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MUSE GO INTO EXILES

THE FRENCH SENATE ADOPTS THE EXPULSION BILL BY 161 TO 107.

Paris, June 22.—In the debate on the Expulsion Bill in the Senate today, Premier Freyinet said his government would not tolerate another government in France, and would take the full responsibility for the expulsion of the prisoner. He refused the charge that the government was yielding to the irascible whims of the Emperor. He declared that order was being maintained throughout France, even at Dusseldorf, where recurrence of the recent disturbances had been prevented. This was not the case in Belgium or in Great Britain. In conclusion, he expressed the common law would not apply to the prisoner and urged the necessity of legislation.

MINISTERS IN COUNCIL.

ANNUAL MEETING OF TORONTO DIOCESAN SYNOD.

The Bishop's Address—Benefit in the Home Mission Fund—Kvangelists to be Appointed—Reports of Committees.

The Synod of the Diocese of Toronto opened for transaction business at 11:30 yesterday in St. James' Cathedral school house, Bishop Sweatman presided and delivered an address, in which he gave the following statistics: The total clerical strength of the diocese was 147. The additions during the year numbered eighteen, eleven by ordination, and seven received from other dioceses. Thirteen were ordained deacons, and three to the priesthood. There were received into the church by confirmation 711 males and 1197 females. The total amounts received from the diocese for the Home Mission Fund was a little over \$1300. There must be either ignorance or absolute indifference to the claims of the Lord to produce such small results. There had been no response as yet to the appeals made for funds for the erection of the Cathedral of St. Alban the Martyr.
