BY a disastrous fire on the evening of the 14th of February, 1890, the main building of the University of Toronto, including the Convocation Hall, Museums and Library, was reduced to a roofless and defaced ruin. In accordance with a practice of long standing, the building had been given up to the use of the undergraduates for their Annual Conversazione. Among the scientific attractions prepared for the occasion, the programme announced a display of bacteriological and other microscopic slides. Some of the lamps provided for the illumination of the microscopes were upset. As the furnaces and radiators, required for the heating of the building, had been in constant use for upwards of four months, the whole woodwork was so thoroughly dry, that on the flame catching the flooring, saturated with the spilt oil, it spread with such rapidity that the main portion of the building was speedily enveloped in flames. The conflagration involved the loss of the entire contents of the Library, along with a considerable portion of the valuable collections in the Biological

and Ethnological Museums, and the whole of those in the departments of Mineralogy and Geology.

The library, though only formed in recent years, had been selected with great care, under the advice of the heads of the various departments in the University; and already contained a selection of upwards of 23,000 volumes, including rare and valuable works, along with complete sets of scientific and literary serials, of importance as books of reference alike for professors and students.

The University building was regarded with just pride by the graduates as admittedly the most beautiful structure devoted to academic purposes on the American continent; and, as one of the chief ornaments of the city of Toronto, its loss was deplored by many besides those who associated its architectural features with the cherished memories of their *Alma Mater*. Happily, the structure proved to be so substantial that the walls admitted of restoration and re-roofing; though much of the fine carving had been defaced, or had scaled off under the intense heat of the conflagration. Externally, the University Building has now been restored to more than its original beauty: advantage having been taken of the opportunity,

to remove some objectionable features that detracted from its symmetry as a whole. It is scarcely possible to overestimate the æsthetic influences of noble architecture in a building so intimately associated with the intellectual training of the rising generation at the most impressive period of life. But the value of this is exceptionally great in a young country, and on a new continent, where no monuments of ancient or mediæval art are to be seen, such as are familiar to the undergraduate in the seats of learning of the mother-land. The influences springing from such a source play their part in the cultured refinement which is not the least valuable element of higher education; and constitute an important factor in the enduring associations which link the graduate to his *alma mater*.

Through the liberality of the Provincial Legislature, supplemented by a generous gift from that of Quebec, and by the prompt and kindly aid of private benefactors, the restoration of the main structure has been prosecuted with so little delay, that, though still incomplete, the authorities were able to resume University work in the restored building in October, 1891; and on re-assembling

after the Christmas holidays, in January, 1892, they entered on its full occupation, with greatly enlarged accommodation. It is now provided with many novel facilities suggested by experience, or derived from the most modern examples of improved lecture-rooms, laboratories, museums, and other appliances in the Universities of Great Britain, France, and Germany, and in those of the United States. The old Convocation Hall having been found inadequate for the requirements of the University, it is purposed, as soon as funds are available, to erect a new one in near proximity to the main building, on a scale adapted to the great increase in the number of undergraduates, and to the special uses for which experience has shown it to be applicable. The Biological Museum has been provided with adequate space in the new science buildings; and plans are now approved of for a building to be immediately proceeded with, which will furnish to the department of Chemistry greatly extended facilities, with the requisite laboratories and lecture-rooms. The departments of Geology and Mineralogy must in like manner be provided for by further extension of the science buildings; and ample provision for the accommodation of the

Library will be secured in the new structure now erecting on the east side of the College lawn. The changes thus projected and already in progress, whereby the Convocation Hall, Library and Museums are transferred to other sites, have placed a large amount of space in the restored building at the disposal of the Faculties for additional laboratories, lecture-rooms, and other requirements of great value in the daily work of instruction and research.

