the principle enunciated in the above resolution would be somewhat sweeping in its effects, enfranchising a large number of persons in every county of the province. Indeed, if framed in the House of Commons, and if passed by the Dominion government, it would apply to all Dominion officials, and to all persons in receipt of wages or commissions from provincial governments, which by their legislation disfranchised Dominion officials or any of them.

It is a small wonder that the Dominion government is signing to think that possibly there may be something commendable about our methods after all!
