



PUBLIC WHARF. NEWGASTLE places in our salmon rivers about the time the fry are coming out in which to deposit the ripened eggs. At that time of the year there is a minimum of risk that the eggs or fry will be found or devoured by trout, and if placed on the natural hatching-ground and there brought out the fry start into life with all the chances in their favor. If the eggs are hatched in the artificial runs and the fry kept until they absorb the sac before being liberated they are exposed to two great dangers. 




