The early departure of miners, and the comparatively mild winter, with the beautiful and open spring, admitting the prosecution of out-door work without any intermission, has given an impetus to trade with the sister Colony of British Columbia, and although already early we have to note with satisfaction the lively and increasing amount of business, as exhibited in the weekly departure of the steamers Otter and Eliza Anderson, often filled to their utmost capacity, and every appearance indicates, that as the season advances trade will improve, and an active requirement spring up for the various descriptions of goods needed in a mining

country. The shipments of dust from the mines have again resumed, and the amounts received by the two last trips of the Otter, though not large, go to prove that miners have been enabled to commence operations early, and it is believed that the yield of the year will "foot up" a sum this fall that will cause any sceptics that may yet exist, no longer to doubt the resources of the mines of British Columbia, and that a propitious season has dawned upon the Merchant, the Trader, and the Miner.

The recent heavy arrival of merchandize from England and California, and the hourly expected arrival of the *Heather Bell* with an assorted cargo of goods, has caused quite a "plethora." Our market is at present over supplied with European goods, and many articles which we could enumerate will not bring cost and charges. With limited capital, many purchasers in this market are content to buy only such articles as they absolutely need, and sufficient only to meet immediate wants, hence the difficulty to realize large invoices, and a desire to press sales at auction.

We have to report Flour at \$6.50. Bacon scarce, 16c. Rice firm and in demand at prices quoted. Spirits and malt liquors slow of sale.

The Imports for this month amount to about \$237,000.

It is expected that the shipment of Dust to California this week will exceed \$25,000.
