FIRST NIGHT CARS SMASHED BY MOB UNPARALLELED DISORDER IN HAMILTON STREETS DRAGOONS HURRIED TO SCENE OF RIOT

Windows of Stanley Mills Stores Wrecked By Strike Sympathizers and Radial Office and Non-Union Boarding House Attacked—Police Unable to Control Crowd.

**HOPE OF SETTLEMENT
 FADES; MEDIATORS FAIL**

Hamilton, Nov. 23.—(Special).—The street cars were run after nightfall for the first time to-night amidst scenes of disorder unparalleled in the history of this city.

Three cars only were operated, and they were chased into the barns at 8.45 with every window broken. The riot was so bad that a call was sent in for the militia.

In addition to wrecking the cars, the mob broke the plate glass window in the company's office at the corner of Gore and James-streets, smashed the big plate glass windows of the Stanley Mills store, and riddled the windows at a house on Hunter-street, which was supposed to shelter the strikebreakers.

The trouble started about 7.30. Three cars were run from the Stuart-street station to the corner of King-street and Sanford-avenue. Each was packed with strikebreakers and detectives. Just as soon as it began to grow dark the stone-throwing commenced. James-street, from King to Gore, was packed with a big mob, but the most destructive gang was stationed at the corner of Rebecca-street. Every time a car passed they hurled stones thru the windows, until there was not a particle of glass left in the cars, and the James-street pavement was covered with broken glass.

The special hearing the militia arrived at the Stuart-street station at 12.30. Every time a police officer tried to make an arrest, he was beaten and the prisoner taken away from him. Shortly after 8 o'clock Detectives Campbell and Coulter, who were stationed in the mob in front of the Osborne Hotel, caught two men reading the car and threw stones at a car. Before they knew what they were doing the prisoners were liberated. Coulter was struck behind the ear and underwent a severe laceration. It did not take the crowd long to get out of his way after that.

A MOB OF UNION SYMPATHIZERS DYNAMITE STREET CAR BARNS

Hamilton, Nov. 24, 3 a. m.—(Special).—A mob of strike sympathizers dynamited the east end car barns at the corner of Sanford-avenue and King-street, at 2 o'clock this morning. A portion of the building was wrecked.

QUICK WORK
 It was 9.45 p. m. when Col. Septimus Denison, who is in command, received a brief telegram at his residence, on Spadina-avenue, from Hamilton, asking that the troops, which have been under orders for two weeks to be ready for a summons call, be despatched. At 10 minutes past 10 the detachment, consisting of 100 infantry and artillerymen, with the horses of the latter, were entrained at Strachan-avenue, and on their way. Col. Denison accompanied them.

ATTACK ON STANLEY MILLS' STORES.
 The attack on the Stanley Mills stores was doubtless provoked by the belief that the company was unkindly to the union. There have been rumors that this store would suffer when the mob broke loose. It is said the company sent supplies to the Street Railway barns, where the strike-breakers were quartered. It was also said two clerks were dismissed for wearing "We Walk" badges. This angered union sympathizers, and a boycott was secretly ordered.

Senior S.P.S. Beat Senior Arts and Play Junior School Next Week—Varsity v McGill.

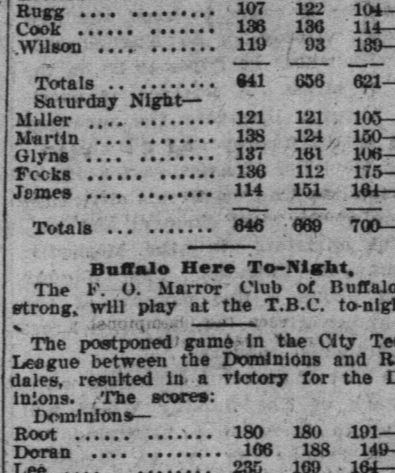

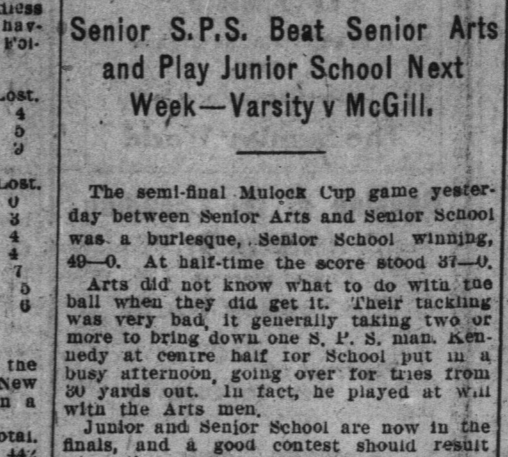

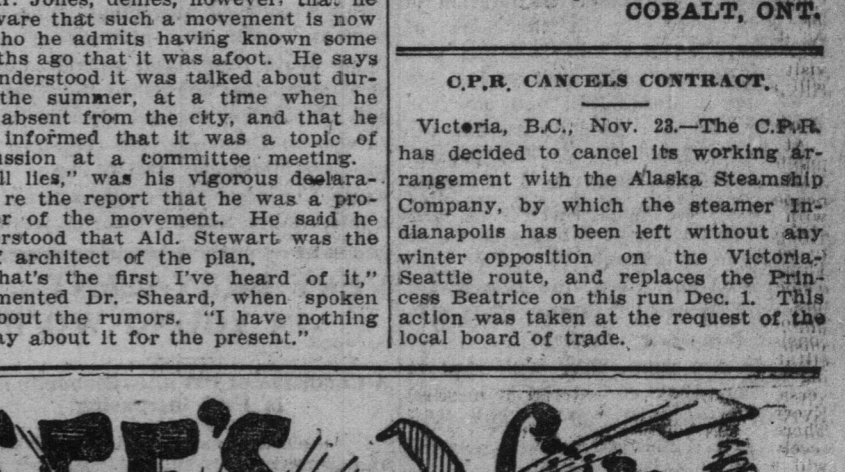

CONTROLLERS TALK POWER FORWARD BYLAW TO COUNCIL

Controller Jones Would Also Have City Build Its Own Transmission Lines.

