The Canadian Volunteers.

Lord Dufferin, as true a patriot as ever breathed, whose trans-Atlantic sojourn has only served to kindle his patriotism to a warmer glow than before, perhaps never before performed a more agreeable task than that mentioned in a telegram from Ottawa, which was published recently. He will forward, it is stated, to the Home Government the names of all the Canadian militia corps and officers who have volunteered for active service in the event of Great Britain becoming engaged in war, as a tangible proof of the devotion felt by the Canadians to the mother country. It has been before announced that a movement of this kind had been initiated on the part of the coming danger; the colonial, like the home volunteers, going out of their way to claim a share in the glory and the peril of defending British interests wherever and by whomsoever assailed. This is a remarkable demonstration; and what is more, it represents substantial aid. Canadian volunteers are neither so limited in number nor so imperfectly disciplined as their help could be deemed of little consequence. We have no doubt that if the occasion arose, and if the mere promise of war were succeeded by the terrible reality, a force of thirty thousand men—that is, an entire army corps—might be contributed by the Dominion, comprising some of the finest light infantry in the world. Now, as the most which our War Office could do at an early date would be the creation of the corps, the supplementary contingent from North America would be a really formidable addition to our fighting power.

But the spirit shown is a more important matter than the mere counting of men, for Canada is always increasing in population as well as in loyalty so that what is valuable to England now will be still more so by year.

There is no reason to think that the spirit of our colonies is greatly inferior to that of the North American and, therefore, it comes to this, that while degenerate Englishmen croak over the decadence of their country, and lament the want of soldiers to make the basis of a respectable military power, Great Britain has, in addition to her own population—whose patriotism and nerve must not be judged by the emasculated standard of Peace and pro-Russian Leagues—a good reserve of manhood and buoyant energy available on more than one continent from which to draw as she requires it. To those who may pass by a demonstration such as that from Ottawa as unimportant, it may be worth while to recall the fact that it is only about ten years since the last regiment of British troops was withdrawn from Canada, and the colony was left to defend itself. Many and grievous were the complaints of the abandoned colonists; but the policy which dictated the step, although probably inspired by no higher motive than economy, has been amply vindicated by the event. Not only can the Dominion undertake for itself, but it can claim a share in the defence abroad of the interests of the mighty realm with which it is eager to be identified, and whose glorious traditions it is proud to emulate.—London Telegraph.

A Striking Tragedy.

Providence, R. I., April 5, 1878.

A terrible tragedy occurred this evening at the Opera House, in Pawtucket. On Monday last a variety company, having an engagement at the Pawtucket Opera House, their performance being of an ordinary character, except the feats in rifle shooting by Mrs. Jennie Fowler, whose stage name is Miss Jessie Franklin. She usually began by firing at a target and at various objects, closing that part of her performance by shooting at a member of the company, known as Mlle. Volante, who also appeared as a trapeze performer.

In order to intensify the sensational character of this act, Miss Franklin, instead of taking direct aim at the apple on Mlle. Volante's head, faced in an opposite direction and obtained her range by means of a small mirror placed on the wing. This mirror has to be arranged at such an angle that its face will bring the face of the person supporting the apple directly in the center of the glass. The holder of the rifle places the weapon over her right shoulder, keeping the trigger guard pressed close and steady to her shoulder, and then takes aim through the sights at the reflected image before her. This trick has been repeatedly accomplished with success, but it requires great coolness and steadiness to strike the reflected apple with precision, and has always been deemed a foolhardy and dangerous experiment.

A coming event—the total eclipse of the sun on the 29th of July—has for astronomers an interest even greater than that of the transit of Venus. Not only has been done to take advantage of it. The path of totality of this eclipse runs diagonally across the world, passing through the States of Montana to Texas, and is between 120 and 150 miles wide. Many of the best points for observation are directly in the path of totality, and a dozen expeditions might be equipped and sent to many different points with only a fraction of the outlay often made by European nations in single expeditions for similar purposes. Admiral John Rogers, the superintendent of the naval observatory, speaking to a correspondent of the *Traveller* upon the importance of this matter, said that the sum of all the opportunities which all the astronomers of the world can get of observing such eclipses does not exceed five or six hours in a century. Recent discoveries have rendered it probable that many if not all of the great meteorological changes going on upon the earth are caused by events taking place upon the sun, and many questions relating to the physical constitution of that orb, and the changes there taking place can only be studied during a total eclipse.

A coming event—the total eclipse of the sun on the 29th of July—has for astronomers an interest even greater than that of the transit of Venus. Not only has been done to take advantage of it. The path of totality of this eclipse runs diagonally across the world, passing through the States of Montana to Texas, and is between 120 and 150 miles wide. Many of the best points for observation are directly in the path of totality, and a dozen expeditions might be equipped and sent to many different points with only a fraction of the outlay often made by European nations in single expeditions for similar purposes. Admiral John Rogers, the superintendent of the naval observatory, speaking to a correspondent of the *Traveller* upon the importance of this matter, said that the sum of all the opportunities which all the astronomers of the world can get of observing such eclipses does not exceed five or six hours in a century. Recent discoveries have rendered it probable that many if not all of the great meteorological changes going on upon the earth are caused by events taking place upon the sun, and many questions relating to the physical constitution of that orb, and the changes there taking place can only be studied during a total eclipse.

