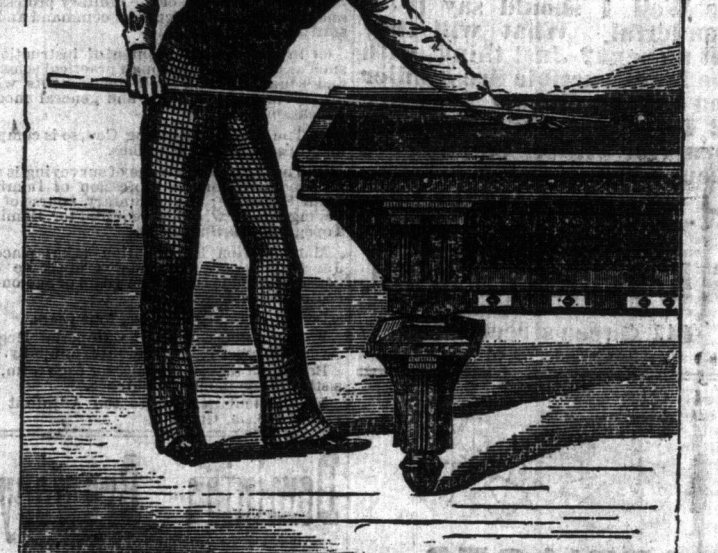

To provide for the issue of "General Consolidated Loan 4 per cent. Debentures" to the amount of \$355,000, for certain permanent improvements and otherwise increasing the efficiency of the Toronto Waterworks.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign, and chapter twenty-five, entitled "An Act respecting the Debenture Debt and certain property of the City of Toronto," it is amongst other things enacted that the Corporation of the City of Toronto may pass a By-law or By-laws for authorizing the issue of Debentures in the whole sum of \$3,000,000, to redeem certain outstanding debentures therein specified and also to provide for the permanent improvements therein also specified, and also any balance or residue thereof not required for the purposes aforesaid, may be applied or expended in improvements of like nature, the whole issue being nevertheless limited to the said sum of \$3,000,000.

And whereas, the limitation of the issue of debentures to the said sum of \$3,000,000 was based on the assessment of the City not exceeding at the time of passing of the said Act the sum of \$600,000, and it was further enacted that an increase of the debt by a further issue of debentures might be made when the amount of the said sum of \$600,000, said sum, said increase being nevertheless limited to eight per centum of such excess:

And whereas, the amount of the whole rateable property in the City of Toronto, irrespective of any future increase of the same, and also irrespective of any income in the nature of toll, interest or dividends from the work, or from any stock, share or interest in the work, upon which the money to be so raised, or any part thereof, may be devoted, and also irrespective of any income to be derived from the temporary investment of the sinking fund hereinafter mentioned, or any other source, is now estimated to be \$1,000,000, and whereas, the said sum of \$600,000, assessed for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, is \$602,000, less than the principal of interest is in arrears:

And whereas, it is expedient and necessary to raise by loan on the credit of the said City a sum of money for the purpose of effecting certain permanent improvements and otherwise increasing the efficiency of the Toronto Waterworks in the said City, together with interest thereon at the rate of four per cent. per annum, and whereas, the estimated cost of the said improvements is \$355,000, made up as follows:

For a three-foot pipe from the Engine House to Gibraltar Point, and a five-foot pipe, iron or steel, "as may be found best, from Gibraltar Point to connect with the six-foot conduit pipe, including trench, new well, with the old well, and a three-foot pipe, at a cost of... \$280,000
For a 10,000-gallon engine at the Engine House, with foundation, foundations, etc., complete, at a cost of... 75,000
Making a total as above of... \$355,000
And whereas, it will require the sum of \$11,200 to be raised annually for a period of forty years, the currency of the debentures to be issued under and by virtue of this By-law to pay the interest of the said debt, and the sum of \$2,662.50 to be raised annually during the same period for the forming of a sinking fund of three-fourths of one per centum per annum for the payment of the debt created by this By-law, according to the provisions of the above recited Act, making in all the sum of \$13,862.50 to be raised annually as aforesaid; and whereas, \$13,862.50 shall be such such amount as is raised annually as aforesaid, and levied in each year during the said period of forty years by a special rate sufficient therefor on all the rateable property in the Municipality of the City of Toronto;

Therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto enacts as follows:
