# INSPECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT.

#### To the Toronto Public School Board :

GENTLEMEN,

In accordance with a Resolution of your honorable Board, I respectfully submit the thirtieth Annual Report of the Schools under your charge.

Appended to the Report will be found Statistical Tables which give in detail all important particulars relating to teachers, pupils, attendance, absenteeism, tardiness, studies pursued, cost of maintainance, etc.

#### ATTENDANCE.

The total number of pupils registered during the year was 28,287. Last year it was 25,066.

The average daily attendance was 18,926. Last year it was 16,567.

1094 pupils attended school less than 20 days.

It is very satisfactory to note that the increased attendance is chiefly made up of those who attended School between 150 and 200 days. The number who attended over 150 days last year was 11,730; this year it was 14,179, an increase of 2449.

The Average Monthly Registered Number was 21,218. This shows an increase compared with last year of 1568. See Table A.)

The average of Monthly Average Numbers was 18,924. This shows an increase of 2,344 when compared with the corresponding number of last year. (See Table B).

The average of Monthly Averages was 89.3 per cent of the Average of Monthly Registered Numbers.

The best average for any month in the year was 91, the average for January.

The largest number, 22,503, was registered in October, and the smallest number, 19,961, in February.

#### MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES OF HONOR.

Certificates of Honor and Medals shall be awarded, at the Christmas examination, to such pupils as have not been once

13

absent or late, and whose conduct has been uniformly good. Pupils whose absence has been occasioned by their own sickness, of not more than three weeks' continuance in each session, certified in writing by their parents or guardians; or who have been kept out of school on account of contagious diseases in their families, shall receive certificates. These certificates shall be of two grades, and named, respectively, 1st Honor and 2nd Honor, and the Medals of two kinds — Bronze and Silver.

The 2nd Honor certificates shall be awarded to such pupils as have conformed to the said rules for one year.

The 1st Honor certificates shall be awarded to such pupils as have conformed to the above conditions for two years.

Bronze Medals shall be awarded to such pupils as have conformed to the above conditions for four years.

Silver Medals shall be awarded to such pupils as have conformed to the above conditions for eight years.

I would respectfully repeat the recommendation made last year, that two special classes be opened for more advanced students. one in the eastern and one in the western part of the City. Admission to these classes should be by promotion from the regular Night Schools. If good teachers are placed in such Classes they cannot fail to be of great advantage to those who wish to make progress beyond the work possible in one of the ordinary Night School Classes. In the regular classes the teacher cannot afford to give the necessary special attention to the few advanced students without neglecting the rest of the pupils. I fully endorse the suggestion of Mr. Baird, Chairman of the Night School Committee, that a class should be continued throughout the year for those who are earnestly desirous of prosecuting their studies vigor ously so as to make up for their lack of education. There are a number of young men who began to learn to read and write in our Night Schools after they had reached the age of maturity, and who are making strenuous efforts to improve themselves They cannot do so to the fullest extent without a teacher to guide them in their work They are worthy of the best en couragement the School Board can give them. An earnes sympathetic teacher could be of great advantage to such men The term of the ordinary Night School is too short for such students; and the teacher in a regular class has not time to give them the special teaching they need.

#### TEACHERS.

There were 391 teachers in the employ of the Board at th close of the year.

#### **RESULTS OF COMBINED EXAMINATIONS.**

The Examiners for the year 1889 were Mr. G. B. Sparling, I. A., Mr. W. S. Jackson, W. T. Nattress, M. D., Mr. F. F. Many, M. A. and J. A. Wismer, B. A. and Archibald MacMurchy, I. A., Chairman.
