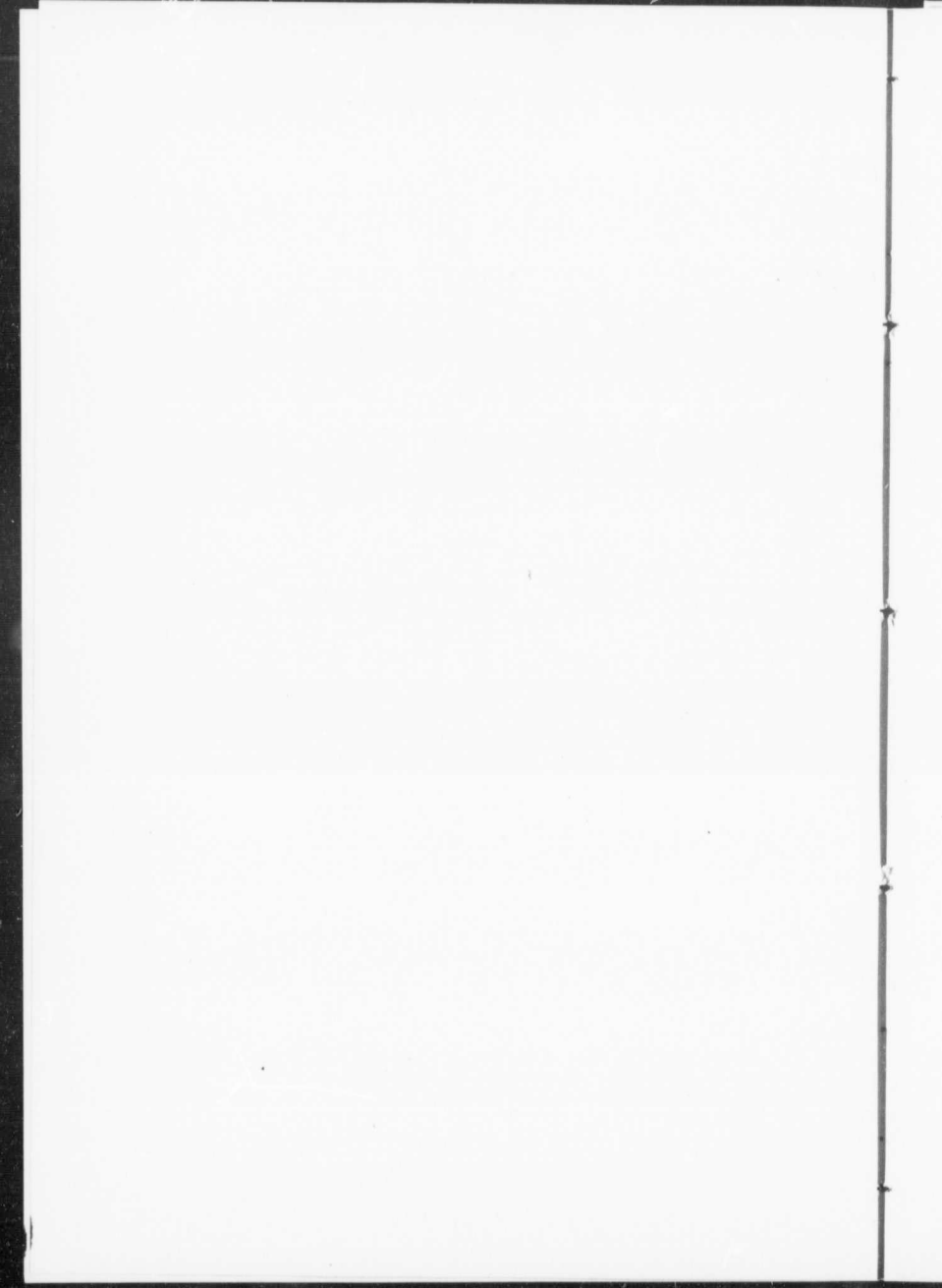
"**The Messenger of Love**," ideal statue, executed in marble for T. J. Gibb.

