HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Use charcoal to broil with.

If the cover is removed from soap

dishes the soap will not get soft.

Salt fish of any kind is quickest

and best freshened soaked in sour

milk.

Scatter sassafras bark among

dried fruit to keep it from becoming

wormy.

When fatrons become rusty, black

them with stove-polish, and rub well

with a dry brush.

Clothespins boiled a few minutes

and quickly dried once or twice a

month become more durable.

To prevent the smell of paint put

a handful of oil in a bucket of water

and let it stand over night.

Silverware can be kept bright for

months by being placed in an airtight

case with a good-sized piece of

camphor.

A little salt-petre or a carbonate of

soda mixed with the water in which

flowers are placed will keep them

fresh for two weeks.

A good rule for the use of the

different kinds of flour is to use pas-

try flour whenever baking flour is

used and bread flour with yeast.

Never throw away cold potatoes

as there are so many delicious ways

in which they may be warmed over

and made into new dishes.
