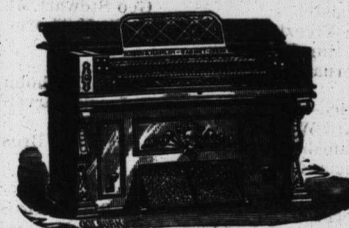

Circuit Court. The Jury in the case of Golding & Vaughan vs Allen and Allen, after an absence of three hours yesterday, returned and informed the Court that they could not agree upon a verdict.

Ans. - "It was." 2nd. - "Was the agreement made that the notes were not to be given until the satisfaction of the parties purchasing the vessel?"

Ans. - "It was." 3rd. - "Was it agreed that they (the defendants) were not to give their notes until the claim of Dunn & Co. was settled to the satisfaction of the parties purchasing the vessel?"

Ans. - "It was." 4th. - "Was it reasonable satisfaction that Millidge offered to indemnify them against all claims against the vessel Silas Alward, so as to entitle him to the notes upon giving such indemnity?"

Ans. - "No." 5th. - "Was the agreement on which the vessel was purchased upon condition that all claims against the vessel were to be satisfied by Millidge before they gave him their notes?"

Ans. - "It was." This is a verdict on every count for the defendants and is an important decision, as there are six lawsuits depending on this, there being five other business men who purchased shares in the Silas Alward on the same terms as Mr. Leonard. The suit against Mr. Leonard was a test case, which decides all. H. C. MacMonagle, Esq., is Attorney in all of these cases.

The next case was P. T. C. Durpee vs. John and Stephen Gladue - a case of disputed account and endorsement of notes. Messrs. Harris & Burbridge appear for the plaintiff, and Wm. Pugsley, Esq., Attorney, and A. L. Palmer, Esq., Counsel, for the defendants. The evidence for the plaintiff was not finished when the Court adjourned at 1 o'clock.

City Police Court. Six prisoners were in the dock this morning, and it took just five minutes to arrange with them. Peter Donovan could not tell how often he had been before His Honor, but it was quite often. He was arrested drunk in Prince Wm. street, but promised to go and take the pledge for two years if let go. He had done him no good, so he was sent away to take the pledge.