At Monday's meeting of the city council, the electric power bylaw will be submitted, since the board of control did the needful yesterday in agreeing to send the bylaw forward.

Mayor Coatsworth objected that to do this would be to run counter to the plans of other municipalities. It had been agreed at the power conference that after submitting the bylaw a further meeting should be held to arrange for the cancelling of each municipality for contracts after which the people should be asked to vote again.

The question was raised by Controller Jones whether the understanding at the power conference was not that Toronto Junction's request for 5000 horsepower was not included in the 15,000 horsepower to be asked for by Toronto.

The wreck of the Resolute has emphasized the necessity of the establishment of a life-saving station at Toronto and the deepening of both channels to the harbor.

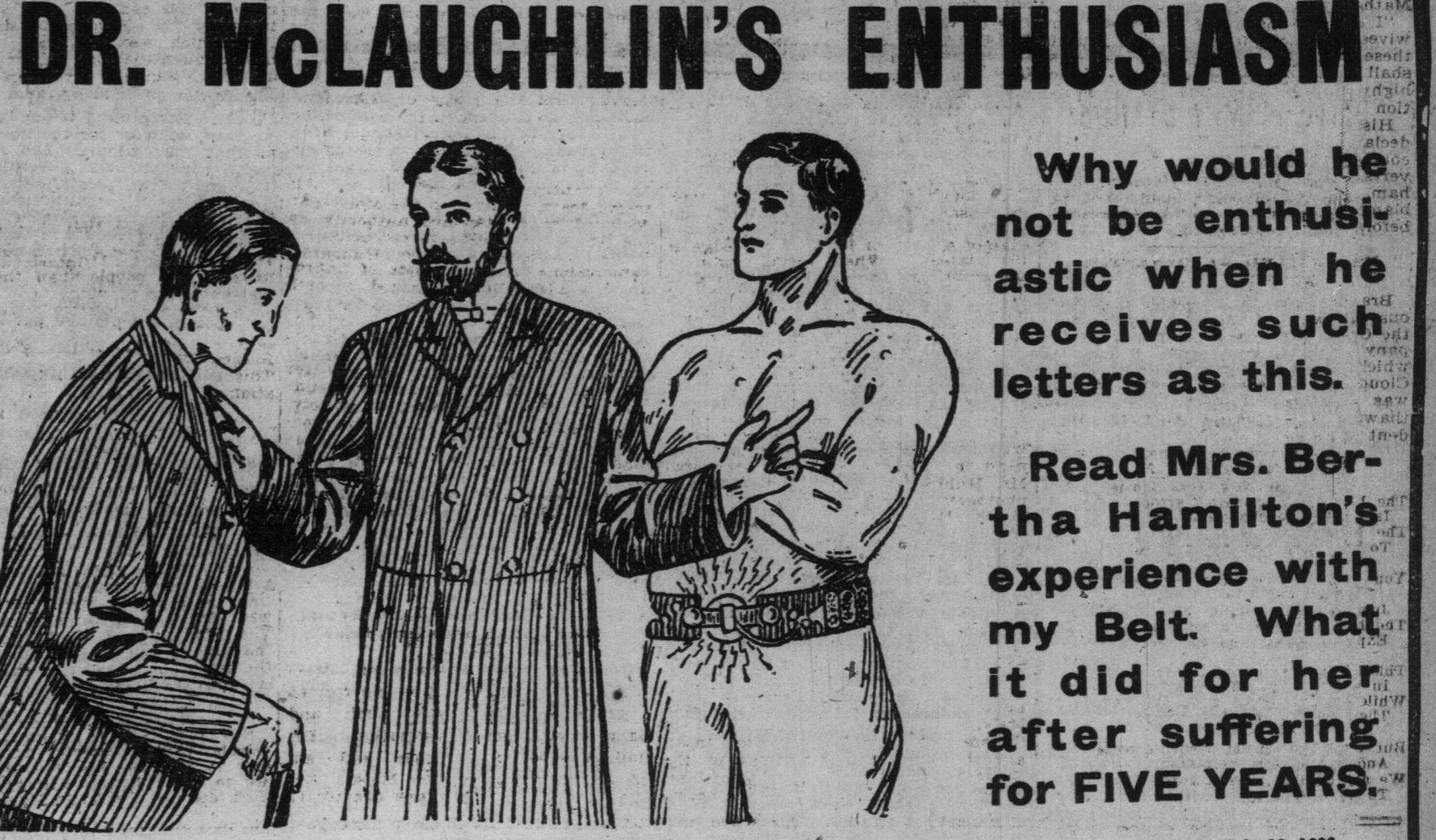
I. G. Sing, government engineer in charge of public works in Eastern Ontario, stated yesterday that to deepen the present channel at the western end of the harbor was impossible, owing to the expense involved.

"It would be well worth the while to spend \$300,000 or \$400,000 in opening a new channel and building piers through the western sandbar in a location some distance south of the existing gap," said Mr. Sing.

She broke open the door and got two children out, badly burned, and extinguished the flames after calling an ambulance. The boy died on his way to the hospital, and the girl lived for some hours.