The Farmer's Corner.

CONCERNING QUEEN BEES.—The introduction of a strange queen into a strange hive where only one already reigns, I do not believe troubles the latter any whatever. I have put in scores and find the result as follows: The first bee which discovers the intruder, seizes it by the leg or wing and holds on, and then comes another and another until she is covered; still the bees crowd on, holding to one another until a solid ball as big as a basket's egg is formed, with the queen in the midst. A vigorous hissing is kept up and so intent are they on their attack that the ball of bees may be taken up in the hand without any fear of stinging. At the Alexandria bee show I witnessed the formation of such a ball, which was handed round to among the spectators from hand to hand. I find the workers rarely sting a strange queen; they will keep her enclosed until she dies or their fury abates, and then release her. I have known one confined in this manner for a fortnight, when she died; it is certain that they must, at least sometimes, feed the prisoner, for a queen will die of starvation in twelve hours.—*London Journal of Horticulture.*

SPRING WHEAT.—The earlier this crop is in the ground the better. Now that the new process of grinding has been brought into use, the value of extra spring is equal to that of the best fall wheat. It is as easy to produce extra wheat as No. 3 or rejected. The whole difference is just that between careful and slovenly farming. Perfectly clean seed, of a pure variety, and well prepared ground, will produce first quality wheat; but with foul seed, mixed with oats and rubbish, as we sow, so we reap. Minnesota farmers are making a world-wide reputation for their wheat, which is now sought in foreign markets, by producing a superior sample. This is worth making a note of.

SHEEP AND LAMBS.—The draft upon the nursing ewes should be met by a supply of nutritious food. The kind of food should be suited for the kind of sheep. Merinos will consume corn without injury, but the heavier bodied sheep will do better on a mixed food. A bushel of corn with the same quantity of oats, or rye or bran, ground together, and mixed with a bushel of linseed oil-meal, is a good feed for nursing ewes. One pound a day, with some cut roots or a few potatoes, will help both ewe and lamb. A run in corn stubble on fine days will be very useful for the whole flock, but not if there is deep snow upon the ground, or the soil is muddy.

CALVES.—A calf should never be allowed to suck, if it is possible, to avoid it. As soon as its coat is dry it should be put in a stall next to her, where she can see it. This is better than separating them altogether, unless the calf can be removed entirely to where the cow cannot hear it. A calf may be taught to drink in one lesson, if patience is used, and it has no suckling cow. It should have the fresh warm milk for a week, then warmed half-skimmed milk for a time, and finally warmed skimmed milk. While the weather is cool, the milk should be warmed and given a little sweet; but boiled linseed-meal gruel is an excellent addition to the milk.

MARES IN FOAL.—Should not be tied up in their stalls; but kept in loose, roomy stalls not less than 9x11 feet. It would be far better if no horses were kept in a stall of less size than this. Some horses will not lie down in a narrow stall until forced by fatigue, and many wounded pigs and backs are caused by contact with the walls of narrow stalls. Brood mares may be worked lightly; they are better for the exercise. A feed of carrots, ruta-bagas, or sugar beets daily, will be useful, or instead of these a quart of linseed oil-meal, given with their usual feed, may be given. Costiveness in any breeding animal is to be carefully guarded against.

SWINE.—A farrowing sow should be littered with chaff or finely cut straw in a dry warm pen. It would pay many brood sows are kept and early pigs raised, to have a store in the piggery. Highly bred pigs are often tender and delicate, and warmth may save a litter that would otherwise be wholly lost. Generally a close warm pen will be sufficient for a few young animals; are better able to take care of themselves than pigs.

VERMIN.—It is now that vermin give most trouble. Whenever "cow-licks" are seen upon cattle, lice may be found. A good remedy consists of an ointment made on a pound each of lard and crude petroleum mixed together with a quarter of a pound of flowers of sulphur. This rubbed along the spine and the inside of the thighs of calves or cattle, will soon free them from lice. It will also free hogs and poultry from fleas, and is not injurious in any way. Bare irritable spots upon the tails or necks of horses may be also treated with this.

POULTRY.—It is now time to set hens for early chickens. Warm corners in the stables or barns may be appropriated for this purpose where the other poultry are not permitted to go. The nest box may be carried there quietly at night, and the hen left undisturbed. The advantage of having loose nest boxes is, that the box and its occupant may be moved to wherever it is to remain.

Cows.—The safest place for an incoming cow is a roomy box stall.

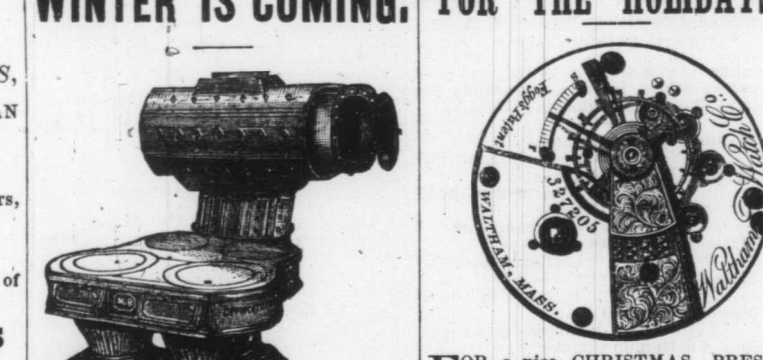
