That Awful Tidal Wave

How It Swept Thousands of Unfortunate Souls Down to Death Without a Moment's Warning.

San Francisco, July 13.—The Tokyo correspondent of the United Press, under date of June 26, writes: On the 15th of June, at 2:30 o'clock in the evening, a seismic wave struck the northeast coast of the main island throughout a distance of about 200 miles, and in about five minutes 24,000 people were killed and 13,000 houses destroyed.

At 8:30 o'clock the inhabitants of numerous towns and hamlets along the coast were sleeping the "drowsy festival" on the 15th day of the fifth month, according to the old calendar. At 25 minutes before 9 o'clock, 30,000 of them had been swept out to sea, or thrown dead upon the shore and their homes had disappeared or lay wrecked.

There was nothing to presage the disaster. From 11 in the forenoon until 4.30 in the afternoon heavy rain fell. It was followed by a calm evening and a dark, calm night. There is much difficulty in obtaining perfectly accurate information as to the exact nature of the phenomena that preceded the fatal catastrophe; they were too insignificant to seem worth recording.

Several accounts agree, however, that at about 3 or 3.30 there was a shock of earthquake, a violent, but not violent shock, though, of the vertical kind, the barometer fell, and the water rose to a height of 10 or 15 feet above the normal level. The barometer gave at the time no indication of anything unusual.

Some 20 or 25 minutes later a booming sound became audible from the distance, and the inhabitants were variously interpreted. Some construed it as the noise of a coming gale. Others supposed that a line of surf had reached the shore.

At 10 o'clock the sea was calm, and the wind was light. At 10.15 a small boat was seen at the mouth of the bay, and in a moment a thunderous roar was heard. The sea was high, and the water was dark. The boats were overturned, and the houses were swept away or wrecked.
