Paris, April 20—Hard fighting continues between the French and the Germans all along the southern front in France. The French war office, in its latest communication, issued this afternoon, records further progress for the forces of General Nivelle north of the Alsne, in Champagne, and in the Argonne Forest. More than 19,000 Germans have been made prisoner, and guns in excess of 100 have been captured by the French since the offensive began last Monday.

The war office communication says:

"Between St Quentin and the Oise there has been great activity by both artilleries, particularly in the region to the north of Grugles.

In the practical application of this theory we have to consider several traits at the same time, some of which may blend and some of which may neutralize each other, and the results of a union depend upon what good or bad traits are dominant and what are recessive.

The theory of Weissman bears upon the makeup of the parent germ cells. He maintains that the germ plasm which the parental ovum contains is not used up in the formation of the offspring, but is reserved for the formation of the germ cells of the following generation unchanged. Characters will appear in the offspring reminiscent of both parents but some may be latent and not appear until later generations. The application of these theories to the human race has cleared many of the mysteries surrounding heredity and has seemed to place our knowledge of the subject upon a firm scientific foundation.

Prof. Adami has divided conditions truly inherited into four classes—specific, racial, familiar and individual. Specific inheritance is shown by the law that features longest possessed by a given stock are the ones most toppressed upon that stock, and the fast easily lost. A large peculiarly shaped nose may be a characteristic of a certain family and reappear for generations. Racial inheritance is seen in the similarity of physical, mental and moral makeup of all the people of different races.—English, Germans, and Jewish: for example showing their typical racial characteristics.





How Uncle Sam Will Recruit His Army

Raising armies is more difficult, as well as more important, than raising flags, and one of the chief difficulties in the United States is the feeling against conscription.

"There is enough patriotism in this country to get a volunteer army, and until that is demonstrated untrue we should not resort to conscription," declares Senator Thomas of Colorado, while Senators Stone of Missouri, and Gallinger of New Hampshire are among those who think the recruiting problem can be best solved by increasing the soldiers' pay. Among Southern congressmen also, we find opposition to universal service on the ground that it would be inadvisable to give thousands of negroes training in the use of arms. Samuel Gompers is also reported to be against conscription.

On the other hand, a recent canvass of 476 newspapers by the National Security League re-270 of them in favor of universal military training, 49 opposed to it, and 157 non-committal.

The Milwaukee Sentinel may be said to reflect the consensus of argument in favor of obligatory military training: "Under the voluntary system in time of war, the serviceable manhood of the nation is divided into two parts. There are the patriotic young men who volunteer to go to the front and, if need be, die in order that the nation may live; and there are the slackers who are willing to sacrifice the other fellows on the altah of patriotism. That is not a democratic arrangement. A Democracy which offers equality of opportunity, has a right to exact in return equality of service."






