A Cabinet Council to-day decided to send six battalions of infantry, two regiments of cavairy, two batteries of artillery, one company of engineers, three companies of army service corps, and a company of the army hospital corps to reinforce Lord Chelmsford in South Africa.

The following communication has been received from Lord Chelmsford:

"I regret to have to report a very disastrous engagement on the 22nd of January between the Zulus and a portion of number—three column, which was left to guard the camp about ten miles in front of Roeke's drift. The Zulus came down in overwhelming numbers, and in spite of gallant resistance by five companies of the First Battalion of the 24th, Regiment, one company of Second Battalion of the 24th, two guns, two rocket tubes, 164 mounted men and about 800 natives, they overwhelmed them. The camp containing all surplus ammunition and transport No. 3 Column was taken and but few of its defenders escaped.
