Practical Talks and Plain Precepts for Farmers.

Edited for the Farmer readers of the MONITOR by an Annapolis Valley Agriculturist

DEEP VEADARY.

You have asked me to express my opinion as to the relative merits of a beef and dairy breed. I might say right here in the first place that I have no figures to give other than my own, and therefore no authority in character, though based on some experience.

Many years ago, I was in a position to have derived from that system of breeding, and it is equally apparent to me that the best results have followed a too close adherence to that practice. The early breeders of the Annapolis Valley were of the opinion that for the best success it was necessary to have cattle for a particular and single purpose, and to leave it to someone else to carry along the other branch.

It is a very evident fact that a man owning a small farm cannot carry on mixed husbandry to any good advantage. It is necessary to have a farm of thirty to fifty acres, and it is not generally fitted for beef raising, for the reason that it will not maintain sufficient number of cattle, and it therefore behooves the farmer to have a farm to keep cattle and milk cows. It is also very clear that if a man has a small farm, he should have a cow that will give him a good supply of milk, and a bull that will give him a good supply of beef.

It seems to me that I am not certain that we can have good beef and milk cows on a small farm. I have seen a number of farms where the farmer has a few cows and a few calves, and he is able to make a good living out of it.

What line of procedure the future breeders of Short-horns may adopt of course, very much a matter of opinion, but I think it is fair to suppose that while he will readily accept new and improved lines, he will not be indifferent to the observations and experiences of the best breeders of the past. It is questionable, indeed, if better Short-horns ever existed than were bred during the first half of the last century. The records are somewhat meagre concerning the operations of what may be termed the early period of the breed as we know it today, yet there is sufficient evidence to show that the early breeders were not hampered by the great variety of fairs and fairs that have since come to the aid of the breeder of the present day.