Among the many losses involved in the destruction of the University building, none excited keener feelings of regret than that of the library, and its prized contents. It was a beautiful hall, fitted up with carved oaken alcoves and galleries, after the model of the older university libraries of Europe. The vista was terminated by a fine statue of William of Wykeham, originally executed by Thomas, the eminent English sculptor, under the direction of Pugin, as an essay-piece for the sculptured decorations of the new parliament buildings at Westminster; and was presented to the University by the Rev. Arthur Wickson, M.A., LL.D., a graduate of the university; and the first to fill the office of classical tutor, under the late

president, the Rev. Dr. McCaul. As the statue of the founder of New College, Oxford, and the liberal patron of learning in the age of Chaucer, this fine work of art was prized as an appropriate adornment to the Provincial University; and its loss ranks among the irreparable sacrifices involved in the fire. But in no department has the wide-felt sympathy manifested itself with more practical liberality, as shown in the valuable contributions to replace the contents of the old library alcoves. Encouraged by such prompt and efficient aid, no time has been lost in taking the needful steps for providing a suitable home for the restored library. The new structure now in progress on a site selected for it midway between the buildings appropriated to literary and scientific instruction, will form an attractive addition to the group of buildings surrounding the College lawn. The plans have been carefully prepared with a view to the construction of a detached, and, as far as possible, a fire-proof building, embodying the fruits of the most recent experience both in Europe and in the United States. The book room, adapted for the secure accommodation of the entire collection within narrow limits, has been planned on a

scale to admit of the reception of 120,000 volumes, with provision for future extension. To this a set of seminary rooms, or studies, will be attached appropriated to the leading departments of science, letters, and philosophy. It is further proposed that the entire building shall be illuminated with the electric light, and so furnish an attractive resort where the student may pass his evenings with no less pleasure than profit. With the improvements thus aimed at, it is confidently anticipated that the new library will prove an invaluable adjunct to the scheme of higher education embraced in the special organization of the University of Toronto, as a common centre of intellectual life; and will constitute a bond of closer union among the Federating Colleges of the Provincial University.

It may be permissible, without detracting from the assurance of heartfelt gratitude extended to all the benefactors hereafter named, to single out from among the prized contributions to the Library, now amounting to 40,970 volumes, a few that possess special value, by reason of some exceptional characteristic. But the first acknowledgments are due to those spontaneous organizations

of sympathising friends, both in England and on the Continent, to whose effective labours such practical results are largely to be ascribed. To the English Committee, presided over by the Marquis of Lorne, embracing in its members men of the highest eminence in rank, in science, and letters, with the efficient services of Alexander Staveley Hill, Esq., Q.C., M.P., as its treasurer, and Sir George Baden-Powell, M.P., as its secretary : the University has been placed under lasting obligations for contributions of choice works in all departments of science and literature. The presentation plates on many of the volumes in the restored Library will perpetuate the recognition of the services thus rendered in the time of need by this influential English Committee; and will preserve for later generations a record of this practical evidence of the ties of kinship and common nationality that bind us to the mother-land; while they will concur with us in welcoming no less gratefully in others of the presentation plates evidence of a recognition of the common brotherhood of letters and science, shown by the Committee organized in Germany, and by the Faculties of sister universities both in the Old and the New World.

To the Marquis of Lorne, and the English "University Library Restoration Committee," the authorities of the University of Toronto tender their sincere acknowledgments for the unwearied labour expended on their behalf, and for the prized contributions which constitute such effective help in replacing one of their greatest losses.

To Dr. John Landauer, of Brunswick, and the Committee of eminent German scholars and patrons of letters, who have co-operated in securing valued gifts from distinguished foreign authors, from publishers, and other liberal sympathisers, the authorities of the University record their hearty thanks; with the assurance of their high estimation of the services thus rendered to them.

To all the many liberal donors, Foreign and Colonial Governments, Learned Societies, Authors, Publishers, and private Benefactors: the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, and President of the University, the Senate, University Council, and Faculties, unite in the presentation of grateful acknowledgments for practical manifestations of liberal sympathy; which, with the additions since made by purchase, will enable them to enter on the occupation of their new library—as they confidently hope, at the beginning of the new Academic year

in October next,—with a collection of between forty and fifty thousand volumes.

Without attempting to discriminate among the many benefactors, whose names and gifts are enumerated below, it will not be unacceptable to the friends of the University to be presented with a brief résumé indicative of the wide and varied character of the sympathy awakened on behalf of the University of Toronto, when the knowledge of its losses became known; and foremost in the record of prized donations must be ranked the costly and beautifully bound works, the gift of Her Majesty the Queen, which it is to be fondly hoped will survive to be the pride of many generations of graduates, perpetuating the loved and revered name of Victoria on our roll of benefactors.*

Gifts, including works from their own pens, as well as other valuable additions to the

