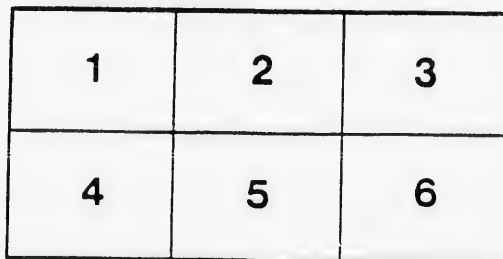
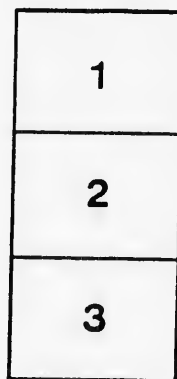

PREFACE.

This is not a catalogue. It is merely a list of the books now in the Westmount Library, arranged alphabetically by the name (real or assumed) of the author, and supplemented by a list of the fiction, and of certain works suitable for younger readers which the library now possesses.

There are no cross-references. Hence, as the purpose has been to select the form of an author's name most familiar to the public, many real names have been discarded in favour of well-known pseudonyms; as for instance, George Eliot, Anthony Hope and Mark Twain. On the other hand, "Alice in Wonderland" will be found under Dodgson, the real name of its author.

A complete card catalogue of authors and subjects, with copious cross-references is accessible in the library to all readers; but to have reproduced it in book form would have involved an expenditure of time and money entirely disproportionate to the value of the work. Lists like the present are, however, compact and portable, and through their aid it is easy to become acquainted with the character of the library.

Finally, it should be remembered that the works noted here constitute only the nucleus of the library. Additions are now being, and will continue to be, made. This fact accounts for the absence of many titles, which would otherwise be inexplicable.



RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Adopted 1st June, 1896.

No. 1. The Library shall be free to all persons of suitable age who may at reasonable times resort thereto to read or study, and who submit themselves to the rules prescribed for the orderly government thereof, but no one shall have the right to remove books from the building except as hereinafter provided.

No. 2. All persons included in the following classes may be registered as hereinafter provided, and receive a card which shall entitle them to borrow for home use such books as may be permitted to be taken from the Library.

(a) All inhabitants of the Town of Westmount of suitable age including non-resident proprietors.

(b) Persons to whom for special reasons the privilege of registration for a limited time may be granted by special vote of the Committee.

(c) Any person entitled to be registered may be allowed to borrow for home use, (upon depositing the value thereof, or giving satisfactory guarantee) such books as may be permitted to be taken from the Library, subject, however, to all the conditions applying to the use both of cards and of books.

REGISTRATION.

No. 3. Application for registration must be made at the Library.

No. 4. Every application for registration shall be made in writing upon one of the blank forms supplied by the Library for this purpose, and signed. It shall contain the full name and address of the applicant, and an agreement to obey and be bound by the rules of the Library.

No. 5. As soon as the Librarian upon examination is satisfied that any applicant is entitled to registration, he shall be registered and receive a Library card entitling him to borrow books from the Library.

No. 6. A Library card shall be good until May 1st following date of issue, unless the holder ceases before the expiration of that time to reside in the Town; such card may be renewed in person, or by letter, at the applicant's cost, at any time so long as the holder is entitled to registration.

No. 7. A Library card may be detained temporarily or revoked for any breach of rule or regulation of the Library.

No. 8. If the holder of a card change his residence from the place recorded thereon, immediate notice of such change must be given to the Librarian, or the card will be subject to forfeiture.

No. 9. The registered holder of a card shall in all cases be responsible for books borrowed by means of such card by whomsoever it may be presented.

No. 10. If a card be lost, notice of the loss must be given at the Library immediately, and a duplicate card may be issued in its place not less than fifteen days after such notice. But the loss of a card will not affect the responsibility of the registered holder thereof for its subsequent use. If a lost card be found the duplicate must be returned at once to the Librarian.

USE OF BOOKS.

No. 11. In order to borrow a book the Library card must be presented to the attendant in charge, together with a call-slip on which is written the number of the book desired, and the number of the borrower's card or his name and address, according to the direction given on the slip provided for the purpose.

No. 12. A Library card shall ordinarily entitle the holder to have one book out of the Library at a time.

