THE SILK MARKET OF FRANCE.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—The department of state has received a report from United States Consul Newark, at Lyons, France, in regard to the operation of a syndicate of Italian bankers formed to secure control of the raw silk market of Europe. He gives figures showing the apparent effect produced on the silk business at Lyons, during the two weeks the syndicate has been in operation. It is shown that the stocks of raw silks in the general warehouses at Lyons, Milan and London are much smaller than usual. The syndicate also has a report in regard to the trade of Lyons consular district with the United States, from which it appears there was a decrease of \$2,100,000 for this export during the first two months of 1885.
