THE HOMESTAKE was the second location made in the Rossland mining district and is one of the best-known properties in the camp. It is highly spoken of by all authorities who have written on the present and prospective value of Rossland Mines.

It is situated on the now famous South Belt, in the neighborhood of a number of celebrated properties, many of which are producers, such as the Crown Point, R. E. Lee, Mayflower and others.

Development.

Upon the development of this property there has already been expended some \$30,000.00, with the following results :

The ledge which is largely continuous and well defined, has been opened at eleven different places, and ore found everywhere for a distance of 1,300 feet. This vein runs through the centre of the claim at an average width of 5 feet. The principal workings consist of a 110 foot tunnel, a shaft called No. 1 shaft, 55 feet deep ; a drift from this shaft of 108 feet long; and another shaft, called No. 2 shaft, 87 feet deep. The drift which was run out from No. 1 shaft struck the ore 13 feet away and continued in ore for the remainder of its length.

The ore on the surface and down to a depth of 65 feet carried a

good deal of silver. Below the 65 foot level the silver disappeared and the gold values increased. No. 2 shaft is in ore all the way down, and is sunk on the hanging wall. No crosscut was made, and the full extent of the ore body is not known, but is certainly the full width of the shaft, which is four and a half feet. The average value of the ore, as ascertained by many careful tests, is \$18.20 per ton. It has become richer as the depth increased, and it is confidently expected that the quality will, with further development, be as high as that of leading properties in the camp.

There is a large quantity of ore on the HOMESTAKE dump, and from this and the new ore obtained in developing the property the mine is expected to make shipments from the beginning.

Transportation.

The excellent facilities for shipping have been commented on by all those who are familiar with the camp, and can readily be seen from the picture herewith. The Columbia and Western Railway passes directly under the dump.

The Red Mountain Railroad, from Northport to Rossland, it is expected will be open for traffic in November, and will then place the camp in direct railroad communication with all the American railway systems.

Management.

Mr. W. S. Haskins, who is one of the most experienced mining men in the camp has been appointed manager.

Shares.

The shares now offered to the public form part of the treasury stock, and the proceeds are for the purpose of meeting the cost of further developing the property to the best advantage.

Machinery.

This has been supplied by the Ingersoll, Sergeant Company, and consists of a 5 drill compressor, steam hoist, pumps and the necessary engine, boilers, etc.

A pool contract has been entered into by the original holders of shares in the Company, in order that no stock can be sold other than treasury until the Company is in possession of all the funds required for development.

Eminent Opinions.

The *Canadian Mining Review*, of July last, in speaking of the HOMESTAKE in a report dealing with different Rossland claims, says :

“It is the consensus of opinion among mining men that this property if properly handled would be one of the wonders of the camp. Its location, immense body of ore, strong vein and everything else places it in a position to rapidly become a shipper.”

Mr. Wm. A. Carlyle, Mineralogist to the Government of British Columbia, in an official report on the Rossland mining district, issued in August, 1896, by the Bureau of Mines, in speaking of the HOMESTAKE describes it as a promising property, the proper and thorough opening up of which only awaits capital and work.

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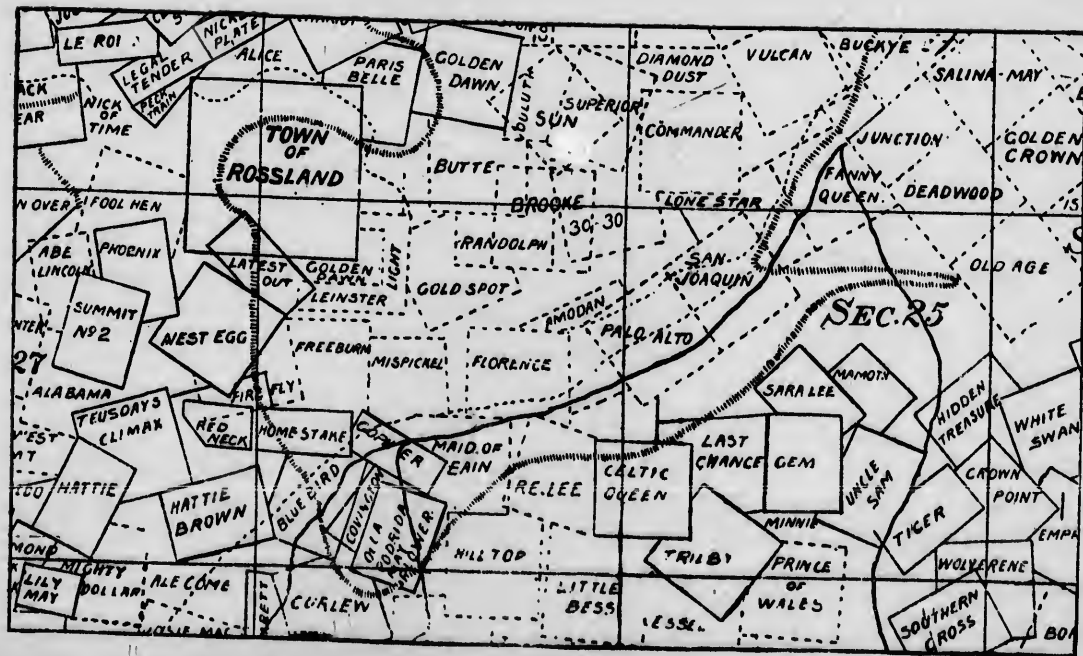