Equestrian group, "**Herne the Hunter**," bronze.

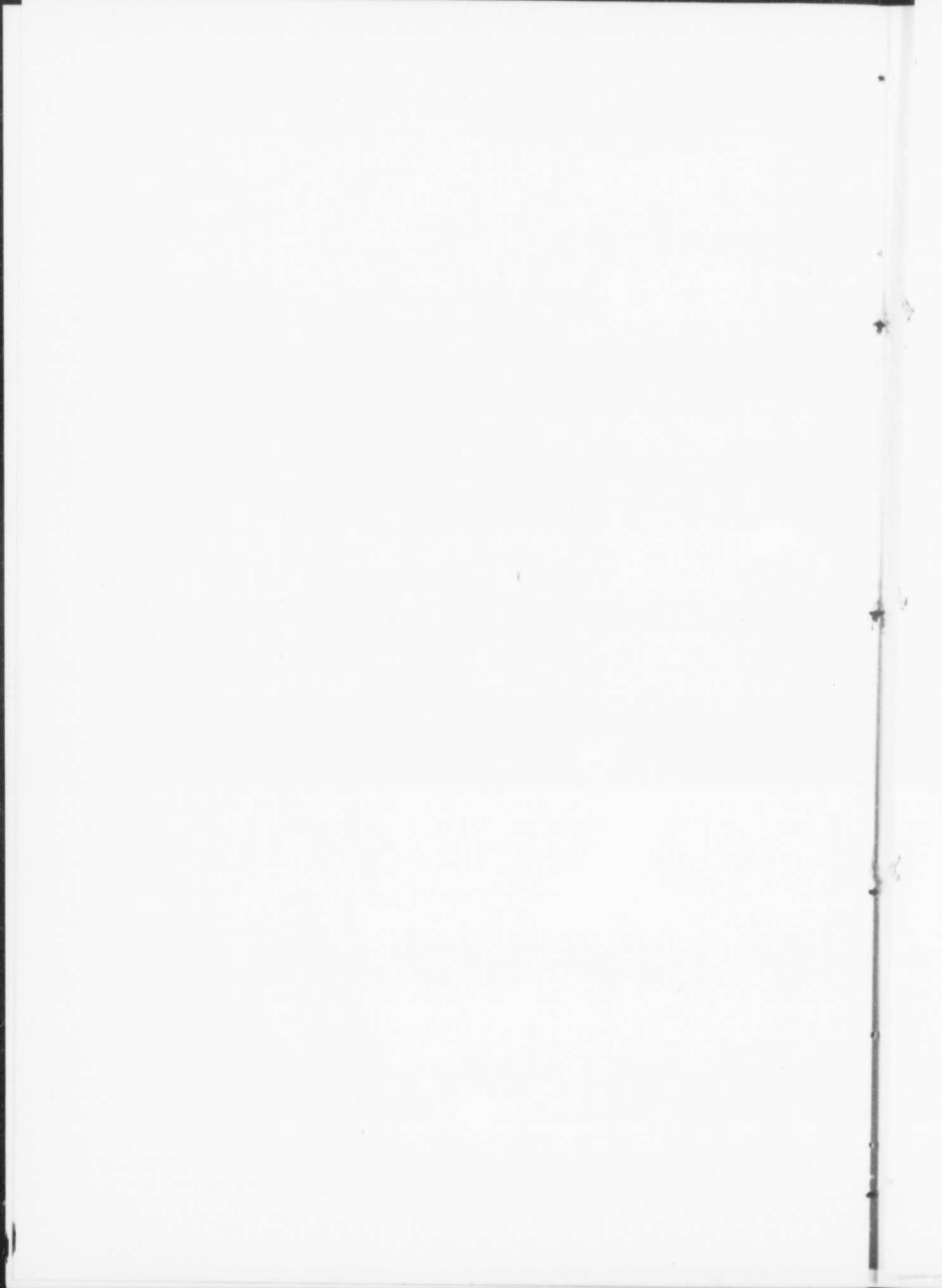

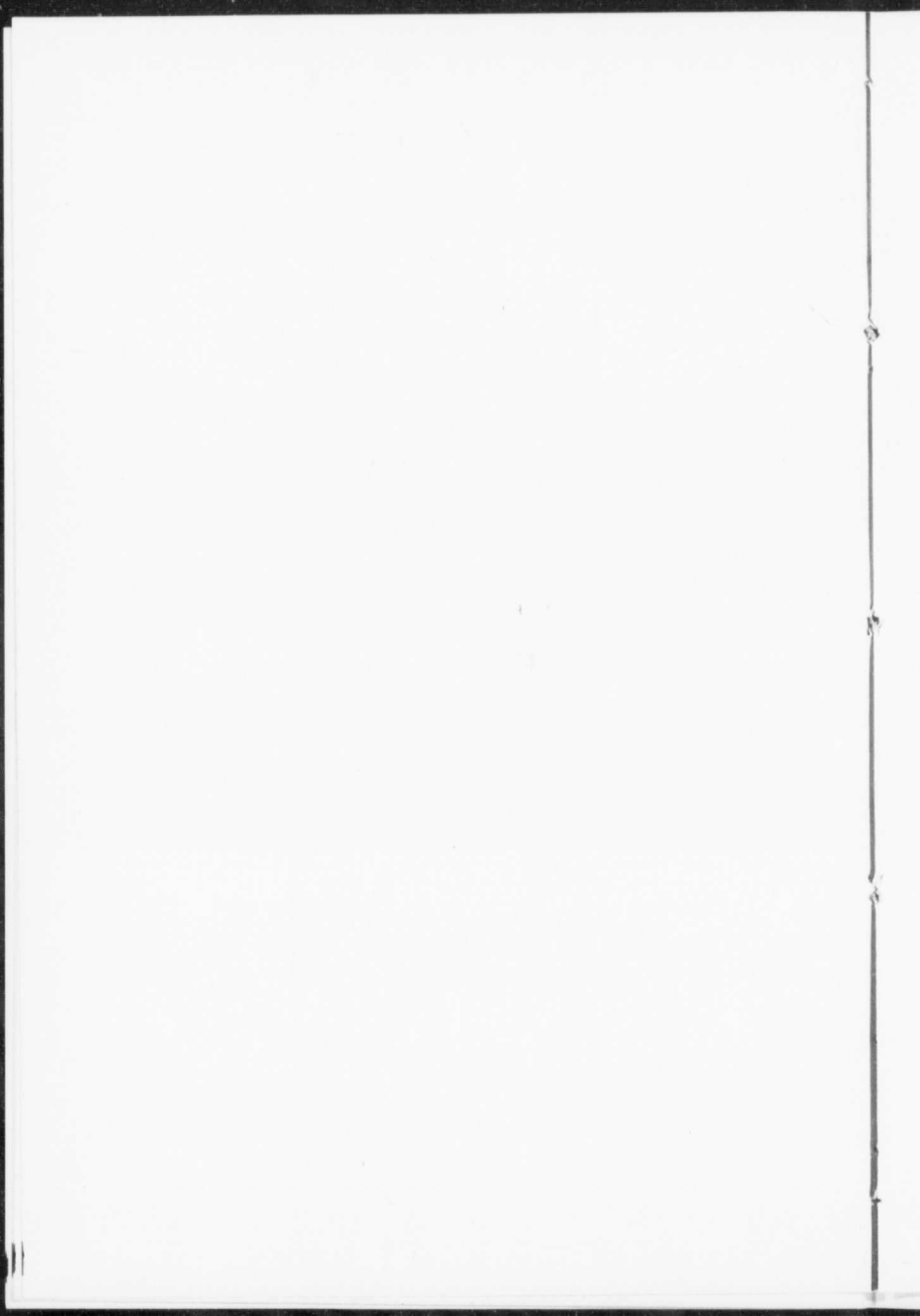

