New York, Dec. 10—The London correspondent of the Herald cables: A neutral who has just returned after a trip to Germany and Austria-Hun-gary, brings the news that despite the fact that the business men and breadwin-ners, including women, of the Central Empires, who have engaged in peace riots, have been ruthlessly bayonetted and some shot down by troops, the revolt against the war is assuming alarming proportitions. He declares that Herr Scheidemann, a Socialist deputy, in a speech demand-ing speedy peace, volced the heartfielt desires of nine-tenths of the populations of the two empires, while Dr. Von Bethmann-Hollweg represents only junkers who have waxed fat and powerful, fattening on the producers of Germany.