* As this acknowledgment of the generous liberality of many benefactors is passing through the press, the announcement has been received of a valuable gift, about to be forwarded to the University Library, comprising nearly five hundred volumes, which have been selected under the orders of His Majesty, the German Emperor, from the duplicates of the Libraries of Berlin, Breslau, Königsberg, Bonn, Göttingen, Greifswalde, Halle, Münster, Braunsberg and Erfurt. The gratifying announcement also reaches us that their Majesties the Kings of Saxony and Württemberg have been pleased to grant donations to the Library.

library, have been received from His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Prince of Monaco, the late Duke of Devonshire, the Duke of Argyle, the Marquis of Ripon, the Marquis of Lorne, the Earl of Rosebery, the Earl of Selborne, the Dowager Lady Vernon, and other noble donors. The names of Universities, Academies, and learned Societies of Europe, Asia, and America, the contributors of valuable gifts of their transactions, proceedings, and other publications, are recorded with grateful pride in our list of benefactors. Among those, the costly liberality of Oxford comprises a selection of choice volumes to the value of £500 sterling, from the publications of the Clarendon press, every one of them a welcome contribution to our shelves. Cambridge sends its gift of like character, including the entire publications of the Pitt press. From the Universities of Edinburgh and Aberdeen and from Trinity College, Dublin; from the Universities of Christiania, Copenhagen, Marburg, Strassburg, and Upsala; from Harvard, Columbia College, Princeton, Cornell, Michigan, Amherst, Johns Hopkins, Kansas, and other American universities; from the University of Melbourne, and from our own Canadian Universities and Colleges, as well as personally

from members of their Faculties, many valued contributions are gratefully acknowledged.

Not only to the British Government, but to the Governments of France, Germany, Sweden, Spain, Italy, Switzerland, and the United States, we have to render no less grateful thanks for aid in restoring to the University the indispensable appliances of a well-furnished library.

From his Excellency the Governor-General of India, personally, as well as from the Secretary of State for India; from Australia; from the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales; and from the Asiatic Society of Tokyo, Japan, contributions have reached us, accompanied with greetings of kindly sympathy that give an additional value to such practical manifestations of good will. One of the latest of such welcome greetings comes from Victoria, a sister colony at the Antipodes, stating that the gift is sent as "a mark of sympathy with the University in its recent troubles; of respect for the high courage with which they were met; and in token of a warm desire for closer relations between two great colonies of the British Empire."

To the disinterested liberality of many of the leading publishing houses of England, France, Ger-

many, Italy, and the United States, acknowledgments are no less heartily due for valuable contributions of books.

But one class of acquisitions may, without invidious distinction, be selected for special note, while gratefully returning thanks to all our benefactors. The works presented to us under such circumstances, connecting the authors' names with their gifts, will constitute a feature in the new University Library that cannot fail to possess a peculiar charm for all who enjoy the privilege of their use. They include complete sets of the works of the Poet Laureate, Alfred, Lord Tennyson, and of the late Cardinal Manning; and selections from those of Professor Jowett, Sir William Dawson, Professor J. S. Blackie, Professors Lepsius, Mommsen, Brinton, Dr. Francis Parkman, Professor Piazzini Smith, Sir Lyon Playfair, President G. Stanley Hall, Dr. G. Humphrey, Dr. G. Birkbeck Hill, Mr. James Sime, and others, whose names are set forth in the accompanying record. With those, another class of contributions claims a place. For we must rank with authors' gifts, others received from the representatives of those who still live in their works, and "rule our spirits from their urns;" and foremost

among such are the volumes presented by Mr Robert Barrett Browning, the son of England's great poet so recently laid to rest in Westminster Abbey, and of England's gifted poetess who lies apart under the cypresses in the city of Dante. With such also may fitly be classed the scientific works of the late Professor Clark Maxwell, forwarded for the Library by the Clark Maxwell Memorial Committee; and along with those may no less appropriately rank, as memorials of another eminent man of science, the gift from the Chatsworth Library of valuable scientific serials bearing the autograph impress of the great English Chemist, the Hon. Henry Cavendish.

A few private gifts have an interest of another kind from their associations with former owners: among which may be specially noted some folios of early date from the library of the Historian of "The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire"; and other works from those of Edmund Burke and M. Guizot.

One other gift, of unique historical value, is a contemporary MS. report of the trial of the seven Bishops, with the autograph notes of the Solicitor-General, Sir William Williams, who, with Attorney-General Powis, conducted the prosecution.
