C A P. LII.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, an Act made in the Forty-sixth Year of His late Majesty, for permitting the Importation of Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, and Timber fit for Naval Purposes, from the *British Colonies in North America.* [15th July 1820.]

WHEREAS the Law herein-after mentioned has by Experience been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That an Act made in the Forty-sixth Year of His late Majesty King *George* the Third, intituled *An Act to permit, until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Importation of Masts, Yards, and Bowsprits, or of Timber fit for Naval Purposes, from the British Colonies in North America, Duty-free,* which said Act was by several subsequent Acts continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and twenty, shall
