RUSSIAN ARMY IS WITHOUT US TO CORE

This is Opinion of Russian Authorities Who are Treating Outbreaks Among Troops With Unwanted Tenderness

ST. PETERSBURG, June 21, 11.50 a.m.—A mutiny, which for a time threatened to place the fortress of Sevastopol in possession of the mutineers, was suppressed yesterday, according to a special despatch to the Novo Vremya.

It appears to be confirmed that the 2nd shuff regiment at Ryazan has driven out its officers, and turned the army. Another report says the soldiers deliberately shot the officers of the Viborg regiment stationed in St. Petersburg, and a panic prevails in the town.

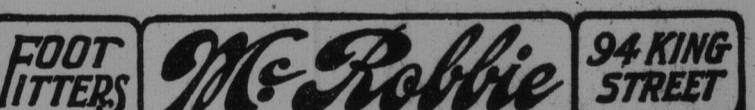

LIBERALS HOLD CHURCH UNION IS SERIOUS QUESTION IN ENGLAND NOW

But Conservatives Gained Four Seats in Provincial Elections. Sensational Sermon on the Subject by the Famous Canon Henson--Archbishop of York Believes in a Divine Intention of Organic Unity.

(Mail and Empire). Church union, or church toleration, even seems much more serious in England than in Canada, though viewed farther off. The question, nevertheless, has been there discussed with an earnestness hardly to be found in the somewhat academic debates on the subject in this country.

It remained for the famous Canon Henson to do the real plain speaking of the occasion, and we can well understand the sensation his remarks have caused. He chose the ominous text, "Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine eye," and began by referring to the Education Bill. It was matter of fact, he said, that the government presupposes the reasonableness and the utility of a combination among Christian folk for the purpose of teaching children the simple and the essential of the Christian faith.

He declared the dissonance that has been referred to, several of the chief dignitaries of the Church of England and the different Nonconformist bodies published a joint letter asking that at Whitgifted House there should be an organic unity of church union. The request was generally respected, and several important pulpits utterances were the result. A copy of the London Times contains reports of the remarks of the Archbishop of York, the Bishop of Stepney, Canon Henson and the Rev. Dean of Exeter.
