### OFFICIAL.

The following Regulations supersede those formerly in force respecting the JOURNAL OF EDUCATION:—

I.—The Journal of Education shall hereafter be published semi-annually, in the months of April and October respectively, and shall continue to be the medium of Official notices in connection with the Department of Education.

II.—The Journal will be furnished gratuitously, according to law, to each Inspector, Chairman of Commissioners, and Board of Trustees, and will be supplied to other parties wishing it at the rate of ten cents per copy.

III.—Each Secretary of Trustees is instructed and required to file and preserve the successive numbers of the Journal for the benefit of his fellow Trustees and the Teacher or Teachers of his section, and their successors, and to inform his associates in office and the Teachers or Teachers of its receipt, so soon thereafter as may be convenient.

### Academic Licenses, (Grade A.)

#### CHEMISTRY.

1. Define Chemistry, Element, Oxide, Acid, Alkali, Chemical Equation, Molecule, Atom.
2. Give the equation represented by the reaction when HCl is prepared from H<sub>2</sub>, SO<sub>4</sub> and NaCl.
3. What is the constitution of matter according to the Atomic theory? Show the bearing of the Atomic theory on each of the laws of chemical combination.
4. What is Nordhausen acid, and how is it prepared?
5. Write a note on salt as a manure.
6. Give the characteristics of a metal. What is an alloy? In what respects may alloys differ from the metals of which they are composed? Illustrate.

#### NATURAL PHILOSOPHY.

1. Show that as the angle between two forces is increased their resultant is diminished, and prove that if two forces be represented by two diagonals of a parallelogram their resultant will be represented by a line equal to twice one of the sides of the parallelogram.
2. Find the numerical value of the acceleration when in a quarter of a second a velocity is produced which would carry a body over 2 ft. in every third of a second.
3. State the characteristic difference between solids and fluids in relation to the transmission of pressure, and explain clearly what is meant by the equal transmission of pressure by fluids in all directions.
4. Describe the construction and action of the common pump; state the limit to its action and the cause of the same.

5. Define the terms Principal Focus, Optical Centre, and Principal Axis of a Lens.

6. Explain generally the mode of the formation of images.

#### GEOMETRY.

1. Show how to describe a rectangle equal to a given square and having one of its sides equal to a given straight line.
2. If from any point without a circle two straight lines be drawn, one of which cuts the circle, and the other touches it, the rectangle contained by the whole line which cuts the circle and the part of it without the circle must be equal to the square on the line which touches it.
3. Inscribe a square in a given semi-circle.
4. Define locus and find the locus of the vertices of all right angled triangles which can be described upon the same hypotenuse.
5. Similar triangles are to one another in the duplicate ratio of their homologous sides.
6. On a given base describe a triangle, having a given vertical angle, and one of its sides double of the other.
7. Every solid angle is contained by plane angles, which are together less than four right angles.

#### ALGEBRA.

1. Resolve into factors  $1 - a, x^2 + y^2 + z^2 + 2xy - 2xz - 2yz$ , and resolve  $x$  into two equal and also into two unequal factors.
2. If  $p$  be the difference between any given fraction and unity, and  $q$  the difference between its reciprocal and unity, show that the product of  $p$  and  $q$  is equal to their difference.
3. There are three consecutive numbers such that the sum of their cubes is equal to 162 times the product of the two higher numbers; find the numbers.
4. Given  $\frac{\sqrt{a+x}}{\sqrt{x}} + \frac{\sqrt{a-x}}{\sqrt{x}} = \sqrt{\frac{x}{b}}$  to find the values of  $x$ .
5. Explain the difference between combinations and permutations; and if there are 7 chemical elements which will unite with each other how many ternary compounds can be made from them, how many binary?
6. What is meant by an imaginary root? Show that while impossible in an arithmetical sense, 8 may be divided algebraically into two parts whose product is 18.

### First-Class Licenses, (Grade B.)

#### BRITISH HISTORY.

1. Write a brief sketch of English History during the period of Danish occupation.
2. Mention the chief political and social changes introduced into England by the Normans.
3. Give the provisions of the Treaty of Troyes.
4. Of the decisive battles fought by the English during the last nine centuries, name the five whose consequences you regard as most important to England, assigning reasons by tracing results.
5. Mention the chief constitutional changes or parliamentary enactments during Queen Victoria's reign.

6. Give dates for the following : Battle of Nevil's Cross, Battle of Otterbourne, Capture of Calais, Battle of Tewkesbury, Execution of Mary Queen of Scots, Conquest of Bengal, Indian Mutiny.

7. Describe the three Estates of the Realm.

#### HISTORY OF BRITISH AMERICA.

1. Name the chief Indian tribes with which the early French settlers of Canada [not Acadia] were brought into contact, their location, and the part taken by each in the so-called Indian Wars.

2. Name the chief battles fought on Canadian territory during the war 1812-14, with the victorious party on each occasion.

3. Give names and dates of chief Treaties which have affected British America.

4. What is meant by Responsible Government, and when was it introduced into Nova Scotia?

5. State the principles regulating the apportionment of members of the Dominion House of Commons to the various Provinces. Explain clearly the possible effects of the recent census on Nova Scotia's representation.

#### GENERAL GEOGRAPHY.

1. Give a brief outline of the Solar System with the comparative diameters of the eight largest planets, assuming the earth's as unity.

2. Name the different kinds of winds, and state fully the causes which produce them, and account for their direction.

3. Give the boundaries of the Ottoman Empire, naming its principal divisions, cities, mountain ranges and rivers.

4. Describe the Government of the United States.

5. Name the Counties of Great Britain on the North Sea and English Channel, and the Coast waters, Capes and Islands on the west from Cape Wrath to Land's End.