No. 13. No book shall be retained by the borrower for more than fourteen days.

No. 14. The Librarian may restrict the use of books in special demand, also of rare and costly books or those suitable only for reference.

No. 15. Any officer in charge of the Library may in his discretion refuse to issue to a person under the age of twenty-one years, books of a character not suited for circulation among young readers.

FINES, ETC.

No. 16. Any person who detains a volume beyond the time for which it is lent shall pay a fine of three cents for each and every day of such detention, and two cents for each notice of such detention sent by post, and cost of messenger if one is sent. Fines shall continue to run for a period of four weeks from the time when the book should have been returned, unless prior to the expiration of that period the borrower reports the book as lost, and pays the full cost of replacing it. The fine payable by him, in this case, shall be the amount accrued to date of such payment by him.

No. 17. A book so detained for more than four weeks shall be considered lost, and the person detaining it, in addition to accrued fines, shall pay the full cost of replacing such book. No book shall be delivered to any person, or upon his Library card until all fines and charges due from him are paid.

No. 18. Borrowers are expected to take notice of the expiration of the time limit. No claim to exemption from fine can be established because of the failure of any notice to or from the Library.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

No. 19. All books and periodicals must be used and handled with care. It is forbidden to mark or write in books or periodicals, or to turn down the corners of the leaves, or to tear them, or in any way to injure or deface them.

No. 20. All injuries to books beyond a reasonable wear, and all losses of books shall be made good to the satisfaction of the Committee by the person liable therefor.

No. 21. Any person who wilfully, or maliciously, or wantonly and without cause writes upon, injures, defaces, removes or destroys any book, plate, picture, engraving, or property belonging to the Library, will be prosecuted according to law.

No. 22. No tracing is allowed to be made without express permission from the Librarian.

No. 23. All books must be returned to the Library whenever the Committee so orders, and a fine of one dollar will be incurred for each volume detained after reasonable notice of the time when books are to be returned has been given by special notice, or by publication in any of the newspapers of the City of Montreal or Town of Westmount.

No. 24. All conversation and conduct inconsistent with the quiet and orderly use of the Library is strictly prohibited, and persons who abuse the privileges of the Library by unbecoming conduct, or by violations of any of the regulations, may be thenceforth excluded from the Library for a longer or shorter period.

No. 25. Readers are particularly requested to replace on the shelves of the reading room, as soon as done with, such books as they may have been consulting.

No. 26. The Library Reading Room shall be open every week day, except such days as may be decided by the Committee, notice being posted in the Library. The Library shall be open at such hours as may be determined by the Committee.

No. 27. (a) Dogs are not allowed in any part of the Library Building.

(b) Smoking or carrying lighted cigars, cigarettes or pipes is not allowed in any part of the Library Building.

(c) Articles may be left in the Coat Room, but the Committee assumes no responsibility for articles so left.

No. 28. No person shall be permitted to borrow books from or return them to the Library who resides in a house which has been isolated by direction of the Health Department on account of infectious disease therein, until such time as the said house and contents have been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected.

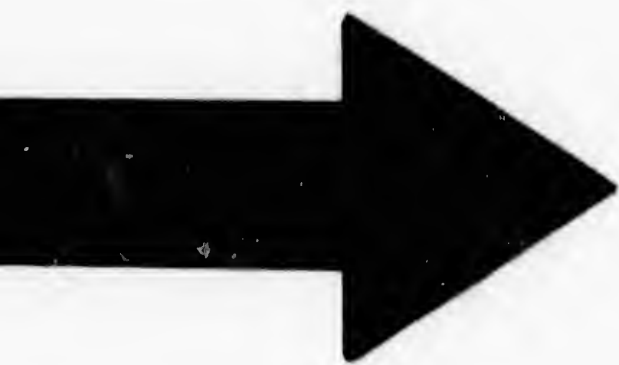

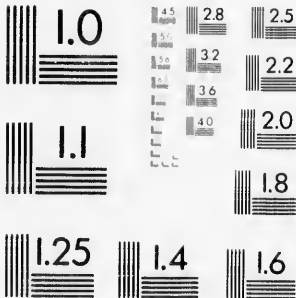
