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## PREFACE.

THE present work was originally prepared to meet what the Compiler felt to be an important want in his own School, and, after being used for several years in manuscript, is now, through the liberality of the Legislature of Nova Scotia, printedfor the greater convenience of the Teachers and Pupils of the Halifax Institution.

The work embraces a course of between 3000 and 4000 Questions illustrative of all the more common and important Forms of Interrogation in the English Language. The examples have been selected and arranged, and the difficulties of construction graduated with a careful attention to the actual requirements of the Deaf-mute in the class-room, as these have presented themselves to the Compiler during an uninterrupted practical experience of twenty

This manual is not, of course, intended to supplant, but rather to precede, accompany and supplement extempore exercises-whether in the way of questions appended to Reading Lessons as such; or actual alphabetic conversation on topics of common interest between the Teacher and Pupil—a mode of instruction which no printed colloquial exercises, however excellent or complete, can ever supersede. At the same time, the utility of a graduated course of examples on the various forms in which questions may be asked, embracing the elements of colloquial phraseology, will be generally acknowledged. It is therefore hoped that the present manual may be found elsewhere, as it has proved to be here, a useful aid in leading the Deaf-mute to an acquaintance with this important and difficult branch of written language.

In conclusion, the following hints as to the mode of using the book may be serviceable to young teachers of limited experience, as well as to other parties whose interest in the Deaf and Dumb may prompt them to attempt something in the way of instructing them.

- 1. Let the Questions in any Section be first written on the Blackboard and explained to the Class, and the pupils afterwards required to answer them—first, individually, and then simultaneously, on the fingers.
- 2. Let each pupil, with the book in his hand, answer the Questions for himself, in writing, either on his own slate, or on the Blackboard.
- 3. Let the Questions be asked and answered on the fingers alone.
- 4. Let the Questions be committed to memory, and then, by way of reciting them, require the pupils to put the questions to each other, and to the Teacher.
- 5. Require the pupils to compose original questions on the models thus learned.
- 6. Practise the pupils in turning each Question into a Narrative-sentence, or Proposition; and vice versa, in converting each Proposition back again into the Interrogative Form.

By adopting the 6th recommendation, the book might be made to serve the general purpose of a graduated course of Language Lessons, during the first two or three years—the graduation of the difficulties, and the familiar character of the examples, being almost as well adapted to the *general* end of training in language, as to the *special* object of teaching the Interrogative Forms alone.