6. Where and what are the following : Khiva, Matamoros, Oporto, Everest, Liffey, Wetter, Tombigby, Corrientes, and San Salvador.

7. How to find the Sun's declination on any given day [Globe].

#### BRITISH AMERICAN GEOGRAPHY.

1. Name the Counties in the South-western peninsula of Ontario, west of Simcoe and York.

2. Describe the following rivers, their sources, courses, and mention the waters into which they empty : Fraser, Peace, Richelieu, St. Croix, and Margaree.

3. What parallels of latitude cut the River St. Lawrence?

4. In what county and province are the following towns : St. Mary's, L'Islet, Hull, Hillsboro, L'Original, Picton and Oromocto?

5. Draw an outline map of the Province of Quebec, locating the cities, and tracing the course of the principal rivers.

#### CHEMISTRY.

1. Define Chemistry, Element, Oxide, Acid, Alkali, Chemical Equation.

2. Give Symbols and combining weights of the principal non-metallic Elements.

3. Name three very important Potash Salts, giving both Common and Chemical names, and give the proportion of Potash in the inorganic matter of the following crops :—Wheat, Beans, Turnips and Clover Hay.

4. Write a note on Salt as a manure.

5. Distinguish between *hard* and *soft* soap, and describe a simple method of making soap.

6. Discuss fully the advantages resulting from drainage of land.

#### NATURAL PHILOSOPHY.

1. State Newton's Laws of Motion, and give examples of each.

2. Show that as the angle between two forces is increased, their resultant is diminished, and prove that, if two forces be represented by two diagonals of a parallelogram their resultant will be represented by a line equal to twice one of the sides of the parallelogram.

3. Explain the meaning of the symbols in the equation

$$v^2 = V^2 + 2fs.$$

4. Find the numerical value of the acceleration when in a quarter of a second a velocity is produced which would carry a body over 2 feet in every third of a second.

5. A body is weighed from both arms of an unequal balance and its apparent weight are 81 and 64 lbs. Find the ratio between the arms.

6. With a wheel and axle a power of 14 lbs. balances 1 ton. If the power descended through 80 in. what height would the weight be raised?

#### FRENCH.

Translate into English.

6. Distinguish between *meme* an adjective and *meme* an adverb, giving examples.

You have a great many apples, will you give me some? That poor man neither speaks nor hears. The child having eaten some poisoned food, died suddenly. What did he complain of?

1. Classify the chief intellectual faculties, and mention subjects of instruction adapted to exercise and develop each respectively.

2. Give a short sketch of an introductory lesson on Compound Proportion to a class that has mastered the principles of ratio.

3. What is the distinction between *Oral* and *Object* lessons?

4. State concisely the general rules or principles of composition which you would impress on a class of beginners.

# Journal of Education.

HALIFAX, OCTOBER, 1881.

THE late session of the Provincial Educational Association at Truro was well attended, and its proceedings of a nature to encourage all concerned for the progress of Education in the Province. The great bulk of the enrolled membership was composed of Teachers in active service, many of whom had travelled hundreds of miles to enjoy the advantages offered by this Educational gathering. While yielding respectful attention to the views and arguments of the Inspectors and other senior Educationists, the Teachers present participated in the discussions and business of the Association with an earnestness and freedom which did them much credit. The prepared papers read at the regular sessions of the Association were of a quality to leave nothing to be desired.

The protracted consideration of the important subject of a Course of Study for the Public Schools issued in what we believe will prove a large outcome of benefit to the cause of Education in Nova Scotia. We hope at an early date to announce that in its substantial features the course ultimately decided on by the Association has received the *imprimatur* of the Council of Public Instruction.

THE change introduced last term in the legal mode of apportioning the County Fund has led, as our readers will perceive, to an alteration in the County Fund as published in this Journal. Instead of the *number of registered pupils*, an item not affecting a School's share in the fund in question, we now publish the *number of legally authorized teaching days* the School or Schools were open. When this number exceeds the teaching days of the entire term it will be understood that the School has two or more departments.

CERTAIN desirable changes have been authorized by the Council of Public Instruction in the Regulations of the Provincial Normal School. The most important of these are, rendering necessary an entire session for obtaining classification, and limiting the privilege of admission to the early weeks of the session. Intending applicants for entrance should send at as early a date as possible to the Principal for Calendar of Regulations and By-laws. At no past period in its history has the Normal School been contributing so efficiently to our Educational progress as at present. The results of last year's work were encouraging in a high degree.

WE reprint from last October's *Journal* :

The Trustees act in Educational matters for the people of the Section, and their responsibility is of course to some extent measured by the facilities and means placed at their disposal by the Annual Meeting. At the same time it should not be forgotten that the state of Education in a community will very largely depend on the efficiency with which these officers discharge their duties. Given a Teacher of the right stamp, the Trustees should use both their corporate and personal influence to strengthen his hands and confirm his authority. Much care should be exercised to secure the services of a Secretary of business habits. Proper effort should be put forth to provide in connection with School Houses and grounds, the requisite conditions of physical well-being and comfort. The state of too many school premises is simply disgraceful. We are pleased to know that the Inspectors generally are exerting themselves to effect an improvement in this direction by faithful counsel and a prudent use of the authority with which they are invested. "Cleanliness is next to godliness."

THE following has been ordered to be published in the Journal of Education as a Comment of Council on Section 30 of School Law defining duties of Trustees :—

The Board of Trustees should at its first meeting after the Annual School Meeting, fix the time and place for its regular meetings during the school year, if the requirements of the section render such meetings desirable. When this is done, no other notice of any regular meeting will be required to be given to the Trustees. Whenever a special meeting is necessary, each member should be duly notified of the same.

A majority of the Board of Trustees is competent to transact business only when all the members have received notice of the meeting.