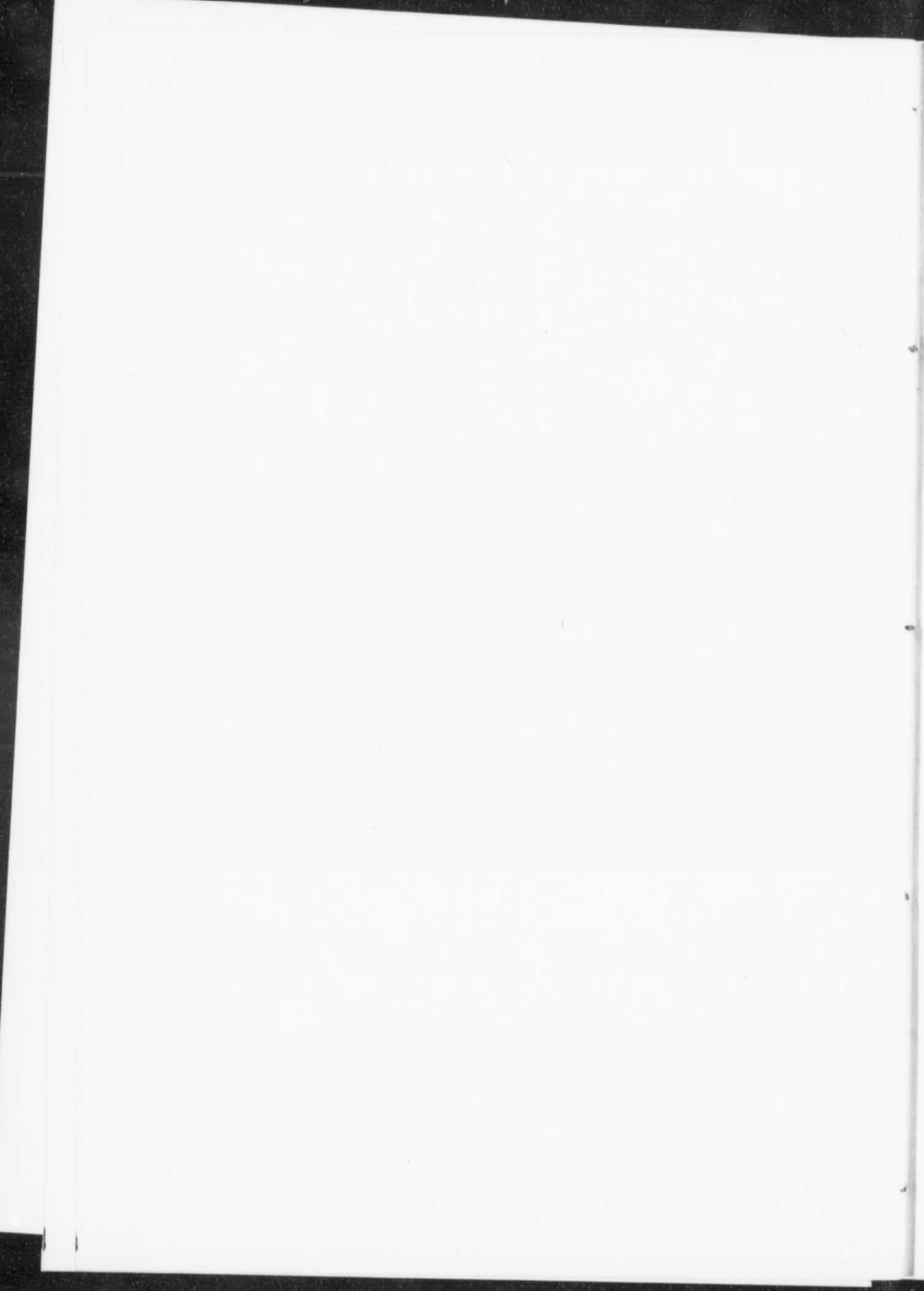
