

the tug, as they strove to get-at the dead monster. Those who were wounded were attacked by others of their own kind, and the scene of strife was well-nigh appalling. At length the tiger sharks were driven off, or were so distracted by the fight among themselves as to abandon pursuit of the tug. But the attack, while it lasted, caused no little anxiety, because it was deemed of great importance to reserve the skin and skeleton of the rhinodonwhich, in fact, was the object sought in transporting it to Key West. On it arrival there it was lifted out

of the water, machinery being available for the purpose, and was carefully measured. It was forty-five feet long, with a girth of forty-five feet, and a tail span of twelve feet; it weighed 30,009 pounds.

Under supervision of the experts, its hide was removed and salted, to preserve it and the flesh was removed. from the bones, in order that the skeleton might be put together later and mounted for exhibition at . the Museum of Natural History in New York.

To Shoot Grouse. LONDON .-- Grouse shooting sgain has-resumed the preminence as a social function that it held before the war. During the conflict the men who could shoot were far too busy at much grimmer business, for the most part, to find time for shooting birds. But this year shooting is more popular than ever before. On the opening day of the season the rush for the Scotch moors was so great that 30 trains, fully laden, left London for the land of the heather. And it was not a cheap crowd that filled them. Grouse shooting is the most expensive sport to be had in the United Kingdom. Unless a man be fairly well endowed with this world's goods, he cannot hope to do much shooting on the moors. A popular host who rents one of the best stocked grouse moors in Scotland, and likes his guests to have a good time regardless of expense, estimates that every grouse brought down by his party costs him five dollars. It would be far cheaper to buy the birds in the open market. Grouse shooting has gone up since the war. It costs at least double what it did in those far off days. And yet there are some Englishmen who maintain that it is not true sport at . all, any more than was pigeon shooting. But to-day no man who values his reputation as a sportsman would onsage in pigeon shooting. It is predicted that the day soon will come when grouse shooting will be regarded as unsportsmanlike. And for much the same reason as applied to pigeon shooting. It does not give the bird a fair chance. It makes the silling of them easy. 


