

HIGH FEELING AGAINST BOERS WHO SERVED AS BRITISH SCOUTS

Settlement of Annexed Territory Bristles With Difficulties, and Attempts to Place Those Who Surrendered Early in Places

of Authority May Lead to Renewed Hostilities.

Pretoria, Transvaal, July 15.—The settlement of the annexed territories is not being accomplished without considerable friction. This is especially noticeable in the bitter hatred and persecution on the part of the Boers who stayed in the country, against the war against the Boers who served the British scouts. It is said that some of these national scouts have been shot. So intense is the feeling among many of the burghers who fought in the war, that distinction is made between those who surrendered and those who were taken prisoner.

Many of the burghers declare they were induced to surrender by the false representations of their officers, while painted the terms too grossly. Discordant elements are numerous, and any attempt to place the burghers who surrendered during the war in authority over those who fought through out the war will conceivably lead to renewed hostilities. The majority of the Boers have apparently in no way abandoned their nationality, and some of them preach the advisability of opening Dutch schools so as to keep alive their language and customs.

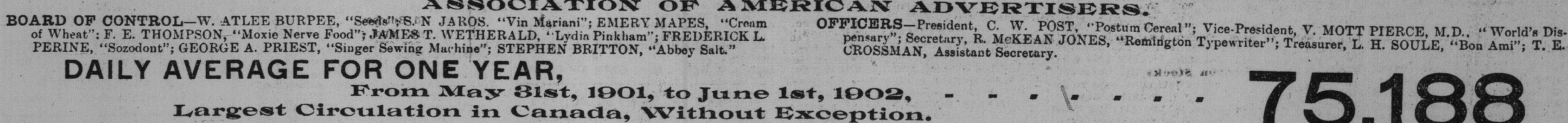
